PUBLIC COMMENT

Purpose: The Benzie County Board of Commissioners is a public policy setting body and subject to the Open Meetings Act (PA 267 of 1976). The Board also operates under a set of "Benzie County Board Rules (section 7.3)" which provides for public comment during their meetings. It continually strives to receive input from the residents of the county and reserves two opportunities during the monthly scheduled meeting for you the public to voice opinions, concerns and sharing of any other items of common interest. There are however, in concert with meeting conduct certain rules to follow.

Speaking Time: Agenda items may be added or removed by the board but initially at least two times are devoted to Public Comment. Generally, however, attendees wishing to speak will be informed how long they may speak by the chairman. All speakers are asked to give their name, residence and topic they wish to address. This and the statements/comments will be entered into the public record (minutes of the meeting). Should there be a number of speakers wishing to voice similar opinions, an option for a longer presentation may be more appropriate for the group and one or more speakers may talk within that time frame. The Board will not be accepting public comment via zoom/online.

Group Presentations – 15 minutes Individual Presentations – 3 minutes

Board Response: Generally, as this is a "Comment" option, the board will not comment or respond to presenters. Silence or non-response from the board should not be interpreted as disinterest or disagreement by the board. However, should the board individually or collectively wish to address the comments of the speaker(s) at the approval of the Chair and within a time frame previously established, responses may be made by the board. Additionally, the presenter may be in need of a lengthier understanding of an issue or topic and may be referred to a committee appropriate to address those issues.

Public Comment is very important in public policy settings and is only one means for an interchange of information or dialogue. Each commissioner represents a district within the county, and he/she may be individually contacted should greater depth or understanding of an issue be sought. Personal contact is encouraged and helpful to both residents and the board.

THE BENZIE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS October 25, 2022

The Benzie County Board of Commissioners met in a regular session on Tuesday, October 25, 2022 in the Frank Walterhouse Board of Commissioners Room, 448 Court Place, Government Center, Beulah, Michigan.

The meeting was called to order by Chair Bob Roelofs.

Present were: Commissioners Jeannot, Markey, Miller, Nye, Roelofs, Sauer and Warsecke

The invocation was given by Commissioner Roelofs and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Commissioner Jeannot had a question regarding protocol. There was someone in the audience that wanted to speak to us and get some response as to public safety issues but was not able to get on the agenda in time. Do they have to speak at public input, or can we add them to the agenda? Commissioner Roelofs stated that we would like to schedule a special meeting regarding public safety issues only and invite the general public to attend.

9:03 a.m. Public Input

Commissioner Roelofs stated that he was out of state for the last 5 days and wanted to apologize to anyone that was trying to reach him.

Grant Cole stated that the County is under attack and riddled with crime the last few months. His business was broken into on October 13, 2022. When his wife made the call to 911 dispatch, she was told sorry, there is no one available to help. We are the only county in northern Michigan without 24-hour road patrol. It's time we made a change. Ask the Commissioners to review the funds and work with the Sheriff's Department and do what we need to do to protect this community.

Phil Down, Village of Beulah, supports Mr. Coles' thoughts regarding 24-hour road patrol. Spoke to neighbors and council members, and they agree, we need 24-hour patrol in this county.

Mary Haan, Homestead Township, provided a handout regarding marijuana and the effects on the environment in Whitewater Township. She had e-mailed the Commissioners a video regarding the environment and marijuana.

Annie Browning, Benzonia Township, agrees with what was being said regarding public safety and can relate to it. Safety is always first.

Tom White, Village of Beulah, had 3 of his tires slashed, along with his neighbors' tires. 9:13 a.m. Public Input Closed

This is attributed to grants ending from the State of Michigan, except for the Jail fund. Attended the Michigan Association of Land Summit in Detroit. Took a tour of the Lank Bank projects in Detroit.

