Purpose: The Benzie County Board of Commissioners is a public policy setting body and subject to the <u>Open Meetings Act (PA 267 of 1976)</u>. The Board also operates under a set of "<u>Benzie County Board Rules (section 7.3)</u>" which provides for public input during their meetings. It continually strives to receive input from the residents of the county and reserves two opportunities during the monthly scheduled meeting for you the public to voice opinions, concerns and sharing of any other items of common interest. There are however, in concert with meeting conduct certain rules to follow.

Speaking Time: Agenda items may be added or removed by the board but initially at least two times are devoted to Public Input. Generally, however, attendees wishing to speak will be informed how long they may speak by the chairman. All speakers are asked to give their name, residence and topic they wish to address. This and the statements/comments will be entered into the public record (minutes of the meeting). Should there be a number of speakers wishing to voice similar opinions, an option for a longer presentation may be more appropriate for the group and one or more speakers may talk within that time frame.

Group Presentations – 15 minutes Individual Presentations – 3 minutes

Board Response: Generally, as this is an "Input" option, the board will not comment or respond to presenters. Silence or non-response from the board should not be interpreted as disinterest or disagreement by the board. However, should the board individually or collectively wish to address the comments of the speaker(s) at the approval of the Chair and within a time frame previously established, responses may be made by the board. Additionally, the presenter may be in need of a lengthier understanding of an issue or topic and may be referred to a committee appropriate to address those issues.

Public Input is very important in public policy settings and is only one means for an interchange of information or dialogue. Each commissioner represents a district within the county and he/she may be individually contacted should greater depth or understanding of an issue be sought. Personal contact is encouraged and helpful to both residents and the board.

Emergency Management Activities

for the month May 2021

1. Region 7 Homeland Security Planning Board Meeting

The Region 7 Homeland Security Planning Board meetings are still being held via Zoom and was conducted on April 6, 2021. Discussions for training and equipment funding were on the agendas. The State of Michigan EOC webinars for all local Emergency Managers was held on May 13 and May 27, 2021. These meeting are keeping us up to date on State information (currently vaccination status) and other Counties working cohesively under the State of Emergency/Disaster.

2. CERT Activations

CERT monthly training included a segmented training on Search and Rescue components. May breakdown included search planning and tasks that need to be completed before an organized search begins. June Training included map and GPS understanding. July training should include a simulated search in Manistee County

3. Ironman September 12. 2021

We met with Ironman on June 4, 2021 in Frankfort for updates. USCG and DNR will not be approving the swim portion of the event within the channel – so they will need to adjust the swim course. The bike and run courses have been mapped.

4. EOC COVID-19 Response

Information for assistance funds for small businesses have been shared via social media on the Benzie Office of Emergency Management page of the website. I also reached out to local funeral home providers with he information families need to receive COVID death related funeral assistance.

Please see the attached list of Generous Donations from the community recognition. These community members/ business owners contributed to Benzie County services when resources were needed. They should be acknowledged for their willingness to give during "uncertain times".

5. Local Planning Team / Local Emergency Planning Committee

The LEPC and LPT meetings for May were cancelled – due to lack of agenda items.

The next LEPC meeting is scheduled for June 21, 2021.

The next LPT meeting is scheduled of June 24, 2021.

6. Benzie County Sheriff's Office - Victims Services Unit

Four volunteers met for the first local meeting of the Benzie County Victim's Services Unit. Applications and applicate greeting packets are being finalized as well has building community hand out and advocate resource materials.

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7. School Safety Workgroup

The Benzie County School Safety Workgroup is scheduled for June 21, 2021

Benzie Central and Frankfort Elberta SROs are updating emergency response plans for their respective schools and working on extending service plans for the Lockdown USA and the current "boot" system.

The SRO millage is scheduled to expire December 2021.

