Dr. Christopher J. Cramer serves as Vice President for Research. In that role, he supports and facilitates research of faculty, staff, and students, and provides strategic direction for ~\$1B/year of annual research spending; this level of expenditure ranks Minnesota 8th in the U.S. Cramer earned his A.B. in Mathematics and Chemistry from Washington University and his Ph.D. in Chemistry from the University of Illinois. His career began with four years of service as an officer in the U.S. Army, including combat duty in Operation Desert Storm, after which he began his academic career at the University of Minnesota, where he also holds the title of Distinguished McKnight and Teaching Professor.