ELECTED OFFICIALS & DEPARTMENT HEAD COMMENTS

Tom King, EMS Director, provided a written report. He stated his biggest issue has to do with finance billing and submitting claims. There may be issues with new EMT's, and Paramedic's as Munson is doing away with their EMT and Paramedic training.

Rebecca Hubers, Emergency Management provided a written report. She stated that they had their first meeting with the School Resource Officer (SRO) committee group. Working with the schools regarding upcoming grants for SRO and school safety programs. The upcoming grants must be applied for by the schools. Want to commend 911 workers for their response and hard work on the large windstorm that came through the county. They did a great job.

Commissioner Jeannot questioned when dispatch gets a call at 3:00 am or 3:30 am in the morning, who do they refer it to?

Rebecca Hubers stated that the policy is that if it is 3:00 am to 5:00 am then they contact the shift that was on duty to be called back in, if it is 5:00 am to 7:00 am, then they contact the shift that is coming on duty. The Sheriff Department does have an on-call policy.

Doug Durand, Benzie Senior Resources provided a written report. He stated that they now have 10 churches signed up for the holiday program. Fall cleanup is progressing. Six contractors have signed up for snow removal.

Benzie Leelanau Health Department Annual Report: Michelle Klein and Dan Thornell provided a handout and presented the Benzie Leelanau District Health Department Annual Report 2021.

Point Bestie is working through some issues with an easement and the road. Provided a roster for the Sheriff Department from 2008-2009 to present. There was 24-hour road patrol in 2008/2009 era. We can make recommendations to the Sheriff, but it is the Sheriff's that makes operational decisions.

Commissioner Nye asked when the date and time will be set for the Public Safety Special meeting. Commissioner Roelofs stated that it will be added to the agenda this afternoon.

Commissioner Jeannot asked if the memo regarding wage recommendation was shared with the Sheriff and Undersheriff.

Commissioner Sauer would like to see the Prosecutor and the Courts involved with this discussion. Commissioner Nye stated that they could attend via zoom.

Undersheriff Hubers stated that he that is unsure if the Sheriff will have the capabilities of zoom in the location he will be at.

Commissioner Jeannot requested before we adjourned today, it would be good to get a list of people in the room that want to be notified of the public safety meeting.

Commissioner Roelofs stated that the decision is under the responsibility of the Sheriff, we are just providing support and a place for it to be discussed.

Undersheriff Hubers stated that the dates the Sheriff will be out of town is November 10, 2022, to November 21, 2022. We have an opportunity here, and I do not see this as an argument. We will do our best to work on a schedule that will work within our limits. Hope to have proposal to the County Administrator soon and to the Board of Commissioner for the November 8, 2022, meeting.

A reinspection of the Benzie County Jail was conducted on October 10, 2022, by the Michigan Department of Corrections, County Jail Services Unit, as provided for by Act No. 232 of the Public Acts of 1953, as amended, being section 791.262 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

The inspection was conducted by Ron Trachet, Regulation Agent with the County Jail Services Unit.

Inspection Findings





Expenditures will include the following categories a) OSP material and logistics, b) OSP construction, c) data center (exchange) upgrades, d) electronics, e) administration such as accounting and legal compliance, f) facilities upgrades, g) tooling, and h) equipment associated with extending the CCC fiber network

Distribution of funds for services rather than a grant would enable CCC to use these funds as matching funds for potential future funding. Project management will be performed by CCC and CCC will provide regular reporting on progress to administration

Based on the level of Benzie County ARPA funding allocation

Project Option 1: CCC will invoice Benzie County at the first of each month \$103,500 for 10 months for the total sum of \$1.035 million.

