PUBLIC COMMENT

Purpose: The Benzie County Board of Commissioners is a public policy setting body and subject to the Open Meetings Act (PA 267 of 1976). The Board also operates under a set of "Benzie County Board Rules (section 7.3)" which provides for public comment during their meetings. It continually strives to receive comment from the residents of the county and reserves two opportunities during the monthly scheduled meeting for you the public to voice opinions, concerns and sharing of any other items of common interest. There are however, in concert with meeting conduct certain rules to follow.

Speaking Time: Agenda items may be added or removed by the board but initially at least two times are devoted to Public Comment. Generally, however, attendees wishing to speak will be informed how long they may speak by the chairman. All speakers are asked to give their name, residence and topic they wish to address. This and the statements/comments will be entered into the public record (minutes of the meeting). Should there be a number of speakers wishing to voice similar opinions, an option for a longer presentation may be more appropriate for the group and one or more speakers may talk within that time frame. The Board will not be accepting public comment via zoom/online.

Group Presentations – 15 minutes Individual Presentations – 3 minutes

Board Response: Generally, as this is an "Comment" option, the board will not comment or respond to presenters. Silence or non-response from the board should not be interpreted as disinterest or disagreement by the board. However, should the board individually or collectively wish to address the comments of the speaker(s) at the approval of the Chair and within a time frame previously established, responses may be made by the board. Additionally, the presenter may be in need of a lengthier understanding of an issue or topic and may be referred to a committee appropriate to address those issues.

Public Comment is very important in public policy settings and is only one means for an interchange of information or dialogue. Each commissioner represents a district within the county, and he/she may be individually contacted should greater depth or understanding of an issue be sought. Personal contact is encouraged and helpful to both residents and the board.

Commissioner Cunningham is in support of an evening meeting.

Commissioner Sauer commented on how it affects the staff in the County Administrator office and the County Clerks office, as it puts a burden on their office. We have tried evening meetings in the past and it was a flop and very few people attended.

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Walter Armstrong, District Court Magistrate, stated that it makes sense, but there is no easy solution. It does involve issues with the staff, but does that outweigh the public's ability to attend. Paula Eberhart, Register of Deeds, stated that she feels the same way as Commissioner Sauer. We tried this in the past, not very many people showed up. The County Clerk and County Administrators office employees struggle now trying to make it work.

Commissioner Roelofs stated that six to seven years ago, when the public was upset with county government, we had many people attending the meetings. They chastised this board on how things were done. I think we have done a good job cleaning things up and we have shown the public that. He is not opposed to an evening meeting, but not in favor of them either. He will be here either way. Katie Zeits stated that she would make it work, but she had left a previous employment because of night meetings, and it was taxing on her family. If we have a night meeting, please expect flexible work weeks, as I will not expect my staff to be here at 8:00 a.m. the next day if they are here until 8:00 p.m. the night before.

Commissioner Jeannot is not in support of evening meetings. We just stated we want to support the employees. Employees are telling us it could be somewhat of a burden. I want the employee here at 8:00 a.m. to service the public.

