ORDINANCE NO. 24-921

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ANNA MARIA, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 98-6 “PROHIBITED SIGNS” AND ADDING A NEW SECTION 98-21, “A-FRAME SANDWICH BOARD SIGNS ALLOWED WITH RESTRICTIONS”, BOTH SECTIONS IN ARTICLE I, “IN GENERAL” OF CHAPTER 98, “SIGNS”, OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ANNA MARIA, FLORIDA; PERMITTING A-FRAME SANDWICH BOARDS WITH RESTRICTIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS, CODIFICATION, SEVERABILITY, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF ANNA MARIA, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1: Section 98-6, “Prohibited signs” of Article I, “In General” of Chapter 98, “Signs” of the Code of the City of Anna Maria, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 98-6. Prohibited signs.

The following types of signs are expressly prohibited, except as otherwise provided by this chapter:

- (1) Other than a governmentally placed traffic control device, any animated and intensely lighted sign which is animated by means of flashing, scintillating, blinking or traveling lights or any other means not providing constant illumination, or any sign which is rapidly pulsating, or which has flashing or vibrating lights; however, an electric sign may have a simple on-and-off lighting sequence if the sign is not otherwise animated or pulsating in character.
- (2) Billboards or other signs exceeding 16 square feet of area of sign except for signs existing or permitted prior to October 15, 2011.
- (3) Exterior signs which are made using electrified luminous tube lights that contain rarefied neon or other gases.
- (4) Signs which are visible from a public way, tacked, posted or otherwise affixed on trees, poles, posts, fences or other structures, other than a governmentally placed sign placed for a governmental function.
- (5) Any sign or any portion thereof which moves or assumes any motion constituting a nonstationary or non-fixed condition.
- (6) Any sign placed on any curb, sidewalk, post, pole, hydrant, bridge, tree or other surface located on any property or over or across any street or public thoroughfare, other than a governmentally placed sign placed for a governmental purpose.
- (7) Miscellaneous signage - Banners, pennants, searchlights, twirling signs, sidewalk or curb signs, balloons or other gas-filled figures.

- (8) Signs which bear or contain statements, words or pictures of an obscene or pornographic character.
- (9) Signs which are painted on or attached to any fence, or to any wall or structure (other than structures for permitted signs) which is not structurally a part of a building, except for signs specifically permitted under this chapter.
- (10) Signs which operate or employ any stereopticon or motion picture projection or media in conjunction with any advertisements, or have visible moving parts or give the illusion of motion.
- (11) Signs which emit audible sound.
- (12) Signs which purport to be, or are an imitation of, or resemble, an official traffic sign or signal.
- (13) Signs which, by reason of their size, location, movement, content, coloring or manner of illumination, may be confused with or constructed as a traffic control sign, signal or device, or the light of an emergency or road equipment vehicle, or which hide from view any traffic or street sign or signal or device.
- (14) Window signs covering more than 20 percent of each window.
- ~~(15) A-frame sandwich boards.~~
- (16) Signs, except for A-frame sandwich boards, whose informational content can be changed or altered by manual or electric, electro-mechanical or electronic means (i.e. changeable copy signs and signs with light-emitting diode (LED) displays) are prohibited in all zone districts except the PSP and PRA zone districts.
- (17) Electronic billboards.
- (18) Any sign with lighting that is not in conformance with the requirements of Chapter 14, Article II, Sea Turtles.

Otherwise prohibited signs may be specifically permitted by the city commission, at the reasonable discretion of the city commission, for special events upon application to and approval of the special event along with a detailed description of the sign(s) desired that is (are) otherwise prohibited, along with other relevant information such as the locations(s) and numbers of such signs.

- (19) Portable signs.

SECTION 2: A new Section 98-21, “A-frame sandwich board signs allowed with restrictions” of Article I, “In General” of Chapter 98, “Signs” of the Code of the City of Anna Maria, is hereby added to read as follows:

98-21. A-frame sandwich board signs allowed with restrictions.

In addition to the single permanent sign permitted by Sec. 98-70, each separate address housing one or more legal existing commercial use(s) within the ROR and C-1 zoning districts shall be permitted a single A-frame sandwich board. Such board shall have two fixed panels and be free of any parts that may swing or move in any fashion. Additionally, such board shall not exceed 27 inches in width by 45 inches in height, including the A-frame. Such board shall not be located in the right of way or in any parking space, shall not impede pedestrian traffic or line of

sight and/or vehicular sight distances and/or sight triangle, shall be allowed during business hours only and shall be removed during non-business hours and inclement weather.

