**CITY OF ANNA MARIA
ORDINANCE NO. 21-893**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ANNA MARIA, FLORIDA, ESTABLISHING, ADOPTING AND ENFORCING THE FINAL 2021 MILLAGE, FY 2021/2022 BUDGET AND THE RECEIPT AND COLLECTION OF AD VALOREM TAXES ON PROPERTY WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF ANNA MARIA FOR THE TAX YEAR 2021; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY CLERK TO CERTIFY COMPLIANCE AND THE MILLAGE; AUTHORIZING THE TAX COLLECTOR OF MANATEE COUNTY TO COLLECT SAID AD VALOREM TAXES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, §166.201, Florida Statutes, authorizes a municipality to raise, by taxation, amounts of money which are necessary for the conduct of municipal government; and,

WHEREAS, said statute authorizes the municipality to enforce the receipt and collection of said taxes by ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to §200.065, Florida Statutes, the City of Anna Maria, Florida, has, by Resolution No. **R21-772**, established and levied the millage rate for said taxes; and,

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Anna Maria has adopted Resolution No. **R21-773**, establishing a budget for the fiscal year 2021-22.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF ANNA MARIA, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The rate of taxation for the City of Anna Maria for the tax year beginning January 1, 2021, and ending December 31, 2021, pursuant to Resolution No. **R21-772** is established and fixed at **(2.05)** mills per \$1,000.00 dollars of value for general municipal purposes. The taxes so established shall, when collected, be credited to the general municipal fund for the operating of said City and for any other authorized municipal purpose which the City Commission may deem necessary, and the same shall be paid out and disbursed under the authority of the City Commission for said purposes. Pursuant to the Florida Constitution and applicable Florida Statutes, the established tax shall be collected for general municipal purposes on each and every assessment of real and tangible personal property subject to taxation located in the City of Anna Maria, Florida, and contained in the 2021 Certified Tax Assessment Roll as prepared by the Manatee County Property Appraiser.

Section 2. The final budget for the City for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2021, and ending September 30, 2022, pursuant to Resolution **R21-773**, as same may be amended or revised by resolution of the City Commission, is established and adopted for general municipal purposes.

Section 3. The Mayor and the City Clerk of the City of Anna Maria are hereby authorized and directed to certify on behalf of the City to the Division of Ad Valorem Tax of the Department of Revenue, compliance with provisions of Chapter 200, Florida Statutes, and to further certify the millage to the Tax Collector of Manatee County.

Section 4. The Tax Collector of Manatee County is hereby authorized and directed to collect said taxes and remit same to the City of Anna Maria.

Section 5. In the event any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this Ordinance shall be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, then such invalidity shall not affect the remaining portions hereof.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall take effect as provided by law.