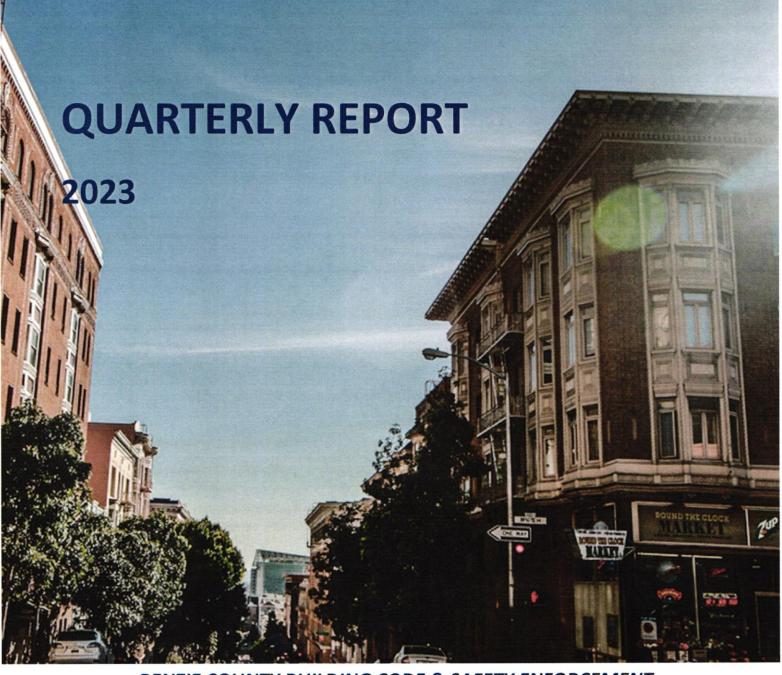

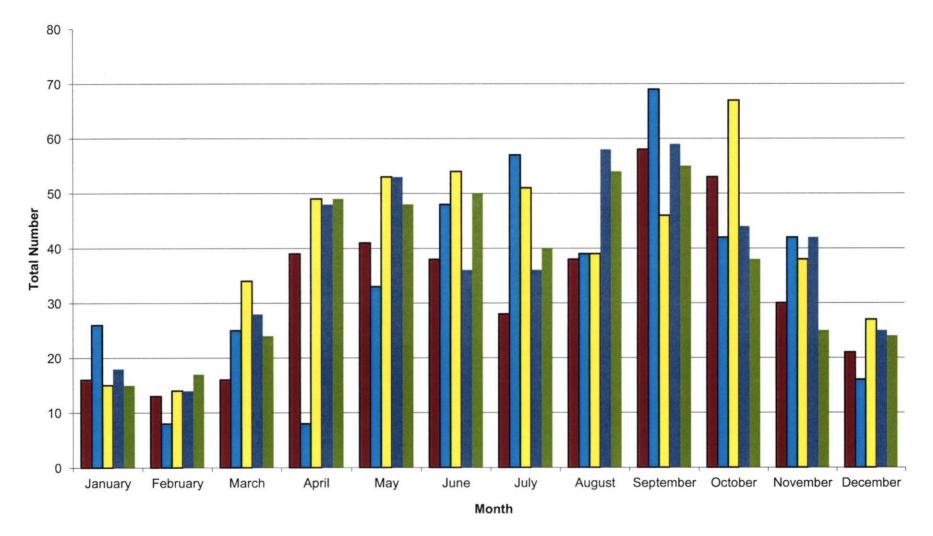

BWAC has 90 days to do their due diligence to obtain an inspection of the school building, etc. Nancy reported on the progress of BSR's Discovery Phase with Integrated Architecture and the upcoming meeting dates for staff and community meetings. Nancy complimented BWAC on their upcoming endeavor. Paul stated to please stay in touch with BSR on their progress and we would do the same.

Information Items:

- A. Leadership Committee Nancy reported that Doug gave the committee an update on upcoming meeting dates between Mike Corby from IA with management staff (11/21/23) and Community dates with the first one being held on 12/5/23 at the Governmental Center. IA, Doug and Kelly have been busy sending out notices regarding the 12/5 community meeting to media outlets and various county contacts. Discussion on the appointment of Rob Manilla to the full board. Doug reported on the progress of filling several employment positions within the agency. Discussion on the upcoming Benzie County Commission on Aging Senior Millage Renewal for 2024. We already have a presentation date with the County Commissioners on 3/12/24. We will need to discuss further whether we should increase the amount of the millage from .85 mills to 1 mill. BoD members and staff will need to embark on doing community presentations to various organizations in Benzie County telling the BSR story and finally we put together the agenda for today's BoD meeting.
- **B.** Governance Committee Meeting With Leo being absent, there is nothing to report to the Board.
- **C.** Personnel and Program Committee Report Paul reported that the committee had its first meeting since May, and they started reviewing and updating BSR's policies and procedures. This will be an ongoing process for the next several meetings.

- **D.** Marketing/Media/Fund Development Refer to the Fund Development Director's Report that is in the BoD Packet. Year-end Appeal letter will be going out next week.
- E. Executive Director's Report Doug Durand asked if anyone had any questions regarding his report that was in the BoD packet. Doug did focus in greater detail on the new system for having seniors get their free rides on Benzie Bus. Starting in December 2023, we will be returning to issuing bus punch cards in order to establish a fair cap on the number of rides at 36 one-way trips in a 30-day period. Medical health rides will not be counted in the 36 one-way rides.
- F. Board of Commissioners Update Tim Markey, County Commissioner, was absent from the meeting, so no report was provided.

A motion to approve the October 2023 Financials was made by Ingrid Turner and seconded by Dinah Haag. Roll Call: Dinah Haag Yes; Ingrid Turner Yes; Paul Turner Yes; and Nancy Mullen Call Yes. Motion approved.
- 2. Review and Approval of Board of Directors Application for Robert Manilla Motion by Paul Turner to approve and accept Robert Manilla's application to join the BSR Board of Directors and seconded by Ingrid Turner. All in-person board members said aye. Motion approved. Nancy reported that she will contact Robert Manilla and set up a time for Rob to meet with Doug and key staff. Have a tour of both locations and set up a time for Rob to go on a HDM route.

New Business:

 As per our tradition, we usually have a potluck dinner at the December Board Meeting and Nancy wanted to know if the members present wanted to continue this tradition. All in-person members said yes. BSR will provide the entrée and Doug will send out an email to the Board members on what dish they would be bringing to the December 20th board meeting.

Benzie Senior Resources Executive Directors Report November 2023 – December 2023

Program Report for November 2023

Nutritional Programs

Home Delivered Meals

A total of 6,064 HDM meals and 784 shelf stable food meals were provided to 194 clients in November 2023. **This is an increase of 21.7% over the same period of November 2022.**

Congregate Meals

In November 2023, we provided 1,712 congregate and takeout meals. This is an increase of 11.3% over the same period of November 2022.

