CURBSIDE WASTE COLLECTION

Curbside waste collection will be every Monday.

Please have your waste at the curb by 7:00 AM on Monday.

Household waste and yard waste are collected at the curb and is limited to the City of Oak Ridge North trash cart. Please place the cart five-feet (5') from obstructions (such as vehicles or mailboxes) and within one-foot (1') from the curb. The cart handles should face the home or the fence.

IMPORTANT! Waste collection will be limited to the City of Oak Ridge North trash cart- no additional bags unless tagged. If you have extra trash, please purchase an Extra Service Tag from City Hall and then place 1-tag per 1-bag and Waste Management will service on your scheduled service day. If you need an additional cart, please contact the City of Oak Ridge North.

PLEASE SEE RECYCLING INFORMATION ON THE BACK.

BULK WASTE COLLECTION

Bulk waste collection will be at the curb, on the first Monday of the month, with a limited of four (4) cubic yards. Please see the description of what bulk waste is below:

ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS INCLUDE:

- Household furniture
- Appliances with CFCs removed
- Moving boxes (broken down and bundled)
- Oversized waste customary to normal household operations

PLEASE NOTE! WM can no longer dispose of CFC refrigerant containing items (i.e. refrigerators, freezers)

Brush- For the safety and protection of WM employees and equipment, branches and tree trimmings must be no greater than three inches (3") in diameter, and be cut, tied, and bundled in four foot (4') lengths weighing no more than forty to fifty pounds (40-50lbs.) No containers over 45 gallons.

UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS INCLUDE:

- Carpet
- Appliances containing CFCs
- Gasoline
- TV's
- Paint
- Batteries
- Tires
- Vehicles and parts
- Concrete, asphalt, brick, and roofing
- Large pieces of metal
- Motor oil (and used filters)
- Construction debris

No household waste allowed during BULK collection.

All unacceptable items that are tagged (with green tags) must be removed and properly disposed of at the landfill or another facility.

When Oak Ridge North residents use Recycle Often. Recycle Right.™, great things happen. By recycling everyday items like those shown below, tons of raw materials, time, energy, and money are saved. Plus, the recycled materials become new products- if you recycle an aluminum can today, it could be back on the store shelf as a new one in 60 days- and the cycle continues.

- ✓ Your recycling day is every Wednesday. Please have your recycling cart at the curb by 7:00 AM Wednesday morning.
- ✓ Recycling collection will be limited to the cart. Bagged recyclables outside the cart will not be collected.
- ✓ Place acceptable recyclables shown below in the cart- no sorting needed!
- ✓ Do not place recyclables in bags.
- ✓ Recyclables should be free of food and liquid.

Acceptable materials for curbside recycling include:

RECYCLE, IT'S THE RIGHT THING TO DO



Paper



Plastic bottles and containers



Food and beverage cartons



Flattened cardboard and paperboard



Food and beverage cans

RECYCLE CORRECTLY

Do NOT recycle the following:



No food waste and liquids



No plastic wraps or bags



No foam products



No glass bottles and jars

Paper and cardboard must be dry, and free of food debris.

Paper food containers must be rinsed out- no caps.

Tissues, paper towels, and other paper that has been in contact with food is not acceptable.

Make sure food and liquid contamination is removed from cans and plastics- all containers should be empty.

Keep medical waste (syringes and needles) out of the recycling cart.