CCC charges a construction fee of \$700 and an activation fee of \$500. CCC will waive the construction fee for all households in Benzie County. The resulting network will be an open access network that will encourage multiple providers to use the same infrastructure to service the anticipated connected consumers. Open access provides consumer choice in who their last mile provider is for a wide range of services, such as transport, internet, and telephone. Peninsula Fiber Networks (PFN), Eclipse Communications (Eclipse), and Cherry Capital Connection (CCC) have formed the Benzie Broadband Development Consortium (BBDC). PFN is a regional middle mile provider that owns and operates the NextGen 911 network and provides last mile providers access to the Merit REACH3MC network. Eclipse and CCC are local last mile providers. Terms and conditions of the Open Access Network will be defined by the BBDC

Benzie County and CCC will continue to work together to identify areas of need and implement solutions. This project is the first step in implementing the solution that has resulted from over 5 years of effort by various broadband committees.

Future funding opportunities will be designed to address the remaining unserved and underserved households. Over the next 12-18 months Cherry Capital Connection, their partners, and Benzie County will work together to make application to ROBIN and BEADS through the MIHI Office.

Households along the build route will be eligible to connect. The priority will be to build and connect the unserved, underserved, households with school aged children with inadequate broadband and households that are economically at risk.

ROBIN - Fact Sheet - State of Michigan FCC approved use of surplus ARPA funds

Michigan's Realizing Opportunity with Broadband Infrastructure Networks (ROBIN) program is a competitive grant program designed to provide funding to extend broadband infrastructure and service to locations currently lacking access to at least 100/20 Mbps.


In early 2022, Governor Whitmer and the Michigan Legislature passed the <u>Building Michigan Together Plan</u>. The plan includes \$250.6 million to expand high-speed internet service to unserved locations in the state. On October 7, 2022, the <u>United States Treasury announced</u> the approval of Michigan's plan for the use of these funds. The following provides an overview of the ROBIN Program.

- + ROBIN will be administered by the <u>Michigan High-Speed Internet Office</u> (MIHI) located within the Prosperity Division of the Department of Labor and Economic Opportunity.
- + The funding for ROBIN comes from the <u>Capital Projects Fund (CPF)</u> which is managed by the United States Treasury. The CPF was part of the American Rescue Plan Act that passed in 2021.
- + \$238.7M will be available through ROBIN for internet expansion to unserved locations. The remaining balance of funds (5% of the total award) will be used for program administration.
- + Unserved locations are homes, businesses, and institutions without internet service available at a speed of at least 100/20 Mbps from at least one internet service provider.
- + Up to 35% of ROBIN funds can be used for middle-mile projects that support deployment of broadband service to unserved areas. The remainder is dedicated for last-mile service projects.
- + Broadband service built with ROBIN funds must deliver a symmetrical end-user internet connection of at least 100 Mbps upstream and downstream unless significant topographic, geographic, or financial impracticability exists in the project area.
- + Eligible applicants for ROBIN include internet service providers, those licensed under the MI Telecommunications Act, franchise holders under the Uniform Video Services Local Franchise Act, or any entity currently providing broadband service in the state.
- + Governmental entities may apply for grants only as a public-private partnership with an internet service provider. Public-private partnerships must demonstrate a competitive bidding process and comply with applicable state laws.
- + Final grant criteria are still being developed by MIHI, but will include, at a minimum: the applicant's experience and financial wherewithal, **readiness to build**, operate, and maintain the project, **long-term project viability**, network scalability, and **demonstrated community support**.
- + All ROBIN grantees must participate in the FCC's Affordable Connectivity Program.
- + MIHI anticipates opening the 60-day ROBIN grant application window in mid-December 2022.
- + All program funds must be expended by the end of the 2026 calendar year.
- + Interested applicants should refer to the <u>US Treasury Guidance for the Capital Projects Fund</u> as well as the <u>boilerplate legislation (Sec. 359)</u> appropriating the CPF funds to the Department of Labor and Economic Opportunity for more information.

You will recall, Benzie County has received \$3,450,837 in funds from the Federal Government knowns as the ARPA dollars and are obligated to allocate these funds according to the Final Rule produced by the Department of Treasury. These funds must be committed by December 31, 2024 and expended by December 31, 2026.