Year to date we have provided/delivered 16,866 meals. Overall, we are up by 1,959 additional meals as compared to the same period a year ago.

Other Programs

Homemaker Program – In November 2023, we provided 290 service hours to 103 clients. Compared to November 2022, we saw an increase of 13% in service hours and increased the number of clients by 16. We are making progress in reducing the waiting list.

Guardian Medical Monitoring – In November 2023, we paid for 38 individuals to have a life-line type of device and/or fall detection devises. This is our maximum number of clients that we can assist at no charge to them.

Lawn Chore – Contractors turned in 26 vouchers related to lawn mowing.

Benzie Bus Senior Rides – In November 2023, we paid for 1,712 regular senior rides. This is an increase of 6.4% for year to date as compared to a year ago.

Information & Assistance - The agency handled 964 calls in November 2023 regarding Information and Assistance for services and questions related to older adults.

Senior Oral Healthcare Program – One invoice was received in November 2023.

Medicare/MMAP's – Our certified MMAP's counselor helped 35 individuals in November at no cost to them.

Foot Care – Three clients received in-home foot care and sixty-six clients attended the BSR foot clinics in November 2023.

Hearing Clinic – Two individuals came in for an evaluation at no cost to them in November 2023.

Estate Planning – Four individuals received services in November 2023 at no cost to them.

Senior Essential Needs Fund – Two individuals received assistance in November for kitchen plumbing and homeowners insurance.

The Gathering Place Senior Center – The Gathering Place Senior Center offered 19 core activities that 735-cumulative number of individuals. **This represents 13% over November 2022.**

In-Home Care Services for November 2023 – Compared to November 2022, we are up in the number of clients and hours by 10%.

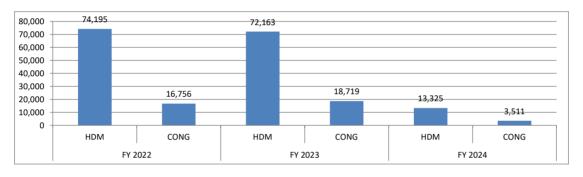

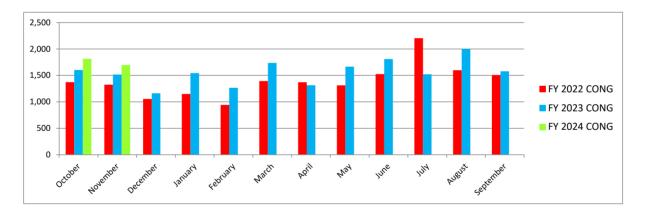

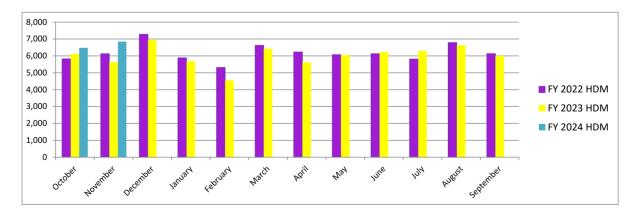

Finance Issues:

Approval of bills December 12, 2023 through January 9, 2024 in the amount of \$1,553,324.30.

Lank Bank Authority:

Demolition occurred at two locations in the Village of Thompsonville, as a part of our Round 1 funding of the Blight Elimination Grant. We have extended the round 1 funding into the spring to include two lots in the Village of Thompsonville that has a burned home that was buried in the basement and grassed over. We are also making plans to renovate the home in the Village of Benzonia, as we received positive information during the inspection for demolition. I believe we will utilize Round 3 funding for this project and will have a home for purchase at <80% AMI.

Treasurer's office:

Auditing is going well so far. They will be completing their audit offsite and will be presenting to you as soon as possible in March.

I am announcing today that I am scheduled to retire on February 29, 2024The position has been posted to fill my position until the end of the year. To continue after that date, one would have to file a petition for election to this office for 2025 and beyond.

With that, it is important to maintain continuity within the office and all other functions, especially financial. I have been mentoring Kelly Long to replace me, should anything come up that requires that. She has a lot of experience and expertise in all aspects of our office and will do well if appointed. The position has been posted, with an end date for accepting applications/resumes the end of January.

Therefore – regardless of who is appointed to county treasurer, there will be a vacancy in our office for either the treasurer or the chief deputy treasurer, and I would respectfully request that you approve additional funding for a person to overlap in our office during the transition period for up to 30 days. It is important to get a good candidate in place and it takes time to teach them all aspects needed for a smooth transition.

Subject: Reallocation of Broadband Funding

At the December 12th study session, the Commissioners discussed the broadband funding allocated by the Board in 2022. It was noted that the funding allocated specifically for a project was more than necessary and that it made sense to allow for flexibility in that funding to work with more than one broadband-related professional.

