Upon approval by the requisite majority of the electors of the County on the question of levying a county sales and use tax under Sections 5739.026(A)(6) and 5741.023 of the Ohio Revised Code the Board of County Commissioners of Athens County, Ohio, do hereby levy an additional tax at the rate of one-fourth of one percent for a five year (5) period. That we, the Board of County Commissioners of Athens County, Ohio, do hereby authorize and direct the Board of Elections of Athens County to submit to the voters of Athens County at the November 5, 2019, general election the question of levying an additional sales and use tax in the County.

Section 2. That the proceeds of said levy shall be used to pay expenses of administering the tax and for the following:

- (A) The implementation and operating expenses of the 911 system for the County pursuant to Section 5739.026(A)(6) of the Ohio Revised Code.
 - (B) To provide additional revenue for the County's General Fund pursuant to Section 5739.02(A)(3).
 - (C) To support criminal and administrative justice services in the County pursuant to Section 5739.021(A).

Section 3. That the revenue from the levy shall be allocated between the purposes stated in Section 2 on a calendar basis, and the funds allocated shall be those received in the calendar year from the Ohio Department of Taxation, and the method of allocation shall be to designate to the use described in Section 2(A) (enhanced 911 system) with any excess designated to the use described in Section 2(B) and (C) to be split evenly.

Section 4. That the Clerk immediately certify a copy of this resolution to the Athens County Board of Elections, to be submitted to the voters at the November 5, 2019, general election, and to certify a copy of this resolution to the Tax Commissioner of the State of Ohio and to the Athens County Auditor.