At the September 27th Committee of the Whole meeting, the Board had great discussion as to how to allocate ARPA funding to best benefit our community. I applaud the Board for its good discussion and direction. As identified through our survey and outlined below, housing is the number one priority to our community. At the September 27th meeting, the recommendation was made to allocate 30% of the ARPA funding to community housing projects. The Board also recommended an additional 30% be allocated to internal needs to address various deferred maintenance needs on our county campus.

This leaves 40% of our ARPA allocation up for consideration, approximately \$1,380,334.80. We have identified that broadband and childcare are the other two top proprieties of our community, and I would recommend we allocate the remaining of our funding toward these priorities. But what allocation makes sense?

AGREEMENT FOR EXTENSION SERVICES

This AGREEMENT FOR EXTENSION SERVICES ("Agreement") is entered into on <u>November 8, 2022</u> by and between Benzie County, Michigan ("County"), and the BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY ("MSU") on behalf of MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY EXTENSION (MSUE").

The United States Congress passed the Smith-Lever Act in 1914 creating a National Cooperative Extension System and directed the nation's land grant universities to oversee its work; and,

MSUE helps people improve their lives by bringing the vast knowledge resources of MSU directly to individuals, communities and businesses; and,

For more than 100 years, MSUE has helped grow Michigan's economy by equipping Michigan residents with the information needed to do their jobs better, raise healthy and safe families, build their communities and empower our children to succeed; and,

It is the mission of MSUE to help people improve their lives through an educational process that applies knowledge to critical issues, needs and opportunities; and,

Further, as an organization committed to the principles of diversity, equity and inclusion, we will work collaboratively with our community partners to ensure participation from the broad human diversity of each community (including race, color, religion, national origin, age, sex, disability, height, weight, marital status, gender, gender identity (gender expression), political beliefs, sexual orientation, family status, veteran status or any other factor prohibited by applicable law) and work to make our programs accessible and inclusive of the multiple realities and forms of knowledge that will support equitable outcomes for all throughout Michigan's 83 counties;

- 2. Extension Educators and program staff as needed to implement programs within the County, housed at the county office.
- 3. A county 4-H program. .5 FTE 4-H Program Coordination.
- 4. Salary and benefits of MSUE Personnel and the cost of administrative oversight of Personnel.
- 5. Operating expenses, per MSU policy, for MSUE personnel ("Personnel").
- 6. Supervision of MSU-provided academic and paraprofessional staff. Supervision of county employed clerical staff and/or other county employed staff, upon request.
- 7. Administrative oversight of MSUE office operations.
- 8. An annual report of services provided to the residents of the County during the term of this Agreement, including information about audiences served, and impact of Extension programs in the County.

B. The County will provide:

- 1. An annual assessment that will be charged to the county and administered by MSUE. The assessment will help fund Extension services for the County, including operating expenses for certain Extension personnel and the operation of the County 4-H program.
- 2. Office and meeting space meeting the following requirements:
 - Sufficient office space to house Extension staff as agreed upon between the County and the MSUE District Director.
 - b. Utilities, including telephone and telephone service sufficient to meet the needs of Personnel utilizing MSUE office space.
 - High-speed Internet service sufficient to meet the needs to Personnel utilizing the MSUE office space.
 - d. Access to space for delivering Extension programs.
 - e. Access to the office building and relevant meeting spaces must be ADA compliant/accessible.
- 3. Clerical support for staff for the MSUE office as agreed upon between the County and MSUE District Director that will perform clerical functions, including assisting County residents in accessing MSUE resources by office visit, telephone, email, internet and media. The clerical support staff will be either a County employed clerical staff, or the County will provide funding for an MSUE employed clerical staff.



Benzie County Animal Control is in need of a vehicle. The current vehicle, 2015 Ram 1500, is not drivable due to a blown motor. The motor rebuild cost is roughly \$12,000.00. It is currently sitting a Watsons of Benzie County.

Research has been conducted by contacting various dealership researching different vehicle models. Unfortunately, vehicle inventory is extremely low is at all locations.

