The Regular meeting of the Board of Trustees was held on Thursday, May 11, 2017 at the Lawrence Village Hall, 196 Central Avenue, Lawrence, New York 11559.

WORK SESSION - Mayor Edelman called the work session to order at 7:02 p.m.

No Board action was taken.

Work Session ended at 8:01 p.m.

REGULAR MEETING - Mayor Edelman called the regular meeting to order at 8:08 p.m.

GOOD & WELFARE

- 1. Dr. Alan Simon of 284 Central Avenue made a statement regarding the installation of LED street lighting throughout the Village, replacing the current sodium bulbs. He stated that the LED lights are much more efficient and they have a longer shelf-life than the sodium fixtures that they are replacing. Dr. Simon went on to say that according to the Village's specifications that he obtained; he cited various safety concerns, quoting various research studies concluding negative consequences at toxic levels of exposure. Discussion ensued in this regard. Trustee Goldstein addressed Dr. Simon's concerns, stating that the Village's LED bulbs are encased in frosted glass versus regular glass, which blocks 40% of the reflective light. He went on to explain that the Village's LED bulbs are not a safety issue and listed the reasons why, thus refuting the studies that Dr. Simon quoted.
- Deputy Mayor Fragin requested that "No Parking" signs/restrictions be placed on Cedarlawn Avenue between the City line and Route 878; as well as Central Avenue between the City line and Doughty Blvd. According to Deputy Mayor

- Fragin, no signage exists there currently. Mayor Edelman said that he would review the situation.
- 3. Once again, Deputy Mayor Fragin requested the removal of one of the NICE bus stops on Central Avenue, and for a status update. Village Administrator Goldman replied that he had, indeed, spoken to the NICE representative, who informed him that they won't change, move or remove the bus stops once they have been put in place, as a matter of policy, unless a safety issue can be demonstrated. The Nassau County NICE representative stated that there is also a concern regarding the distance of bus stop placement for the accommodation of the handicapped population's access. Village Administrator Goldman stated that he would request the removal of one of the bus stops again. Deputy Mayor Fragin persisted and requested that one of the bus stops be removed. Discussion ensued in this regard. Village Counsel Peter Bee and Village Administrator Ronald Goldman added that they would need to look into whether NICE has a licensing agreement or what kind of authority they may or may not have to place bus stops and signage.
- 4. Trustee Goldstein registered a complaint regarding the state of Rock Hall Road. Mayor Edelman responded that since it is a County road, the Village sent pictures along with a letter to Legislator Howard Kopel to try to address the situation. Deputy Mayor Fragin added that a letter should be sent to Legislator Denise Ford as well. Village Administrator Goldman responded that he and Deputy Administrator Castro attended a function where they were able to inform the Nassau County Commissioner of Public Works of this matter as well, and offer to spare her the personal embarrassment as well as the County the embarrassment of presenting the photographs they showed to her, to the newspapers and to the voting public. She indicated that she would indeed take the matter in hand and address the issue. Mayor Edelman stated that the Village would send a letter to Legislator Ford as well.
- 5. Trustee Kaufman stated that "coming off" the Atlantic Beach Bridge, the roadway is "always filthy", and requested that Nassau County be contacted to remedy the situation. Mayor Edelman responded that Nassau County was contacted and did clean up that area, but it was dirty a week later.

RESOLVED, that the Mayor is authorized to engage in negotiations for the sale of such parcels, individually and/or collectively, inclusive of such steps as are ordinarily incidental to the negotiation of Village-owned real property, but exclusive of the expenditure of funds not expressly authorized by further Resolution of this Board; and it is further

RESOLVED, that there shall be no final sale of any such parcel or parcels without further Resolution of this Board.

each calendar year with pay and without charge to such Building Inspector's other leave time.

Item 13 – Approval to hold a Public Hearing for Local Law #6 of 2017 to amend Chapter 12 of the Village Code concerning the Board of Building Design
