

PROCEDURE:

Dual Response:

On all Athens Bypass incidents requiring fire response (crashes, car fires, etc.), use the following procedures to produce a joint response:

- 1. Tone Athens City/Richland Volunteer Fire Department, simultaneously
- Teamwork is recommended to get both departments alerted at the same time
- Active Alerts are required for both departments

The "Bypass" area includes US50/SR32 from Blackburn Road on the west to the East State St/US50 split on the east, and US33 from the Richland Ave exit ramp on the south to the Columbus Rd/US33 intersection on the north, including all on and off ramps.



PURPOSE:

The purpose of this policy is to establish guidelines for safe and efficient evacuation of the Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) facility. When an emergency such as a fire, bomb threat, natural disaster or the release of hazardous materials threatens the lives or personal safety of communications personnel, a complete or partial evacuation of the PSAP may be necessary. In the interest of maintaining 911 call answering services and retain the ability to quickly resume emergency service dispatch operations, the following policy exists.

POLICY:

It is the policy of the Athens County Emergency Communications Center to provide the best possible service to the County of Athens. This includes continuity of operations during an emergency when the evacuation of the Communications Center is necessary.

PROCEDURE:

When to Evacuate

When it is deemed necessary to evacuate the primary 911 Communications Center located at 13 W. Washington Street Athens, Ohio, all 911 Center personnel will relocate to one of the backup sites. An evacuation will be considered for any situation that puts the 911 Center out of service or in danger that it cannot safely and effectively operate at the primary location.

The first option to consider is the Backup Communications Center within the Ohio University Police Department and the Peach Ridge Rd tower site. If relocation to the OUPD or Peach Ridge Rd tower site is not possible due to the nature of the emergency, the facilities at the Hocking County 9-1-1 Communications Center at 52 E. 2nd Street Logan, Ohio will be used.

With approval from the Director of Communications, ONLY IF THERE IS TIME TO DO SO, staff may transport themselves in personally owned vehicles. The staff is to use their judgment and if necessary, evacuate the Center and contact the Director of Athens County 9-1-1 while en route or as soon as arriving at the temporary PSAP. If needed, a request may be made to the Athens County Sheriff's Office (ACSO) for transportation assistance. There are two evacuation conditions, Immediate and Staged.

This calls for the evacuation of all staff without delay due to imminent threat. An example would be the building filled with smoke. ALL personnel must evacuate at once. Dispatch personnel will activate the emergency call transfer button to immediately forward all calls to the Hocking County 9-1-1 Communications Center. If possible, take a screenshot of the last available CAD screen highlighting officer activity at the time of the evacuation.

If evacuation is due to a bomb threat, DO NOT transmit on mobile/ portable radio equipment during the evacuation or within 300 feet of the building.

Staged Evacuation

Immediate Evacuation

This consists of current staff being transported in two groups to allow uninterrupted emergency service. If it is safe to do so, a staged evacuation will take place. An example would be water damage or partial equipment failure. When personnel at the backup site have the Backup 911 Center staffed and online, the designated supervisor (or senior dispatcher) will contact the primary Center and advise the primary 911 Center to contact Frontier to redirect the lines or the emergency call transfer button. Once this has occurred, the remaining staff will be transported to the backup site.

During a staged evacuation, the on-duty supervisor (or senior person) will remain with staff at the primary 911 Center, while the 9-1-1 Coordinator (if available) or senior person becomes the supervisor of the primary evacuating group charged with setting up the secondary location.

Anytime an alarm or emergency condition affects the building, the on-duty supervisor or senior person must stay in close contact with the Incident Commander to ensure all available facts regarding the incident are known to aid in the evacuation decision.

Evacuation Notifications

Upon the need to evacuate, the on-duty supervisor or senior person will determine and execute the appropriate evacuation procedure, making the required initial notifications, including The Evacuation Checklist located on the Bulletin Board in the Communications Center.

- 1. Notify the Director of Communications, who will notify additional administrative personnel as needed.
- 2. OUPD Dispatch Center advising of the impending evacuation
- 3. Athens County Emergency Management Agency-EMA

Dispatchers will announce the evacuation on all primary channels, "Dispatch is beginning (specify staged or immediate) evacuation due to (state nature briefly). "Emergency Traffic Only." This alerts the units of the situation and tells them they must limit support call-ins. Even during a staged evacuation, staffing will be very minimal. The responsible LE/Fire/EMS supervisors must begin to track the on-duty units until further notification.