My recommendation is to utilize the MiDeal Program. MiDEAL is the State of Michigan's extended purchasing program that allows Michigan counties to buy goods and services from state contracts. This option allows us to get state pricing and potentially have the vehicle with a month or two. This purchase would be made through Berger Chevy.

My recommendation is to purchase a 2022 Chevy Tahoe. This vehicle will come fully equipped with emergency lighting, bumpers, vinal flooring and skid plate package for \$52,723.00. We will need to equip the vehicle with cages. The company that would equip the Tahoe is Great lakes Outfitting. They have offered to help install a K-9 divider in the back seat. We will also need to install a custom cage unit in the rear portion of the Tahoe. I do not anticipate a cost of more than \$15,000 dollars for the addition equipment.

Berger Chevy and Great Lakes Outfitting has offered to work with us to install a package that will suit our needs and provide that vehicle within a timely manner.

In the Capital Improvement Plan there is currently \$55,000 budgeted for the ACO Vehicle. Great Lakes Outfitting will provide an updated purchase agree which will include equipment, as well as adjustments for material taken out of the vehicle, ie backseat. To supplement the cost, I would recommend moving the Front Door Replacement (\$10,000) to fiscal year 2023/2024.

IN RE: Urging State Legislature to Amend the Michigan Auto Insurance Reform Act to Amend the Reimbursement Cap for Auto Accident Victims and Home Health Care.

Chairperson and Members of the Board:

WHEREAS the Michigan No-Fault Auto Insurance Reform Act of 2019 introduced a fee cap, which took final effect on July 1, 2021; this cap set percentage limits on how much residential care facilities, home health care providers, and other persons can be reimbursed for providing treatment/care to auto accident victims; and

What is Whistle Stop Learning Center?

Whistle Stop Learning Center is a newly licensed child care center in Thompsonville, MI within Benzie County. We are open Monday through Friday from 6:30am to 6:00pm. We currently have a license capacity of 40 with room to grow up to 54 based on building size and square footage.

Whistle Stop Learning Center is currently functioning as a for-profit business however a non-profit board has been formed and by-laws are currently being worked on. Within the next year Whistle Stop Learning Center will function as a 501(c)3 public non-profit organization.

Ashley is currently working as owner/director of the child care center.

Our tuition rates match, or are lower than all child care center tuition in a 5 county area. We are 25% lower than most centers in the Traverse City area and 15% cheaper than Lake Ann's child care center.

Based on current enrollment we will average about \$17,000/month. We are currently lacking in preschool children and have open immediate availability for preschool aged children 2.5-5.

Current Monthly Revenue is around \$17,000/month, leaving us a deficit of around \$3,000/month. Problem is in the lack of preschool students due to high preschool costs, in the next 9 months, 7 children will "age up" into our preschool classroom and those infant/toddler spots are already filled with waitlisted families.

New State Grant Funding for Child Care

The State of Michigan, MDE and LARA have teamed up to provide grant funding to child care centers. Whistle Stop Learning Center has applied for \$150,000 facilities grant from IFF (the fiscal organization holding funds).

- Pre-qualification application takes 4 weeks to process.
- This funding would be used for our school age classroom to be converted into an Early Head Start
 program offering 8 tuition free infant/toddler child care spots. Already working on an agreement
 with NMCAA for Early Head Start classroom.
- This funding would also be used to replace our furnaces & air conditioning units (14 years old but no problems as of yet)
- This funding can not be used for any expenses listed on the next page.

What could Whistle Stop do with additional funding?



Pay off business loan in total of \$75,000 and 7.75% interest to avoid monthly payment of \$1,500+/month and remove lien from building.



Grants or Scholarships for preschool families to encourage & grow enrollment.

448,000 would pay for 8 - 50% scholarships or 4 - 100% scholarships for preschool making the cost \$25/day or free for one year



\$24,000 would cover overhead costs for approx. one year which includes rent and all utilities.



\$12,000 would pay for one years worth of food costs that are currently incurred for breakfast, AM snack & PM snack.
