The Regular meeting of the Board of Trustees was held on Thursday, January 19, 2017 at the Lawrence Village Hall, 196 Central Avenue, Lawrence, New York 11559.

WORK SESSION - Mayor Edelman called the work session to order at 7:00 p.m.

No Board action was taken.

REGULAR MEETING - Mayor Edelman called the regular meeting to order at 8:00 p.m.

<u>PUBLIC HEARING</u> - Public Hearing for Proposed Local Law #1 of 2017 to amend Chapter 135 of the Village Code concerning parking in municipal parking fields/facilities.

Board Action: Deputy Mayor Fragin moved to open the Public Hearing regarding proposed Local Law #1 of 2017 to amend Chapter 135 of the Village Code concerning parking in municipal parking fields/facilities (attached hereto as "Exhibit A"). Trustee Goldstein seconded the motion. All in favor.

Deputy Mayor Fragin commented that he felt that this new Local Law would make parking significantly easier due to the tight widths of the parking spaces in Parking Field #3.

Board Action: Upon hearing no further comments or discussion, Deputy Mayor Fragin moved to close the Public Hearing regarding proposed Local Law #1 of 2017 to amend Chapter 135 of the Village Code concerning parking in municipal parking fields/facilities. Trustee Goldstein seconded the motion. All in favor.

Board Action: Deputy Mayor Fragin moved to adopt the proposed Local Law #1 of 2017 to amend Chapter 135 of the Village Code concerning parking in municipal parking fields/facilities (attached hereto as "Exhibit A"); including a finding that Local

Law #1 of 2017 is a type two (2) action. Trustee Goldstein seconded the motion. All in favor.

Approval of minutes:

BOT December 8, 2016

Board Action: Trustee Kaufman moved the approval of the December 8, 2016 BOT meeting minutes. Trustee Diamond seconded the motion. All in favor.

GOOD & WELFARE

- 1. Deputy Mayor Fragin stated that he would like the Village to write a letter to Nassau County regarding the significant number of potholes on Broadway, in the Village of Lawrence. He plans to "bring the matter up personally with the Village Legislators as well, hopefully as soon as tomorrow". However, it's a problem that the County is not properly maintaining the road, in Deputy Mayor Fragin's opinion.
- 2. Deputy Mayor Fragin stated that the Village did a nice "experiment in progress" restricting the parking on Central Avenue, going in the westbound direction, between the hours of 7 to 9 a.m. (in the morning) and 4 to 7 p.m. (in the afternoon), at the intersection of Rockaway Turnpike, by the long light. He added that unfortunately it's not being enforced and it's not effective in correcting the problem of traffic backing up every afternoon beyond Frost Lane, consistently for two hours. Deputy Mayor Fragin does not understand how the County Engineer feels that this (east/west issue) is acceptable or how they cannot come up with a solution. Administrator Goldman and Mayor Edelman responded that there would be additional Code Enforcement personnel better able to monitor and enforce the situation in the near future. Discussion ensued in this regard.
- 3. Dr. Allan Simon, of 284 Central Avenue, who has lived in Lawrence since 1982, noted a complete lack of compliance with traffic laws on Central Avenue and went on to list the many infractions. He went on to say that he has witnessed no patrol cars and no tickets issued for the violations he listed and witnessed and would like to see this matter addressed, especially for safety reasons. Mayor Edelman requested that he take this up with the Fourth Precinct's Commanding Officer, Inspector Lee Steinberg, who was due to arrive at any moment. Dr. Simon said that he would do so.

Mayor Edelman introduced the Fourth Precinct's Commanding Officer, Inspector Lee Steinberg, and gave some background concerning his outstanding career. Inspector Steinberg thanked the Mayor for his beautiful introduction and he thanked the meeting's attendees for coming to the meeting tonight. He went on to introduce his Administrative Sergeant, Charles Sollin, the Village's liaison, and Problem Oriented Police Officer John Zanni, of the Fourth Precinct. Inspector Steinberg stated that he was in constant communication with Mayor Edelman and Administrator Ronald Goldman. The Inspector went on to inform everyone that Nassau County had another record low crime reduction

last year (from 2015 to 2016), and the Fourth Precinct saw a reduction of a little over 2% Precinct-wide; with an 11% reduction in major crime in the Village of Lawrence, of which they are very proud. Inspector Steinberg stated that things do happen and went on to discuss relevant events, issues and ways to assist the police in keeping the Village safe. He stated that the Fourth Precinct is service oriented and went on to give some background information.

Dr. Allan Simon repeated his concerns for Inspector Steinberg, who responded to his issues and made a note to have these items addressed as best as possible.

Mrs. Sharon Douglas, President of the Lawrence Association, inquired if there was anything the residents could do to assist the police. Inspector Steinberg addressed her inquiry and explained various strategies the Village residents could implement, such as locking all cars and not leaving any items in view. This is called "target hardening your assets", which would also apply to house windows, locks, etc. He did discuss the parameters regarding the limited number of officers he has to work with to implement patrols and traffic enforcement of Lawrence and the neighboring communities. Security video cameras and plate readers were discussed.

Deputy Mayor Fragin inquired regarding the matter of the evacuation of the JCC the day before, which Inspector Steinberg stated was due to a phoned in bomb threat; deemed to be a false alarm. Discussion ensued in this regard.

Inspector Steinberg stated that it is important to call 911 if a resident sees something that's not right.

Mayor Edelman mentioned that Inspector Steinberg was very helpful in sending out extra patrols over the Jewish Holidays/High Holy Days throughout the community and to the synagogues. Trustee Goldstein added that he has seen patrol cars near his home which are a wonderful deterrent, and requested that the Inspector keep the patrols up.

Resident Edward Gottlieb of 96 Chauncey Lane reiterated and "tacked on to" Dr. Simon's concerns and stated that the "bad driving" is not just along Central Avenue; to please spread the patrols around. Inspector Steinberg is aware of this and stated that indeed the "VTL enforcement" is very important and this would be addressed as a very integral part of police work.

Menachem Bornstein of 40 Doughty Blvd., across from the Inwood Train Station and next to Seasons Express, raised traffic concerns, illegal parking and safety issues. Inspector Steinberg affirmed that the police were aware and would address these matters as best as possible. Mr. Bornstein also raised the matter of the day laborers, a situation which has improved. Discussion ensued concerning these matters as well as the drug (and heroin) epidemic on Long Island.

Mayor Edelman, the Board and the audience thanked Inspector Steinberg, Sgt. Sollin and P.O.P. Officer Zanni for their time, their coming, addressing all of the concerns and their exemplary service.

4. Trustee Goldstein raised the issue of the beautification and clean-up of the business district along Central Avenue. Deputy Mayor Fragin added the matter of an unsightly empty lot and vacancies. Discussion ensued in this regard. Mayor Edelman invited Deputy Mayor Fragin to head the Village of Lawrence's Business District Committee, to which he responded affirmatively.

Section 4. Severability			
If a court determines that any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance is invalid or unconstitutional, the court's order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this local law, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or in its application to the person, individual, firm