Benzie County's project manager Mitch Shapiro has indicated the need for a team approach to maximize the next level of funding and growth in the broadband project, and it involves subject matter experts and assistance from local organizations. To do so however, funding for these subject matter experts and local organizations is needed. Mr. Shapiro has previously detailed that the funding allocated for his position is more than adequate to work with others. Mr. Shapiro has further indicated in our various conversations that he believes that funding should come from the funding allocated to himself for his efforts. He believes that for the greater good and success of Benzie County, the initial \$200,000 allocated for a project manager should be given additional flexibility to partner with those who will better serve at this given pivotal point in the broadband project.

As a result of the December 12th study session, the recommendation moving forward is that the remaining funding from the initially allocated \$200,000 for a project manager, be allocated for the administration and support of the broadband expansion initiative, Internet for All, Benzie County. At this current time, there is close to \$170,000 left of the \$200,000. This recommendation would involve an amendment to the current agreement with Mitch Shapiro for his services as well as the authorization of additional partnership agreements with those necessary to carry out the goal. At this given time, agreements with Grow Benzie and Jon Willow of the Community Broadband Action Network are appropriate.

Recommended motion:

That the Board of Commissioners amends their July 26, 2022, motion to allow for flexibility in the allocation of funding for the broadband expansion initiative and authorizes Administration to agree to partnerships with agencies and organizations to maximize its approach in obtaining additional grant funding for broadband expansion and the implementation of a digital equity compass.

This change order has been approved by Friends of Point Betsie for payment and now needs the Board's authorization.

Re: Change Order #5 to Agreement for Point Betsie Shoreline Protection System Design

Dear Ms. Zeits:

This letter sets forth changes to the Agreement dated November 1, 2021, between Benzie County and Barr Engineering Co. (Barr) regarding the Point Betsie Shoreline Protection System (SPS) Design Work Order No. 01.

I. Scope of Services

The scope of professional consulting services we will provide is modified as follows to finalize the permitting process and support re-bidding of the project in spring 2024. This scope does not include services extending beyond bid opening and contractor selection in 2024 such as preparation for construction in 2025 or construction administration in 2025. Barr understands that additional services beyond contractor selection will be performed under a subsequent authorization.

Task 1: Permitting Support

1a: EGLE Permit Negotiation

Based on comments provided by the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) on the permit application submitted for the project in March 2023, modifications to the SPS project design and application are required to facilitate permit approval. This includes the following design changes:

- Reduction in length of the sheet pile/concrete wall on the north end by approximately 30 feet to soften the angle of the northern corner of the SPS
- Reduction in width of the stone toe berm in front of the sheet pile wall to keep project impacts to the lakebed within the footprint of the existing sheet pile groins
- Addition of sand fill and native vegetation plantings on top of the landward half of the stone splash pad to increase vegetative cover at the site

In addition the following EGLE-requested evaluations will be incorporated in the permit application:

- Inclusion of the FEMA floodplain zone limits in the project drawings and evaluation of how the project complies with FEMA floodplain regulations within Lake Michigan
- Evaluation of the project alternative of relocating the lighthouse; this alternative was previously discarded in the Historic Structures Report, EGLE is seeking additional documentation to show why reconstruction of the SPS is more feasible and prudent than relocation

Barr will respond to EGLE's comments with a letter and sketch drawings showing how the project drawings will be updated and the engineering rationale for the extents of the proposed revisions.

The engineering rationale for the required minimum width of the stone toe berm is assumed to require completion of wave overtopping calculations for several potential configurations to demonstrate how the minimum width provides the design level of protection for the structure. Similarly, the rationale for the reduction in length of the north SPS extents is assumed to require reference to previously-performed calculations to show the amount of reduction that can be accommodated without increasing overtopping.

The letter will also include the additional evaluations for FEMA floodplain compliance and relocation analysis. The evaluation of lighthouse relocation is assumed to require an estimate of the potential minimum relocation distance that would be required to address shoreline protection concerns, based on historic shoreline progression analysis previously performed in the Historic Structures Report. Based on this estimated relocation distance, Barr will prepare a qualitative assessment of impacts from such a relocation, including impacts to critical dune habitat, property ownership, historic structures, aesthetic/recreational considerations, and order-of-magnitude costs. The Friends have requested comment from the Michigan State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) regarding historic preservation considerations that will inform Barr's assessment. A complete alternatives analysis and detailed cost estimates for this alternative will not be performed.

The expected schedule is to provide this letter to EGLE by January 2, 2024, in advance of the EGLE Special Exception Panel meeting on January 8, 2024allowing for revised permit application submittal to be made by the following Special Exception Panel meeting in late January. Additional follow-up communication with EGLE may be required after the panel review meeting and application re-submittal is not recommended until consensus is reached with EGLE. If needed, a second round of communication with EGLE (second letter submittal) is included in this scope of work.