8. Benzie County Lakeshore Erosion / High Water

The projected levels for June 11th indicate that all the lakes are within 1 inch of the levels from one month ago and all are below levels from this time last year. The forecasted June 11th water levels also show that water levels are above their long-term monthly averages for June, and below their record high monthly averages for June on all lakes, except Lake Ontario. Lake Ontario's forecasted June 11th level is below its long-term average June level. Lakes Superior and Ontario are forecast to rise 1 inch by July 11th. Lakes Michigan-Huron and St. Clair are forecast to be near their current respective levels one month from now and Lake Erie is forecast to decline 2 inches by July 11th.

Approval of minutes from the April 21, 2021 meeting: <u>Two corrections</u>—Leo Hughes did not have specific plans to get the tent. Just looking. Ingrid Turner noted the spelling of meet was incorrect. Motion by Ingrid Turner, supported by Deb Rogers to approve minutes. Roll Call: I. Turner, yes; P. Turner, yes; Rogers, yes; Russell, yes; Ringleka, yes; Howe-Perry, yes; Dykstra, yes; Hughes, yes; Mullen Call, yes. **Motion carried**.

Public Input: None.

Information items:

- A. Executive Committee Report: Nancy Call updated on May 12, 2021 Executive Committee meeting. Nancy said the committee discussed staffing issues, filling vacant BOD position and 6th route for HDM. Doug presented drafts of both a letter to clients, as well as an internal memo regarding vaccinations. Doug met with Board of Commissioners Community of the Whole to get approval for repair to door at Administration Office and resolve furnace issues. Doug clarified they only talked about door. The furnace is agency responsibility.
- B. <u>Fund Development Committee Report</u>—Ron Dykstra offered committee update. Nancy didn't get drawn for 100 Women Who Care. Doug did submit paperwork for pavilion for Walk-A-Thon (WAT). We will be doing a boxed brunch instead of buffet for WAT. We

have a number of grants pending. Benzie County Board of Commissioners approved grant of \$15,000 and that was mailed to the G.T. Band. MOWA (Meals on Wheels America) grant--should hear about in June for \$15,000. Oleson Foundation-- \$10,000 also should hear in June. Cherryland Cares grant—we did get awarded \$10,000, just have to wait until we purchase the vehicle, and they will reimburse us. Ron asked about the cost of new vehicles. Doug shared that volunteers prefer minivan type vehicles because of the ease of getting in and out with totes, frozen, breakfast bags, etc. There are two minivans Toyota Sienna and Chrysler Pacifica that will fit our needs. Tim Markey wondered if we would get the government discount, but Doug shared that we aren't a county entity. MOW has signed on w/ GM on special leases. Tim could send an email to see if we qualify. Paul asked if the county donate the vehicle. Doug shared that we have never used general fund dollars for the purchase of our fleet vehicles-always used grants and specified donations.

- C. Program and Personnel Committee—Did not meet in May.
- D. Agency/Building Needs Report—Leo said nothing to report.
- E. Director's Report/Program Services Report.
 - a. Doug reported as of the 15th Benzie is still classified in Risk E category with Covid numbers but has steadily decreased in number of factors to drop to Risk D. Hopefully, we will be able to open soon but still have no concrete date.
 - b. Received \$5000 grant from MOWA for a Fresh Produce Bag program. Next week will be the last week we use the USDA grant produce boxes.
 - c. Senior Market Project Fresh letters to get mailed to last year's participants. We have 300 coupon booklets this year with \$20 in each one. Grow Benzie; Marvin's Gardens; Frankfort or Alberta Farmer's Market and Upnorth Fields at 115 and 31 are also locations where seniors can use their coupons. This is the most we've received from the State of Michigan. Last year, Benzie County Seniors had the 2nd highest redemption rate in the state to use the coupons.
 - d. Area Agency on Aging called to update that we will be receiving more funds from the CARES act. About \$90,000 this or next week for all of the disaster meals prepared this past year. Will have to be spent by September 30th of this year. We have some items that are in the works to be purchased as well.
 - e. May financials--Program numbers are stable. Only program that has taken a hit is the Dining Out program and that is due to Covid. Feel that as everything opens up we'll see the numbers back up. New billing system for Benzie Bus rides is working out great. 980 senior rides provided in April and paid for 4 delivery packages for seniors.
 - f. Still have client homes quarantined because of Covid, but that has decreased.
 - g. Information and Assistance numbers should say 1215 calls, not one.
 - h. Adding route 6. Staff discussed quite a bit. Going to be in a holding pattern. Currently, we have about 80 clients that are on the route that wouldn't normally