SECTION 3. CONFLICTS. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances, insofar as they are inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of any conflict.

SECTION 4. CODIFICATION. The provisions of this Ordinance shall be codified as and become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Anna Maria. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention.

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY. In the event that any portion or section of this Ordinance is determined to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall in no manner affect the remaining portions or sections of this Ordinance on which shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and adoption.

RESOLUTION NO. R24-793**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF ANNA MARIA, FLORIDA, AMENDING RESOLUTION R721 TO ESTABLISH A REGISTRATION FEE FOR 2024-2025 UNDER THE VACATION RENTAL ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Anna Maria adopted a Vacation Rental Ordinance on November 19, 2015, and such ordinance requires the payment of fees for certain actions, which are to be in an amount as set by Resolution; and

WHEREAS, in 2011, the City of Anna Maria suffered an increase in the construction of new structures containing as many as six or more bedrooms which were subsequently used, with no notice to the City, as Vacation Rentals with as many as 22 or more transient occupants staying there at one time; and

WHEREAS, according to the 2010 U.S. Census, the City of Anna Maria has an average household size of 1.89 persons; and

WHEREAS, according to the 2010 U.S. Census, the City of Anna Maria has an average family size of 2.33 persons; and

WHEREAS, Vacation Rentals situated in single-family and two-family residential neighborhoods can and do create a great disparity in occupancy; and

WHEREAS, the City of Anna Maria has determined that the cost of regulating vacation rentals generally varies based upon the permitted occupancy of each vacation rental, with the higher permitted occupancy taking more time and expense to regulate; and

WHEREAS, for 2024-2025, the vacation rental registration fee as determined by the budget for FY 2024-2025 is based upon the city's expenses involved in regulating vacation rentals, and the number of vacation rental occupants that are permitted as to each vacation rental.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF ANNA MARIA, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Fees as provided under the Vacation Rental Ordinance for 2024-2025 are set forth in the attached Exhibit "A", which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as if set forth herein in full. The designation "Occupancy" on Exhibit "A" refers to the maximum occupancy allowed under each Vacation Rental Registration. Fees provided for herein must be received by the City along with a completed application, either electronically (on-line) or by city staff, by 4:00 PM on April 1, 2024.

SECTION 2. The City Commission directs the Mayor to implement this Resolution.

SECTION 3. This Resolution shall be effective upon adoption by the City Commission and approval by the Mayor in accordance with the Charter of the City of Anna Maria.

Plus: Any and all fee(s) and unpaid citation fine(s) that occur at the vacation rental, including any applicable late fees, plus 1% fee for each month the fee(s) and unpaid citation fine(s) remain unpaid. If such payment is not by the later of i)60 days after the date of this Resolution, or ii)60 days after the date of any citation that remains unpaid 30 days after the date of such citation, the vacation rental registration shall be cancelled, and continued use of such property as a vacation rental shall be considered in violation of the codes of the City of Anna Maria.

RESOLUTION R-24-794

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF ANNA MARIA, FLORIDA, AMENDING ITS SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR MUNICIPAL SERVICES AND PERMITS BY AMENDING FEES AS TO CODE ENFORCEMENT; PROVIDING FOR FINDINGS OF FACT; PROVIDING FOR AMENDMENT OF CODE ENFORCEMENT FEES IN THE MUNICIPAL SERVICES AND PERMITS FEE SCHEDULE AND AFFIRMING PREVIOUSLY ADOPTED FEES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Anna Maria has established a fee schedule for its services and permits pursuant to Resolution R-14-706 ; and

WHEREAS, the City administration has studied the fee schedule and determined that the existing fee schedule has resulted in the use of general revenues to subsidize City services related to Code Enforcement which are more appropriately paid for by the users of said services and the persons/entities responsible for the need of such services; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission upon review and consideration, desires to amend said fee schedule as to Code Enforcement fees; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that amendment of the adopted fee schedule for City services and permits as to Code Enforcement fees is in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Commission of the City of Anna Maria that:

Section 1. Findings of Fact

The above recitals are hereby adopted as findings of fact.

Section 2. Adoption of Fee Schedule

The fee schedule as shown on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein as to Code Enforcement fees is hereby adopted as the official fee schedule for City permits and services as to Code Enforcement provided by the City of Anna Maria.