1b: Revised Permit Application Submittal

Following agreement on modifications to the project with EGLE, Barr will prepare revised "re-issued for permitting" design drawings for review by Benzie County and the Friends as well as an updated permit application containing required impact quantity tables. This includes revisions to the north end of the SPS to update grading, impact footprints, and impact quantities. The revised drawings and impact quantities will be based on the modifications to the north end of the SPS, the stone toe berm, and sand fill and plantings on the stone splash pad. Barr will submit the revised permit application on behalf of Benzie County and the Friends; no additional application fees are anticipated.

1c: Additional Permit Coordination

Agency permit review process submittal may require additional correspondence with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and SHPO. Barr will provide updated design drawings to USACE and SHPO, and we will respond to questions or provide additional information to the agencies. We have provided an allowance of up to 40 hours for permitting support during the permit review period.

Task 1 Deliverables

- Letter to EGLE detailing proposed revisions to the project design and other evaluations
- Drawing package (re-issued for permit electronic submittal)
- Revised permit application (electronic submittal)

Task 1 Assumptions

- Up to two rounds of coordination discussions with EGLE may be required to reach agreement on project design modifications
- Evaluation of changes to the stone toe berm will not include changes to the design water level or design wave event for the structure
- Evaluation of FEMA floodplain compliance will include documentation of FEMA floodplain locations and confirmation that the proposed fill will not support a structure or increase the risk of flooding; no project changes will be required
- A detailed cost estimate for lighthouse relocation will not be prepared under this scope of work; published reference costs for relocation of similar structures will be used to estimate the order of magnitude cost of a relocation
- A single round of drawing revisions will be required following agreement with EGLE on project design changes

Task 2: Movement/Vibration Monitoring Plan

During construction the project will require monitoring for movement and vibration impacts to the lighthouse and nearby structures. The previously-issued specifications for the project describe a vibration and displacement monitoring plan that will be provided to the contractor detailing vibration and displacement limits the contractor must adhere to. Barr will prepare the monitoring plan and design a monitoring program with sensor selection and limits based on previously-collected site survey and structural inspection data. The monitoring plan will be included with the re-issued project specifications as an attachment for reference by the contractor.

Task 2 Deliverables

• Structure movement and vibration monitoring plan for inclusion in the bid package

Task 2 Assumptions

- Monitoring plan will be based on the proposed project design and structure pre-condition survey completed by Barr in June 2023
- No additional field data collection will be performed under this scope of work

Task 3: Preliminary Sediment Chemistry Testing

The project specifications require contractors to test excavated or dredged material for potential contaminants prior to placement in fill areas including the U.S. Coast Guard property adjacent to the Light Station property. This testing is required by the Coast Guard in order to accept the placement of fill on federal property. To reduce uncertainty and provide contractors with baseline information on sediment chemistry, Barr will collect three grab samples of lake-bed sediment from areas targeted for excavation using a hand auger and send to a certified laboratory for the chemical testing required by the State of Michigan for dredged materials. This testing will not replace the requirement in the contractor specifications for testing of excavated material during or just prior to construction. Barr will summarize the testing results in a memo and table to be included in the revised bid package for contractor information.

Task 3 Deliverables

• Sediment chemistry test results and technical memorandum for inclusion in the bid package

Task 3 Assumptions

- Three samples will be collected by hand auger to approximately 5-foot depth from the Lake Michigan shoreline in areas proposed for excavation
- Weather conditions allow for safe shoreline access for wading collection of sediment samples
- Samples will be analyzed for parameters required in EGLE Water Resources Division Policy and Procedure WRD-048, "Sediment Testing for Dredging Projects", excluding particle size analysis (material assumed to be lake sand/gravel)

Task 4: Bidding Support

This task includes preparing and issuing bidding documents and review of contractor bid submittals for re-bidding the project in spring 2024.

4a: Project Coordination

Barr will hold meetings with Benzie County, the Friends, and other project stakeholders to coordinate modifications to the project in advance of re-bidding in spring 2024. This includes an allowance of up to 40 hours for project coordination during this period. This is expected to include the following issues

- Access coordination for potential storage and laydown areas on M22 and in Frankfort
- Coordination with the Benzie County Road Commission for sequencing of construction between the SPS and Road End projects and potential construction efficiencies
- Communication with neighboring land owners, including the U.S. Coast Guard, regarding access and traffic control provisions
- Review by the U.S. Coast Guard of the proposed revegetation plan
- Coordination with SHPO regarding the required coloration of proposed armor stone and splash pad stone to determine whether more cost-effective stone sources are acceptable

4b: Bid Package Revision

Following issuance of EGLE and USACE permits, Barr will revise the issued for bidding construction documents (drawings, technical specifications, and front-end contract documents). The revision will incorporate feedback from contractors received and addenda issued during the 2023 bidding process, address comments or requirements from the permitting agencies, and reflect adjustments for coordination with the Road End Project.

