POVERTY GUIDELINES

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS OF STANNARD TOWNSHIP, ONTONAGON COUNTY, MI

To be eligible, a person shall do all the following on an annual basis:

- 1) Be an owner of and occupy as a homestead the property for which an exemption is requested.
- 2) File a claim with the supervisor or board of review, accompanied by federal and state income tax returns for all persons residing in the homestead, including any property tax credit returns filed in the immediately preceding year or in the current year.
- 3) Produce a valid drivers' license or other form of identification if requested.
- 4) Produce a deed, land contract, or other evidence of ownership of the property for which an exemption is requested if requested.
- 5) Meet the federal poverty income standards as defined and determined annually by the United States Office of Management and Budget.
- 6) The application for an exemption shall be filed after January 1, but before the day prior to the last day of board of review.
- 7) Any additional eligibility requirements as determined by the township board.

The following are the federal poverty income standards which the United States Office of Management and Budget recommends that federal departments and agencies use. The standards are actually compiled and published by the Bureau of the Census which refers to them as "poverty thresholds."

The governing body of the local assessing unit has the option of considering the age of the resident(s) when establishing their guidelines. This provision applies only when one or two persons reside in the homestead, because there are no age-related thresholds for three or more persons in the homestead.

Stannard Township Asset Test

Effective September 8, 2008 residents of Stannard Township must pass the following Asset test to qualify their principle residence for a Poverty Exemption on their current year Property Taxes.

- 1. The applicant must show total household income is below the current Federal poverty guidelines for total household income.
- 2. The maximum lot size of the principle residence property being requested to be exempt shall not exceed 40 acres.
- 3. Automobile. The individual applying for the exemption may own only one (1) automobile, the loan value of automobile must not exceed \$10,000.00.
- 4. Bank Accounts. The value of all household bank accounts (savings and checking combined) shall not exceed \$2000.00.
- 5. Personal Property. The value of all other personal property; recreational vehicles, guns, jewelry, tools, yard and farm equipment, construction equipment and vehicles, logging equipment, power saws, livestock, inventory, etc, shall not exceed \$3000.00.
- 6. Able-bodied individual. If the supervisor determines the person applying for the poverty exemption is able bodied and capable of finding work to pay taxes, the Supervisor may deny the individual the poverty exemption.
- 7. Homestead Property Tax Credit. The individual must apply for the Homestead Property Tax Credit from the State of Michigan if eligible to offset the Poverty Exemption. The State of Michigan will pay the property tax over 3.5% of the annual household income under certain conditions.
- Medical Bills. If the individual applying for the poverty exemption has a large outstanding balance of medical bills due, the Supervisor and Board of Review may take this into consideration as "substantial and compelling reasons" to deviate from the poverty guideline standards.
