TRANSPORTATION LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Transportation Funding Priority

AMC supports equity in transportation infrastructure through continued comprehensive transportation funding that includes new revenue for roads, bridges, and transit and a bonding bill that includes funding for transportation-related programs (Local Road Improvement Program, Local Bridge Replacement Program, Local Road Wetland Replacement Program, and Busway Capital Improvement Program.)



Governor's Transportation Budget Proposal

- \$722 million from GF for transportation investments over the next four years
 - \$358 million to TH fund to match IIJA federal funding opportunities
 - \$364 million to match multimodal investments
- \$100 million in one-time GF to provide <u>local match for federal grants</u>
- Adjustment to the motor vehicle registration tax
 - Nearly \$700 million in new HUTD fund revenue
 - \$227m to CSAH



Governor's Transportation Budget Proposal

Tab Fees

- Current law: \$10 plus 1.285% of the MSRP of a passenger vehicle, adjusted down annually
 - 100% in first year declining by ten percentage points each year until it reaches 10% in tenth year.
 - NEW: Annual adjustment begins at 160% of MSRP

Dedicated regional sales tax 1/8% (0.125%) for transit operations and capital beginning October 2023



Governor's Capital Budget Recommendations

Governor Walz put forward a \$3.3 billion capital investment proposal, which includes general obligation bonds and cash for the following transportation and transit programs:

- \$144 million for the Local Bridge Replacement Program
- \$108 million for the Local Road Improvement Program
- \$72 million for Bus Rapid Transit
- \$16.8 million GO and \$7.2 million cash for the Local Road Wetland Replacement Program



House & Senate 2022 Bonding Bills

Combined, the two bills total \$1.9 billion in capital improvements across the state, with \$1.5 billion in the form of GO bonds and \$391.75 million in general fund cash. Below is a breakdown of the GO funding amounts for the four programs AMC was tracking through support for our transportation funding priority:

- \$67 million for the Local Bridge Replacement Program
- \$79 million for the Local Road Improvement Program
- \$72 million for Bus Rapid Transit
- \$12 million for the Local Road Wetland Replacement Program



What's on the table?

- Gas tax? Indexing more likely
- Tab fees change to rate and/or depreciation schedule
- Metro sales tax likely higher than 1/8%
- Auto parts sales tax 100% to transportation
- MVST rate equalization
- Delivery fee
- General fund dollars IIJA match and one-time CSAH

- Bonding