- qualify for it. Covid caused state guidelines to receive HDM to loosen up. We are assuming that once we open some will come back to TGP and some will take a "wait and see" to see how safe it is. For now, we're tabling route 6. Jeff wants to hold off and says the volunteers aren't complaining. We are pushing for new HDM volunteer drivers in case we do have to add that 6th route temporarily.
- i. Covid vaccine client letter. We have received calls regarding whether our staff that is going to client homes are vaccinated. We have a letter ready to send out to our (Homemaker) HM clients and (Home Health Care) HHC clients to ask their preference if they prefer a vaccinated HM or HHA. Waiting on what MIOSHA does now that the CDC has made some significant changes before sending letters. We were told from MIOSHA that information would be coming this week.
- j. Door—The Benzie County Commissioners Committee of the Whole voted and approved the front door change but their whole Board of Commissioners must vote on it Tuesday, 5/25/2021.
- F. Board of Commissioners Update: Tim—Still working on replacing administrative staff. Had a County Administrator, Deputy Administrator and Finance Office. Currently looking for County Administrator but instead of Deputy Administrator we have an HR/Finance Manager—Katie Zites. Comes from Grand Traverse County Deputy Clerk and has already started. We have a couple people filling in accounts payable and paryroll until we can get that in place. Bullet proof glass is in and installed. Making BOC room video conference friendly. Major upgrade. Going forward the BOD will have to meet in person, but the public may want to participate virtually. Almost finished up on strategic plan waiting for a couple edits to approve. Because of CARES act Benzie County govt will be receiving 3.5 million but do not have clear direction on how we can spend it. Also, each township is getting funds as well. Homestead will be getting \$240,000. All townships getting money.

Nancy asked if we could use the BOC conference room to conduct BOD meeting w/ remote people. Tim—both yes and no. Depending on your bi-laws if you must meet face to face.

Sent out five or six inquires and this is the only one that came back with a bid. Unsure of how long it will take because of material shortages, but if we have approval, we can get it going. Going to be metal, secured, modern door. Inside drop box instead of outside. Looking for final approval. Motion to approve the Administration Office Front Door project by Ringleka, supported by Dykstra. Roll Call: Russell, yes; Ringleka, yes; Howe-Perry, yes; Dykstra, yes; Hughes, yes; I. Turner, yes; P. Turner, yes; Rogers, yes; Call, yes. Motion carried.
- 6. Signing bonus for new hires. Doug—hiring continues to be a challenge and currently have wait lists for both HM and HHC. Staff is doing overtime as much as they can. Doug conducted research into GT, Benzie, Leelanau, Manistee and Wexford Counties to see what for-profit HHC agencies, hospitals, doc offices offer. We are competitive. We have already instituted a \$250 signing bonus since 2016. Right now, the average signing bonus is \$1000. Heartland Hospice is doing a \$2000 signing bonus. Doug and the Executive Committee discussed increasing the signing bonus to \$1000 which would mean \$500 after 90 days and \$500 after 180 days. If we start increasing wages it becomes a permanent. Employment Ad has run in Record Patriot, Record Eagle, Indeed, Monster, Chamber and Michigan Works. We have grants to put people through the CENA training at no cost to them. We need one HHA now if not two or three to bring us up to speed and have been searching since November 2020. Spending a lot of money on advertising. Motion to approve signing bonus to new staff and existing staff to receive \$250 bonus if they refer someone and the person stays on for 90 days. Motion made by P. Turner and supported by Howe-Perry. 7. Finance committee recommendation to go with sweep accounts. P. Turner--We have funds at State Savings Bank greater than the FDIC limit of \$250,000. From a fiduciary standpoint makes sense to spread money across more than one bank to take advantage of FDIC protection at \$250,000. Discussed with local banks but no one seemed interested. Propose keep \$250,000 at State Savings and then investigate opening an account with 2 or 3 other banks with this program maxmyinterest.com. They negotiate with a number of banks to get higher interest rates. Idea is that we would pursue that option and could have an FDIC limit in 2 or 3 that would give us the coverage and protect our funds. Also pick up interest .516 a year versus very little interest with state savings. Leaving \$550,000 to banks that earn a higher interest rate. More accounts and keep enough liquidity to cover your needs at state savings. Could be about \$2500-\$3000 a year in interest. Ron asked about bond funds. Paul stated that there are liquidity and FDIC issue w/ bonds. We will still maintain checking at State Savings. Still have mortgage with Honor Bank. Motion to authorize BSR to move forward with maxmyinterest keeping \$250,000 local by Russell. Supported by Rogers. Roll call: Howe-Perry, yes; Dykstra, yes; Hughes, yes, I. Turner, yes; P. Turner, yes; Rogers, yes; Russell, yes; Ringleka, yes; Mullen Call, yes. Motion carried.