Section 3. Repeal of Schedules in Conflict/Affirmance of Other Fees

All previous fee schedules adopted by the City in conflict with this Resolution as to Code Enforcement fees are hereby revoked to the extent of such conflict. Other fees in Resolution R-14-706 are hereby affirmed and those fees shall remain unchanged until further action of this Commission.

Section 4. Effective Date

This Resolution shall be effective upon the passage of this Resolution.

Section 5. Severability

In the event that any portion or section of this Resolution is determined to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall in no manner affect the remaining portions or sections of this Resolution which shall remain in full force and effect.

ORDINANCE NO. 24-923

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ANNA MARIA, FLORIDA, REPEALING THE CURRENT SECTION 34-2 “GROWING, PROCESSING, DISTRIBUTING AND SALE OF MARIJUANA PROHIBITED” IN CHAPTER 34, “OFFENSES”, OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ANNA MARIA, FLORIDA AND REPLACING THAT SECTION WITH A NEW SECTION 34-2 TO BE TITLED “PROHIBITION ON MEDICAL MARIJUANA DISPENSING FACILITIES, AND CERTAIN SALES OF PRODUCTS MADE FROM PART(S) OF PLANTS OF THE GENUS CANNABIS”; AND PROVIDING FOR PROHIBITIONS, DEFINITION, INTENT, PENALTY, CONFLICTS, CODIFICATION, SEVERABILITY, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF ANNA MARIA, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1: Section 34-2 “Growing, processing, distributing and sale of marijuana prohibited” of Chapter 34, of the Code of the City of Anna Maria, is hereby repealed in its entirety as follows:

~~Sec. 34-2. Growing, distributing and sale of marijuana prohibited.~~

~~The growing, processing, distributing and sale of marijuana within the city limits of Anna Maria is hereby prohibited. Marijuana shall be defined for purposes of this section to include all parts of any plant of the genus Cannabis, whether growing or not; the seeds thereof; the resin extracted from any part of the plant; and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of the plant or its seeds or resin, including but not limited to "low-THC cannabis," as defined in F.S., § 381.986. A violation of this section shall be punished as set forth in section 1-12 of this Code of Ordinances.~~

SECTION 2: A new Section 34-2 to be entitled “Prohibition on medical marijuana dispensing facilities, and certain sales of products made from part(s) of plants of the genus Cannabis” of Chapter 34, of the Code of the City of Anna Maria, is hereby adopted to read as follows:

Sec. 34.2. Prohibition on medical marijuana dispensing facilities, and certain sales of products made from part(s) of plants of the genus Cannabis.

(a) Prohibitions.

- i) Medical marijuana treatment center dispensing facilities are prohibited and shall not be located within the boundaries of the city. The city shall not accept, process or approve any request or application for a development order, development permit, building

permit or other approval associated with a proposed medical marijuana treatment center dispensing facility.

- ii) Any retail establishment that has more than 10% of its inventory consisting of products made from any part(s) of any plant of the genus Cannabis, whether growing or not; the seeds thereof; the resin extracted from any part of the plant; and any compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of the plant or its seeds or resin.
- iii) Any mobile sales of any products made from any part(s) of any plant of the genus Cannabis, whether growing or not; the seeds thereof; the resin extracted from any part of the plant; and any compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of the plant or its seeds or resin, unless such sales are pursuant to a special event permit when such sales are approved as a part of the special event permit.

(b) *Definition.* For the purposes of this section, the term "Medical Marijuana Treatment Center Dispensing Facility" means any facility where medical marijuana or any product derived therefrom is dispensed at retail.

(c) *Intent.* The intent of this ordinance is to ban medical marijuana treatment center dispensing facilities from being located within the boundaries of the city as authorized by F.S. § 381.986 (11), and to limit the sale(s) of any product made from any part(s) of any plant of the genus Cannabis, whether growing or not; the seeds thereof; the resin extracted from any part of the plant; and any compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of the plant or its seeds or resin.

(d) *Penalty.* Any violation of this ordinance shall be penalized by a fine pursuant to a citation of \$500 per day. Each day a violation continues, shall be considered a new offense.

SECTION 3. CONFLICTS. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances, insofar as they are inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of any conflict.

SECTION 4. CODIFICATION. The provisions of this Ordinance shall be codified as and become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Anna Maria. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention.

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY. In the event that any portion or section of this Ordinance is determined to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall in no manner affect the remaining portions or sections of this Ordinance on which shall remain in full force and effect.
