The Benzie County Board of Commissioners met in a regular meeting on Tuesday, March 10, 2015, 448 Court Place, Government Center, Beulah, Michigan.

The meeting was called to order by Chair Vance Bates at 9:00 a.m.

ELECTED OFFICIALS & DEPT HEAD COMMENTS:

Marlene Wood, Recycling Coordinator, stated that the web site is up to date and she has prepared three brochures explaining the recycling program. She will be gone for 10 days but her sites and the office will be covered. We have received a \$15,000 tire grant from the DEQ.

<u>Craig Johnson, EMS Director</u>, call volume for February was down a few runs; Thompsonville site is doing well; Almira Township received a grant to purchase a LUCAS machine and used it the very day it was put in place. Mike Mead has been involved in the ambulance service here in Benzie County for 42 years and has decided to retire – last Wednesday was his last shift.

Ron Berns, Central Dispatch, stated that the MDT project has been ordered with 4-6 weeks shipping $-\frac{1}{2}$ will go to the Sheriff Dept and $\frac{1}{2}$ to ID Networks to be programmed.

<u>Sheriff Schendel</u>, stated that they have two issues that will be discussed during the County Administrator's time and he will be here for questions.

<u>Jennifer Berkey, MSU Extension</u>, she is the Interim District Director and stated that they partner with local counties. She has Deb Laws and Kurt Schindler with her to discuss their programs. Deb Laws is the 4-H Program Coordinator, stated that she has been with MSUE for 20 years and explained the Soccer Program and 4-H volunteers – they do four background checks on all volunteers; there are three reference letters required and an on-line training course.