Benzie Senior Resources Executive Directors Report May 2021 – June 2021

- Our own Fresh Produce Bags began on June 9th with the goal of distributing 50 bags a week at least through September 2021. Each bag will have 30 items consisting of fruit, vegetables, and dairy.
- Senior Project Fresh Coupons have started to be distributed and so far, 130 coupon booklets worth \$20 each have been given out to those that qualify. These coupons are to be used at participating Farmers Markets throughout the region. We have 300 coupon booklets to be given out.
- Now that indoor capacity restrictions are being lifted, we are starting to resume staff training. We had a small group of staff go through their recertification in CPR and First Aid with another group to follow. Working on additional mandatory staff and volunteer training schedules for the remainder of the year.
- I am pleased to announce that The Gathering Place Senior Center and Administrative Office will be open for business on July 6th. The re-opening business plan is being put together and several staff meetings will be occurring prior to re-opening.
- I have contracted with Comfort Keepers to help with the reopening of our Foot Care Clinic beginning on June 23rd and then every Wednesday. The clinic will be by appointment only. Refer to the upcoming July Senior Scoop Newsletter for additional details.
- We have hit a milestone of having 120 individuals sign up for the Lawn Chore Service. The last day to sign up is June 18th.
- The agency's biggest hurdle right now is staffing. We have waiting lists for Homemaking Services and for Respite and Personal Care. This is something that is not taken lightly and is new to this agency to have a waiting list. But the job market is at a standstill with those looking for work. We have like so many other employers increased signing bonuses, recruitment bonus and have made our wage scale as competitive as possible. We offer a fair benefit package and other perks for an ideal work experience/ environment.

Volunteer Report

Advertised in the Record Patriot, Betsie Current, Facebook and Senior Scoop Newsletter for additional HDM volunteers and so far, we have the potential for 3 new volunteers.

Legislative News

Federal – President Biden sent his full Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 Budget to Congress, outlining the Administration's federal funding priorities for the upcoming fiscal year that begins on October 1, 2021. The full proposal includes increased funding levels for a number of programs that provide critical support for older adults in need, including \$1.341 billion for the Older Americans Act (OAA) Nutrition Program – an increase of \$390 million.

State – Still in the discussion stage for the FY 2022 Budget.

Program Report for May 2021

Nutritional Programs

In May 2021 we distributed 5,400 pounds of fresh produce, dairy, and meat to 201 senior households.

