ADDICTION - Alcohol & Other Drugs

Today, everyone is exposed to the temptation of trying drugs. Some people experiment for curiosity, for kicks, because of peer pressure, or to escape emotional problems. The dangers of experimenting could lead to physical illness, having chemicals become a necessary part of your life or death. First time use can result in permanent damage. Binge drinking (chugging) or mixing alcohol with drugs can be fatal. Alcohol/drugs are also addictive. Listed below are several statements. You may have a problem with alcohol or drugs if you agree with ONE of them:

- When I have problems, I drink/do drugs.
- When I am feeling bad, I drink/do drugs.
- When I am mad at others, I drink/do drugs.
- My grades are falling and my work habits are slipping because of my drinking/drug use.
- I try to drink/do drugs less, but I can't do it.
- Before I go to school or work, I drink/do drugs.
- Even when I don't intend to drink/do drugs, I do it anyway.
- Sometimes I have blackouts and can't remember.
- I lie about my drinking/drug use.
- I have gotten into trouble because of my drinking/drug use.
- I feel cool when I drink or get high.

All drugs can sometimes mask the feeling which lets us know we are alive, and prevent us from trying to work out our own problems. There are a lot of alternatives to taking drugs and there is no reason to continue being depressed and unhappy by your drug use. **HELP IS AVAILABLE**.

ADDICTION - Eating Disorders

There is a lot of talk about being healthy these days. Maintaining the right weight for your body size and build is a healthy thing to do. Eating well-balanced meals in reasonable amounts is an excellent way to stay healthy. There are a number of resources available for information on healthy eating including your county extensions staff, your doctor, county health nurses, school nurses, etc.

Eating or not eating to feel better about yourself, or to avoid feelings, is not healthy. Misuse of food is called an eating disorder. Two common eating disorders are:

Anorexia Nervosa is an eating disorder that can cause severe weight loss, and in extreme cases, *death* from starvation. Young people with anorexia are afraid to gain weight even when they are very slender.

Bulimia is a similar eating disorder in which someone starves and then overeats and takes laxatives or vomits to lose weight. This is often done secretly and can make a person feel ashamed and guilty.

Unhealthy obsessions with weight, food, and appearance come from feelings of low self-worth, trying to hard to please others, a feeling of pressure to achieve, high expectations, loneliness, and inner sadness. A person who is suffering with an eating disorder needs to talk to someone who will care and help. **Eating disorders are a potentially life threatening illness.** Without help, eating disorders can lead to serious physical problems, feelings of anxiety, constant tiredness, and a general unhappiness throughout life. 

Emotional problems aren't hopeless or incurable; a troubled person can get help. Asking for help is a sign of strength, not a sign of weakness. Counseling is an opportunity to discuss personal issues. Most often, people talk with a counselor to get help with a decision they are trying to make. You can explain to the counselor how you're feeling and why. In the process of explaining those feelings, you learn to understand yourself better and can make a better decision. Counselors treat these conversations as very private and confidential. Most counselors charge fees, but some will adjust their fees to what you and your family can afford to pay. Don't let anything keep you from getting the help you deserve when you need it.

ROAD TO RECOVERY

For Minnesotans getting treatment for cancer, not having a car or being too sick to drive can be a huge challenge. The American Cancer Society's "Road to Recovery" program provides volunteer drivers who donate free transportation to and from treatment appointments. Chante Thurmond of the American Cancer Society of Minnesota says this can be a real life-line.

Anyone over 18 with a driver's license, their own car and insurance, and some extra time can volunteer as a driver. Training is provided. The need for volunteers is greatest in rural Minnesota, where the distance to treatment is often greater, says Thurmond. However, volunteer drivers are needed in all parts of the state. Prospective volunteers, and people who need help getting to their medical appointments, can call "Road to Recovery" at 1-800-227-2345.

According to the American Cancer Society, cancer related deaths in Minnesota are on the decline due to more sophisticated treatment options, and earlier diagnosis. However, Thurmond says more people undergoing treatment means an increased demand for volunteer drivers.

CUT 66133:11 "The need for cancer patients to get to and from their appointments has gotten greater over these last few years, and with the current status of our volunteers, we cannot provide all these rides to cancer patients."

Thurmond says people of all ages are encouraged to volunteer, because many of Minnesota's "Road to Recovery" drivers are getting older, and are starting to retire. A-C-S estimates there will be more than 23-thousand new cancer cases.