4c: Bidding assistance

Barr will assist Benzie County and the Friends in the bidding process in spring 2024 by issuing and administering bid documents online, conducting a single on-site pre-bid meeting, responding to questions from contractors, issuing addenda to the construction RFP as required, and reviewing bid submittals. Following receipt of bids, we will participate in up to two contractor interviews via online teleconference, if requested, and in a single bid review meeting with Benzie County and the Friends.

Subject: Parole/Probation Remodel

The Board of Commissioners approved an agreement with Environment Architects to assist Administration with the long-awaited remodel of Parole/Probation. During that process, I met with the Parole/Probation folks and Ray Kendra of Environment Architects to develop a plan for moving forward with ah remodel. As part of this process, Mr. Kendra offered his expertise in estimated pricing and what he believes is the most economical way to move forward. Mr. Kendra proposed that because of the small nature of this remodel, it may be most cost effective to consider authorizing an addendum to the current construction contract with Grand Traverse Construction to simply move over to our building. I proposed this idea to the Buildings and Grounds committee which had a great discussion as to the pros and cons of doing this.

The Buildings and Grounds committee agreed to move forward with obtaining pricing from Grand Traverse Construction as an addendum to their current contract. They further agreed that if the pricing comes in within 10% of the estimated cost, they will support moving forward with the addendum and forego and RFP.

Concern was raised that a violation of policy may occur. However, as part of our purchasing procedure and policy we specifically note that Administration in cooperation with the Board of Commissioners, may adjust, amend, or provide an exclusion in order to effectuate a better, more efficient, and more competitive purchasing plan. Benzie County has hired a subject matter expert in the construction field through a competitive process and has done its due diligence to utilize public funds and resources in the most effective manner.

I anticipate a number from Grand Traverse Construction by close of business, Friday, January 5th and will provide that to the Board in advance of the meeting.

Motions to consider:

That the Board of Commissioners authorizes an addendum to the construction contract with Grand Traverse Construction to include the Parole and Probation Remodel, with funds available in the Capital Fund.

Or

That the Board of Commissioners asks Administration to work with consultants to draft an RFP for construction to remodel Parole and Probation.

The reclassification results have been completed for the following positions in the District Court:

- District/Probate Court Clerk
- Deputy Probate Register/District Court Specialist
- Court Reporter/Deputy Magistrate
- Probation Officer/Collections Specialist/Clerk

District/Probate Court Clerk's factor evaluation scored a Grade 4, Step 3 on the General scale. The proposed wage increase for this position would be to \$21.13 an hour; an increase of \$5,673.65 for the remainder of the 23/24 fiscal year.

Deputy Probate Register/District Court Specialist's factor evaluation scored as a Grade 5, Step 3 on the General Scale. The proposed wage increase for this position would be to \$22.41 an hour, an increase of \$4,339.40 for the remainder of the 23/24 fiscal year.

Court Reporter/Deputy Magistrate's factor evaluation scored as a Grade 3, Step 3 on the Administrative/Confidential/Technical (ACT) Scale. The proposed wage increase for this position would be to \$53.726.40, an increase of \$8,515.92 for the remainder of the 23/24 fiscal year.

Probation Officer/Collections Specialist/Clerk's factor evaluation scored as a Grade 5, Step 1 on the ACT scale. The proposed wage increase for this position would be to \$55,681.60, an increase of \$4,891.27 for the remainder of the 23/24 fiscal year.

The combined increases for the remainder of the 23/24 fiscal year would be \$23,420.23 to come from the contingency fund, as discussed at budgeting. District Court employees previously had no pay scale, the pay was determined based on the Court's discretion. This pay increase will contribute to our employees' longevity and provide the employee with anticipation of future earnings.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Board of Commissioners approves the wage increases for the above-listed positions and the County Administrator to complete the Budget Adjustment of \$23,420.23 from contingency to the corresponding wage line with the wage increases to take effect on January 21, 2024, with no step increases to occur until the 24/25 fiscal year on each of the employee's anniversary.

Hello Benzie Commissioners,

The Benzie Broadband Task Force is seeking personal or anecdotal information from community members on their broadband needs. We know there are a lot of folks who have expressed needs, vented frustrations, etc. and we want to capture what we can in the coming few weeks. We're interested in details such as business names, specific roads, or general geographic areas with connectivity challenges.

This is not a meeting request but an effort to create an easy channel for sharing insights. Any information provided will be treated confidentially. No pressure if you have nothing to share, but we also want to provide an outlet for you to pass on information and support your constituency.

For context and to provide a brief update: In the next 1-3 months, a break-out group from the Broadband Task Force will be involved in a state-wide mapping initiative, aiming to analyze data on cable installation and potentially challenging state data on coverage (BEAD Mapping Challenge). Unfortunately, we will only have a 30-day window to challenge and we are still waiting on federal and state agencies to agree on the maps and release them (likely later this month or by ~Feb 1). Aquatic Impacts: Learning & Monitoring

2023 marks my seventh year at the Benzie Conservation District, and it was full of personal growth and collaboration. I have made new connections with many natural resource professionals, volunteers, and educators who are all motivated to become better stewards and educators for our region.