Home Delivered Meals

Home Delivered Meals -6,495 meals were provided to 229 clients in May 2021. For year to date we have served an additional 11,064 meals.

Curbside Meals

The Gathering Place Senior Center is closed. However, we are offering curbside pickup of meals and 664 meals were served in May 2021. **This is a slight increase of 1% over May 2020.**

Other Programs/Services

Dining Out Program – 13 individuals purchased 44 dining out vouchers during May 2021. Since the pandemic, this is the highest number of individuals that have purchased Dining Out Vouchers.

Homemaker Program – 400 service units were provided to 109 clients in May 2021. This program is up 20% as compared to a year ago even with 17 households waiting for service.

Guardian Medical Monitoring – Thirty-seven clients receive this service at no cost to them. Nineteen clients have requested to add the new fall detection pendent at no cost to the clients. Currently we have no one on the waiting list.

Benzie Bus Rides and Package Deliveries – In May 2021, we have purchased 505 senior rides to 101 seniors, 25 package deliveries and 2 clients to Traverse City for medical appointments.

Information & Assistance - The agency handled 1,136 calls in May 2021 regarding Information and Assistance for services and questions related to older adults. Year to date we are up 13.2% over the 2020.

Senior Companion Program – The Senior Companion Program has recently started to resume their services and will continue to expand their services.

Dental Program – No invoices were submitted by our partner dental clinics in May 2021.

Estate Planning – There were no services provided in May 2021.

Medicare/MMAP's - Ten clients received assistant in May 2021.

Foot Care – Seven clients received in-home foot care in May 2021.

Emergency Senior Essential Needs Fund – Two individuals received financial assistance for utilities costs in May 2021.

The Gathering Place Senior Center - The center is closed until July 6th.

In-Home Services for May 2021 – We are now back to pre-COVID numbers for in-home service number of clients but service hours are lower as we try and see has many clients as possible and there has been some adjustments to the number of hours per client during the week.

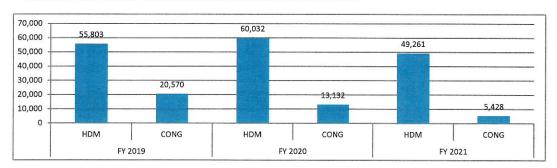

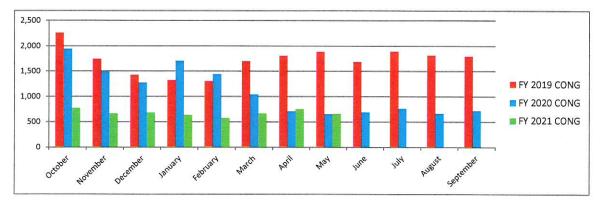

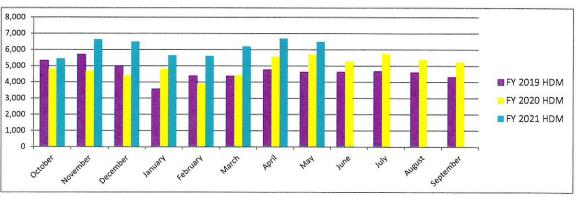

WHEREAS, the 1963 Michigan Constitution stipulated four-year terms for the County Board of Supervisors, the preceding body to today's Board of County Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature voted in 1966 to abolish Boards of Supervisors and formally replace them with Boards of Commissioners after the 1968 elections; and

WHEREAS, PA 261 of 1966 promulgated that the length of terms for the new county commissioners shall be concurrent with that of state representatives, as specified in Article IV, section 3 of the Michigan Constitution, and

WHEREAS, the scope and duties of a county commissioner has greatly increased in the last century to include challenges of: road patrols, indigent defense, mental health treatment and substance abuse prevention programing, solid waste pick-up and disposal, food and water supply safety, park operations, economic development efforts, emergency management and response; and

WHEREAS, Michigan is one of only five states in the United States that provides for exclusively two-year terms for county commissioners; and

WHEREAS, all other county and township elected officials in Michigan are elected to terms of at least four years; and

WHEREAS, the position of county commissioner is a highly complex oversight role that requires years to master; and

WHEREAS, legislation to amend state law to enact four-year terms has been filed in the form of Senate Bills 242 and 245; and

WHEREAS, The Michigan Association of Counties supports the legislation as introduced.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Crawford County Board of Commissioners supports Senate Bills 242 and 245 to enact four-year terms for county commissioners.