Once all Backup Center positions are staffed and operational, dispatchers shall notify all agency commands that the relocation is complete and broadcast over all primary channels that service is now active from the Backup 911 Center.

That for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which Granter hereby acknowledges, the Granter and the Granter hereby agree to supplement and amount that certain Docd of Essement granted to The Southern Ohio Electric Company by A. L. Snedden and Massic E. Snedden, his wife, and said essement being recorded in Deed Book 170, Page 359 on July 22nd, 1937; Columbus and Southern Ohio Electric Company by A. L. Snedden and Massic R. Snedden, his wife, and said essement being recorded in Deed Book 197, Page 450 on July 25th, 1948; and Columbus and Southern Ohio Electric Company by Lyn Bluzer. Sr. and Alice D. Bluzer. his wife, and said essement being recorded in Deed Record Velture 312. Page 327 on December 13th, 1972, affecting certain parcels of land situated in the Township of Athens, County of Athens, State of Ohio, Section 26, Town 9, Range 14, Pam Lets 121 and 122. (hereinsafter referred to as the Teasuretts)

 The Essement as initially recorded shall remain in full force and effect, but the terms and conditions are superseded and supplement as follows:

Granter grants and conveys with general warranty covenants to Granter, its successors, assigns, lessees, licensees and tenants, a right of way and easement, "Essement" for electric and other current/future energy or communication purposes, overhead and underground, in, on, over, through and across the following described lands situated in the Township of Affiens, County of Africas, State of Ohio, Ohio Company Purchase, Lesse Lot 121, Section 26, Town 9, Range 14. Containing 0.032 acre parvel of land as described in Official Record Book 562, Page 465 of the Athens County Recorder's Office (Parvel # A010010052301).

The easement shall be 40 feet wide, lying 20 feet on each side of the facilities as constructed. The approximate location of said easement is depicted on Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein.

This Essement conveys all necessary and convenient rights for the Basement's use, including, without limitation the rights to: construct, operate, maintain, inspect, protect, repair, replace, enlarge, upgrade, extend and remove utility facilities and relocate within the Essement, all necessary and convenient facilities which include but are not limited to: poles, anchors, guys, supporting structures, conductors, conduits, enclosures, grounding systems, foundations, manholes, transformers, and associated equipment, adding thereto from time to time; perform grading or filling for such facilities; cut, trim, remove and/or otherwise control, with herbicides or by other means, at Grantoo's option (without any liability to Grantor), any trees, limbs or branches, brush, shrubs, undergrowth, of whatever size, buildings, structures, or other obstructions that in Grantoe's reasonable judement endanger or interfere with the safety or use of its facilities, both within and adjoining the Essement. Within the Essement, Grantor shall not: place any structures, piles or debris, interfere with lateral support, change the level of the ground by excevation or mounding without Grantee's written consent, allow any construction that would be inconsistent with the National Electric Safety Code or Grantee's design standards, and, for underground lines, permit or cause any excavation, except for other utilities, provided such utilities rights do not conflict with this Essement. This Easement also conveys the right of ingress and egress in and over any reasonable routes at all times. If any governmental authority requires Grantee to relocate the facilities contemplated by this grant, this Essement conveys the right to relocate such facilities to a comparable location subject to approval of Grantor which shall not be unreasonably withheld.

Granter may use its property for all purposes not inconsistent with the full exjoyment of the Essement, but Granter scknowledges high voltage electric lines will be constructed within the Essement and Granter shall use its property consistent with all applicable safety rules and regulations for working near electric lines. Grantee shall restore the premises or pay reasonable damages done to fences, drains, seeded lawns (not landscaping), gates, ditches and crops caused by Grantee's use of the Essement. Granter has authority to grant this Essement. No delay or emission by Grantee in exercising any right hereunder shall operate as a waiver or forfeiture of such right. This Essement grant is effective and binding upon the parties, their successors, assigns, lessoes, licensees, heirs and legal representatives, and if any term hereunder is held invalid, the remainder shall not be affected thereby.




