THE BENZIE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS June 9, 2015

The Benzie County Board of Commissioners met in a regular meeting on Tuesday, June 9, 2015, at the Benzie County Government Center, 448 Court Place, Beulah, Michigan.

The meeting was called to order by Chair Vance Bates at 9:00 a.m.

9:04 a.m. PUBLIC HEARING - 2015 TAX RATE

Commissioner Comments:

Comm Walterhouse stated that this is for the summer rate only.

Comm Carland inquires if it is legal to have an indefinite millage rate.

Tom Longanbach explains – this is operating; maximum would be 3.2918 without this hearing; by holding this hearing the maximum is 3.5144.

Comm Warsecke asks if it will raise taxes for the citizens. No, it is the same tax rate as last year.

John Zirkel, Lake Township, we are talking the taxable value last year and this year and the tax rate is the same for 2015 as it was for 2014. I hear from you about the 5.29, but never hear about the taxable values increases, the citizens will give you a little at a time but not all at once, so forget that thinking about it.

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ELECTED OFFICIALS & DEPT HEAD COMMENTS:

Marlene Wood, Recycling Coordinator, reported that township clean-up days will continue through the summer; she has been working with the DNR to clean up illegal dump sites in Benzie County — we are now down to 12; she did an article with before and after pictures for the newspaper of these sites and she believes these are old sites; the next Household Hazardous Waste Clean Up is July 11 from 9 a.m. — 12:00 noon in Frankfort and will continue taking tires; another tire event is by appointment only; the next quarterly SWAC meeting is June 24 at 5 p.m.; the recycling truck is back on the road after repairs.

Bert Gale, presented the May 2015 Building Code & Safety Enforcement report.

<u>Craig Johnson, EMS Director</u>, stated that they held their annual tug of war with the Lake Ann and Platte River schools; May 27 they held a strategic planning session for EMS and came up with a Mission Statement and a Vision Statement, together with some other suggestions including that they feel they are still understaffed, the 9-9 shift is what works best for them; will look at restructuring the department and appointing some supervisors.

<u>Frank Post, Emergency Management,</u> provided his May 2015 monthly report; requests approval of two FEMA Hazardous Mitigation Grant pre-applications – M-115 Property Acquisition Project and Lake Township Bluff Road Erosion Control Project.

Tom Longanbach, Chair, Building Authority, let the board know that there is a special meeting tomorrow at 9 a.m.; they had an offer by architect for \$175,000 to option 1 spray/sprinkle and they want a total release of liability for the whole building; we countered that if we get the waiver we will talk; moving ahead with the re-roof plan and they have chosen 1200 sq ft to see how complicated it will be and they will be able to give a better cost figure; the fire inspector went through the building last week and several people were present with questions for him – we are awaiting the report to see where we are.