Community Connections Presentation - Debbie Aldridge

A new link on the BLDHD website has been created that shows various break downs on how services have been referred for Grand Traverse, Leelanau and Benzie counties. These referrals go further into showing the demographics of individuals who have been referred and which types of services are the most in demand. Types of services that were listed were housing, food assistance,

medical, utilities and etc. There also was a section showing how many of these needs have been met and how many open cases that there still are. This is a program that started in Benzie, Leelanau and Grand Traverse Counties and is spreading throughout the entire portion of the Northern Lower Peninsula. Aldridge and Rachel Pomeroy are the individuals who are assisting all the other Health Departments in the Northern Lower Region in implementing the tracking systems for their counties.

Health Officer Update – Lisa Peacock

Written Public Health Statement was distributed for review prior to the meeting. Current COVID updates were given, with information regarding vaccinations for the community. New office guidelines are being drafted as the MIOSHA updated their policies in regard to masking and social distancing. It should be released next week. Northern Health Foundation has purchased the vacant lot next to the Benzie offices and plans for an addition are being explored. They are also reviewing the space needs in Leelanau and investigating what the best course of action may be for needed space at that location.

Discussion on future Board of Health Meetings

After discussion it has been decided that the next Board of Health meeting in July will take place in Benzie, at the Benzie Community Resource Center, for an in-person meeting.

Staff Reports:

Medical Director – Dr. Joshua Meyerson

Dr. Meyerson began speaking about how MIOSHA has now relaxed the COVID protocols to match the CDC guidelines, but Schools are going to keep their current protocols in place. There are just a few weeks left in the school year and no one wants to jeopardize the end of the year events that have been planned.

This year is going to be a bad year for ticks. Meyerson discussed the two main types of ticks in Northern Michigan. He went into detail on which tick is known for carrying Lyme disease and which tick is a known carrier for Rocky Mountain Fever. A tick must be attached for 24 hours to transmit any of the diseases that they may carry. So, the quicker removal of a tick the better. If a tick has become engorged on a person they should seek medical treatment.

Personal Health - Michelle Klein

Written report distributed prior to the meeting for review. Temporary staff are being trained to manage Covid vaccine clinics so other staff members will be able to return to regular job duties, including administering routing vaccinations.

Covid Clinics will be held as long as there is a demand for them. We will be reducing pop-up clinics and transitioning to one clinic per week in each county that can serve walk-ins. In Leelanau this will be at Suttons Bay School and in Benzie at the Crystal Lake Café.

We are partnering with Health Department of Northwest Michigan to implement an MDHHS grant that will provide a school-based mental health provider at Suttons Bay school, with a target date of September 1. Another grant was submitted to the Michigan Health Endowment fund that, if received, will support school based mental health providers at Benzie Central and Frankfort schools.

The MDSS Communicable Disease report was reviewed. Reportable communicable diseases are reported to the health department through physicians, schools, labs, and other health departments. All cases are entered into MDSS, and public health nurses then conduct case investigation and follow-up to ensure that the cases have access to the treatment and information needed to prevent complications from illness and to prevent further spread of disease. MDSS reports, along with active surveillance conducted when people go to the emergency room, allow us to track trends and to identify outbreaks.

Environmental Health – Eric Johnston

Johnston began by introducing Xavier Gagne, one of BLDHD's Sanitarians who specializes in vector- borne diseases. Gagne presented a slide show about the various ticks in the area. He discussed how people can mail the State of Michigan ticks that they have captured. The State will identify the ticks so individuals will know if they should seek out treatment for possible Lyme's disease if they have been bitten by the tick.

