Minnesota Public Land Survey System (PLSS)

Minnesota Public Land Survey System was surveyed in Minnesota by the Federal Government (GLO) from 1847 to 1907.

Most of these PLSS corners were originally wooden posts.

The Government Land Office (GLO) originally set these corners and gave the power of maintaining them to the State.

The State gave that responsibility to the Counties.

Traditional funding sources linked to fees leave greater Minnesota short of necessary funds.

It is the job of the licensed Land Surveyor to put these corners back to where they were originally set.

MACS did a count of all the Sections corners in the State. (+/- 315,000)





- Public Land Survey System Appropriation.
- \$9,700,000 the first year is for the grant program authorized by Minnesota Statutes, section 381.125, and for grants to counties to employ county technical staff to aid surveyors making land survey corners. Up to six percent of this appropriation may be used by the chief geospatial information officer for the administration of the grant program. This is a onetime appropriation and is available until June 30, 2027.


Selection Criteria and Weight

The review committee will be reviewing each applicant based on the following formula:

Rank = 1000/(Total County Revenues from 2021(in millions)* Percent of certified corners with known geodetic values)

Examples:

- Lake County: 1000/40.1*0.05 = 498.75
- St. Louis County: 1000/(365.4*0.42) = 6.52
- Hennepin County: 1000/ (2371.4*1) = 0.42



Southwest corner to Minnesota











The original Public Land Survey in Minnesota was completed in the early 1900's. After that time, the maintenance of the system was left to local landowners and governmental units. Unfortunately, many of the monuments were quickly destroyed.