So far this year, I have connected with over 200 young minds at six education events. These were put on in association with several local organizations, such as the annual "Leave No Trace" field trip with Benzie County



Schools, Riverside Canoes, and the National Park Service; the "Walkabout" with the Crystal Lake & Watershed Association; and the Congregational Summer Assembly's "Ecology Fun" program.

This summer, I attended two educational professional development workshops at Inland Seas Education Association (ISEA) and Grass River Natural Area. These inspiring sessions led the Benzie Conservation District to host two professional development events of our own. The first was an aquatic plant identifying workshop with Dr. Jo Latimore from MSU Extension. The second event was **Michigan Environmental Education** Curriculum Support (MEECS) for area educators, held at the new Homestead Hills Elementary School and hosted in partnership with ISEA and Benzie Central Schools.

This summer also marked our fifth year of water quality monitoring with the Huron-Manistee National Forest Partnership Agreement. Using

the techniques of the Cooperative Lakes Monitoring Program, we have sampled on many of our county's underserved lakes and supported established lake associations in data collection. This year, we monitored Lime and Ransom Lakes, which are two of Almira Township's more natural and scenic lakes and had previously been underserved. So far over the five years, we have monitored 22 inland lakes in Benzie County and continue to assist area lake associations with ongoing monitoring. Our goal is to equip more stakeholders with training and tools to watch and care for our county's incredible water resources.

Next year, I am eager to continue to create an inventory of baseline data for every Benzie lake, and to expand and deepen the network of professionals and public interested in caring for Benzie's lakes.

I am truly grateful to be able to work with many amazing people and to serve Benzie County.

Water Quality Monitoring Expands with Lake Biologist Position

Benzie County is famous for our abundant water resources. Among the crowning jewels in our county is the 10,000 acres of sparkling clear water that stretches from Beulah to Point Betsie: Crystal Lake.

This year, the Crystal Lake & Watershed Association (CLWA) partnered with us to make the Benzie Conservation District's Conservation Specialist, John Ransom, the new Lake Biologist for Crystal Lake. This position was created to better protect Crystal Lake against uncertainty and a growing list of threats, such as runoff and salt concentrations. In addition, the Lake Biologist serves as the go-to person for members of the CLWA and the public to contact with questions or concerns about Crystal Lake.

The first year of this position has focused on two objectives: developing a robust water quality database, and supporting the monitoring program with routine data collection. These goals will help the CLWA and the Benzie Conservation District to better understand the status of the lake and to track changes over time.

In support of these goals, John led a team of summer interns (pictured right) to complete an algae survey on Crystal Lake's shoreline and to collect monthly nutrient samples throughout the Crystal Lake watershed. The information gathered during this most recent field season will appear in the database along with historic data, which can be collectively analyzed to make informed decisions about Crystal Lake's water quality needs and priorities. This winter, John will finalize the database with Dr. Ray Canale, who developed a similar database for the Platte River watershed.

From over 50 inland lakes to hundreds of miles of rivers and streams, Benzie County's surface waters are an important part of life in Northwest Michigan. Riparians and CLWA members can contact John for a site visit to discuss conservation practices on their property or to help identify a potential issue on the lake. *In addition, residents and visitors are encouraged to contact the Benzie Conservation District with any type of conservation question*. By starting these conversations, we can work together to preserve and enhance the health of Benzie County's treasured ecosystems.

Hemlock Woolly Adelgid Treatments

2023 saw a huge undertaking for the Northwest Michigan Invasive Species Network (ISN) that wasn't on the books at the start of the year: hemlock woolly adelgid (HWA). This microscopic invasive insect finds itself a place at the base of a hemlock needle, where it can insert a sucker mouthpiece and steal nutrients from the tree. A prolific spreader, HWA can kill trees in about 5–10 years, which gives time for treatments!

HWA was discovered at Crystal Downs Country Club by ISN's Habitat Management Specialist and HWA Survey Technician towards the end of January. From there, response times went into overdrive. Partners from Mason-Lake Conservation District journeyed north, where they helped ISN conduct detailed surveys and treatments throughout the year to try and contain this infestation.

By the end of September 2023, Mason-Lake and ISN had treated over 7,000 hemlocks in the immediate infestation area. Unfortunately, since that first detection, three more detections have been discovered in the Frankfort area. It's suspected that a large vehicle may have brought the original infestation into Crystal Downs by brushing against a hemlock overhanging the road, after brushing against an infested hemlock elsewhere. ISN is asking that landowners, especially in the Frankfort area, keep an eye out for HWA. If you suspect you've seen HWA, please contact ISN's Invasive Species Specialist, Zach Seguin at zseguin@ habitatmatters.org.

Regenerative Farming in Benzie County

The Lindgren Family farm holds a prominent and well-established reputation in Benzie County and for several compelling reasons. One of the key highlights of this event was delving into the details of their rotational systems, revealing why this humane and regenerative approach to beef production holds the promise of a brighter agricultural future. It is truly refreshing to witness this ideal regenerative model right in the heart of Benzie County.

