The Benzie County Board of Commissioners met in a regular meeting on Tuesday, October 13, 2015, 448 Court Place, Government Center, Beulah, Michigan.

The meeting was called to order by Chair Vance Bates at 9:00 a.m.

ELECTED OFFICIALS & DEPT HEAD COMMENTS:

<u>Craig Johnson, EMS</u>, reported that they had a record setting September with 188 runs; October number are up as well; he received a letter from the wife of a patient who is pleased with the care her husband received and therefore she has donated \$200 for the EMS staff to have a pizza party.

Ron Berns, 911 Central Dispatch, stated that they are testing the new site repeater in Frankfort and it seems to be going good; on October 22 some of his staff will be recognized in Frankenmuth for their efforts on August 2 during the storm – handling calls for other counties (Leelanau, Grand Traverse and Kalkaska) when they did not have service.

Bert Gale, Building Dept, provided the board with the September 2015 report.

Marlene Wood, Recycling Coordinator, stated that they held their quarterly SWAC meeting last week and she will provide those reports to you; she will be starting back up with the DNR to visit illegal dump sites; Requests approval to apply the DEQ scrap tire grant again this year, with the application due October 30; improvements are being made at some of the recycling sites – looks nice.

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Motion by Walterhouse, seconded by Sauer, to authorize application for the scrap tire grant through the DEQ as requested, authorizing the chairman to sign. <u>Jaime Croel, Animal Control</u>, reported that she does not have the September report yet; she is requesting to apply to the Animal Welfare Fund for up to \$10,000 with a November 2 deadline; she will be heading to Battle Creek on Sunday for the MACO Conference with four Animal Welfare League members; her equestrian team did well and will head to State competition on Thursday.

- Statement of Assurances: Motion by Bates, seconded by Griner, to authorize the Emergency Management Coordinator to sign the "Statement of Assurances" and submit the same with the application to FEMA as a required part of the application. COMMISSIONER REPORTS

Comm Carland stated that he was in Detroit last week earning his Citizen Planner certificate – he was the only elected person at the conference – everyone else was appointed; he will ask the Planning Commission to send someone to that conference every year as funds permit. He attended Networks Northwest last evening and they had discussion regarding what school kids and how do we get them on a career track where they can actually earn money – want to do what do you want to do, what are you interested in.

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Comm Tucker reported that she has been researching the 24-hour on-call service and reached out to Victor with Wyant and asked him to come in today. Victor stated that there is a 4-hour window for on-call time to response and a 24-hour telephone support on-site/remote support; 24/7 - 5 days per week. He stated he had the ability to respond and did – the county chose not to pay for the 7 day per week coverage due to cost.

Comm Walterhouse had nothing to report.

Comm Griner reported that he has been attached balance training with Area Agency on Aging and state that we have that service here too through Council on Aging. Tourism is still strong in the City of Frankfort. Next Monday he will tour the Mecosta County morgue with John Amrheim; Thursday he will go to Lansing for the MAC Transportation meeting.

Comm Warsecke stated that he attended a special meeting of the Road Commission in Colfax Township last night regarding the Nostwick Road Bridge; also attended the SWAC meeting.

Comm Sauer stated that there is a Veterans Memorial display at the Treasurer's office; October 30 will be the Summit from 8 a.m. -4 p.m. for \$20.00 and includes lunch; the Road Commission will start working on the culverts on Lindy Road later this month; December 8 the new services at the Health Dept will begin.

Comm Bates stated that the EMT class in Lake Ann has begun and will run through March; he has attended the Lake Township meet; Almira Township is doing GIS on the park; he attended Art Prize in Grand Rapids and says Congratulations to Steve and Ann Loveless for winning.

Karl says this is not a conflict, we are dealing with a contract; the attorney does not make our decision, we will make that; the attorney may recommend, but not decide.

Comm Griner stated that people in the community don't think we should get out of the Cohl contract. Comm Bates says he is not comfortable with explaining to the public why we are spending so much money on corporate counsel.

Comm Warsecke asks that the Sheriff be allowed to speak – denied.

Comm Tucker calls for the question.
