During the 1993 creation of the Ohio Scrap Tire Laws, the Ohio General Assembly included Ohio Revised Code (OR C) 3734.8S(E) in the statute that allows for state-funded cleanups without subsequent cost recovery of small tire piles (fewer than 2,000 tires) provided that six specific conditions are met (below). In 2012, the Ohio General Assembly increased the maximum number of eligible tires under this statute from 2,000 to 5,000 tires per site.

Scrap Tire Consent and Program Eligibility

This instruction sheet applies to Ohio counties, municipal corporations, townships, villages and solid waste management districts or other governmental authorities for removal of illegally dumped scrap tires on public property or right of ways. The Scrap Tire Consent Form is to be used for scrap tire sites having no less than 100 tires and no more than 5,000 tires. The scrap tires may be any size and may be un-mounted or on rims. Tires collected during tire amnesty collection events are not eligible for pick-up and disposal under this program. On file in Commissioner's Office.

ARTICLE XXI - COVID-19 Safety Measures

Until the Parties mutually agree in writing to amend the Agreement, these provisions for COVID-19 Safety Measures shall remain in effect:

- · The Association shall enforce that participants and spectators and all others associated with the permitted uses shall (1) maintain 6 feet physical distancing between each other, except for immediate household members; (2) wear masks, except for players who are on the field (dugout players shall wear masks); and (3) provide hand sanitizer to players and patrons,
- The Association shall control ingress and egress points in the Park to ensure distancing is maintained.
- The Association shall ask participants to self-report illness or COVID exposure and not attend.
- The Association shall sanitize surfaces used during permitted activities, including, but not limited to, bathroom/portable toilet, railings, and any other surfaces where participants had skin contact.
- The Association shall not serve or distribute food or drink on Park grounds,