Leelanau's property records are now available on the BLDHD website. Leelanau and Leland are the only two townships that are not currently available to the public as redaction is still being performed on them. Johnston thanked the Leelanau County Commissioners for funding this project as it has already shown to save time for the Leelanau office. The calls from the public requesting records for this County has already gone down by a third since it began.

It was discussed how the Senate Bill 353 and 354 has been passed by the Senate and will be going to the House of Representatives. If this passes all restaurants and food services will not have to pay for their food permits for 2021. For any businesses that had already paid for the 2021 year they would be refunded. This is a huge loss of revenue for all Health Departments across the State.

There were no grants issued to pay for beach monitoring this year. So, no inland lakes will have E Coli tests performed unless a municipality agrees to pay for the testing. If this happens then it will only be for those specific locations. Currently only certain beaches along Lake Michigan will be tested. This will begin on June 16th and continue on for 16 weeks.

Benzie's property records are next to be uploaded to the website. They will become available to the public once the redaction process is complete.

Administrative – Dodie Putney

Putney introduced the new administrative staff member, Shelley Jablon. Putney explained what her role with BLDHD will be and what functions Renee Youker will be transitioning to. The new

Personal Policy should be available to approve at the July meeting. Putney also briefly described the different funding that is being explored to help finance an addition to the Benzonia location.

Public Comment - None

Board Comments – Bunek brought up concerns about prenatal care for babies in Leelanau County. He had read a report that indicated that the prenatal care was not at a level that it should be. Peacock requested a copy of this report to review.

Dr. Conley asked if the BLDHD website could be updated to include Directors. This would provide more transparency to the public on who to contact with various concerns.

Dr. Conley mentioned that there are talks with MIDOCS about the various funding sources that they have become involved with to assist with mental health resources.

MICHIGAN SOCIAL WELFARE ACT Opposition to Gearing Towards Integration Proposal

WHEREAS, Senator Shirkey's Gearing Towards Integration Proposal is not a public-private joint venture, but a wholly private managed care organization, leaving no role for the public management and oversight which is currently provided by our Prepaid Inpatient Health Plan (PIHP) system; and

WHEREAS, in the requirements for creating a new entity Senator Shirkey's proposal only outlines requirements to become a Medicaid Health Plan and is silent to all the roles and responsibilities of the current PIHP system (recipient rights, housing and employment supports, community collaboration, etc.) that are core to the social determinants of health, safety net role, and community collaborative work of the public system; and

WHEREAS, the proposal does not eliminate any layers—Medicaid Health Plans will pick up the managed care functions from PIHPs at a much higher cost (15% versus 6%) and this money will be removed from the care our people are receiving today; and

WHEREAS, Section 116(b) of the Code (MCL 330.1116[b]) requires that the Department of Community Health shift primary responsibility for the direct delivery of public mental health services from the state to a community mental health services program whenever the community mental health services program has demonstrated a willingness and capacity to provide an adequate and appropriate system of mental health services for the citizens of that service area.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Lenawee County Board of Commissioners strongly urges its State Senate and House of Representatives to oppose Senator Shirkey's Gearing Towards Integration Proposal and subsequent changes proposed to the Michigan Social Welfare Act which would privatize the public mental health system and essentially eliminate the public safety net; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Lenawee County Board of Commissioners supports Lenawee Community Mental Health Authority as a public behavioral health system that provides necessary community safety net services and supports; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be provided to Governor Gretchen Whitmer, Senator Dale Zorn (17th District), Representative Bronna Kahle (57th District), Representative Sarah Lightner (65th District), Michigan Department of Health and Human Services Director Elizabeth Hertel, Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities Administration Senior Deputy Director Allen Jansen, the Michigan Association of Counties, and all Michigan counties.