Keeping Michigan Produce Safe

The Michigan On-Farm Produce Safety Program (MIOFPS) provides free education and technical assistance via Produce Safety Technicians (PST) who are housed at select Conservation Districts throughout the state of Michigan. Produce safety is the practice in which produce items, specifically fruits and vegetables that are typically consumed raw, are managed with the intention of reducing the risk of pathogens and foodborne illness. Growers can receive confidential, free support by connecting with a PST for a variety of services, such as individualized on-farm technical assistance and training, and the Michigan Produce Safety Risk Assessment tool and certificate. Benzie County has a range of fresh produce grown, and anyone who grows and sells fresh produce is eligible to participate in MIOFPS.

There genuinely is no catch and no hidden costs. In fact, growers may save money by participating in cost-share programs, where the PST can help pay for specific items to aid the grower's progress towards produce safety. In 2024, the MIOFPS Team will continue offering education and promoting produce safety throughout the state.

The Bear Lake Service Center of the USDA Natural Resources **Conservation Service (NRCS)** saw a productive year with the implementation of many conservation practices on private land, with contracts ranging from one to five years in length on average. NRCS programs support private landowner conservation projects, such as planting trees and pollinator habitat, managing brush and treating invasive species, helping farmers with various conservation efforts such as the installation of high tunnels and cover crops, and more. The funding for these programs for the last five years came from the 2018 Farm Bill, and future funding will come from future Farm Bills. Bear Lake services both Manistee and Benzie Counties.

Benzie County farmers, both beginning and established, participated in NRCS programs this year for cattle farming and crop production, which included fruit, vegetables, and livestock feed. Beginning farmers are those that have been farming for less than ten years. Many of the beginning farmers are producing market vegetables, and some are even producing flowers for sale at markets and roadside stands. Let's take a closer look at a couple of Benzie County beginning farmers.

Ken's Farm LLC is a beginning farmer and just completed installation of his first practice, which was the high tunnel (hoop house). He also has a few other practices to install over the next few years, including brush management and cover crops. His farm has been slowly growing over the years and his hoop house has been developing, too. He started out with a homemade hoop house, and in September 2023, he had a Nifty Hoops one installed that is 30 feet by 72 feet covering 2,160 square feet. NRCS did a costshare for the installation of the high tunnel to help offset the initial cost to the beginning farmer.

There are a few things that the client/farmer needs to adhere to during and after signing an NRCS contract. In Ken's case, his contract requires him to maintain the high tunnel practice for five years. He also must use it only for growing crops and not as a storage facility or anything else. Ken is very excited about the potential of producing crops earlier and longer with his hoop house, since it has a double layer roof and various ventilation methods to control the temperature.

Our next beginning farmer is Gabby from Bendon Blossoms. They have owned their property for three years and have been a client of NRCS for a couple years now. They have installed a few different practices, including brush management for invasive species, crop rotation, and a high tunnel. Their high tunnel is from Farmers Friend, and like Ken, they received cost-share for the installation of their high tunnel. It has been installed for over 6 months.

Gabby loves having the high tunnel since it allows her to overwinter flowers, giving her an early start to the growing season. An early start also means a longer growing season. Gabby stated that the flowers start blooming in April with the hoop house.

Both Gabby and Ken state that the process of applying for an NRCS contract was easy and that the office staff are great with communication and helping with any questions that they had. Gabby said the one-on-one walkthrough with NRCS was fantastic! She gave NRCS a "10 out of 10," saying, "they made it easy, and we got everything that we wanted." Ken is ready to do more and states, "who wouldn't want to do the costshare?"

Native Planting with Go Beyond Beauty

Go Beyond Beauty is a program that supports garden professionals and community members who commit to not using or selling high priority ornamental invasive species. This program began with the Invasive Species Network (ISN), and as of 2022, now operates statewide.

This year, in ISN's four-county service area, Go Beyond Beauty gained 12 new community participants and one new Nursery! We also had our most successful Japanese Barberry Trade-Up Days yet—where 683 invasive barberries were traded in for coupons to participating Go Beyond Beauty businesses over three events in Benzie, Grand Traverse, and Manistee Counties, double the amount collected in 2022. Shelly Stusick, Go Beyond Beauty Specialist, put on and attended many other events, but none quite as large as the Native Plant Expo in Ann Arbor this past June. With over 2,000 attendees milling about, she was a speaker and tabled the event. Some other notable occasions were her NotMISpecies webinar (offered by the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy) and two MLive articles highlighting or mentioning Go Beyond Beauty.

On the statewide front, two official partnerships were solidified, creating two new Go Beyond Beauty Hubs: Central Michigan CISMA and CAKE CISMA. This means Go Beyond Beauty is now offered in 15 Michigan counties!

Two summer field members: AmeriCorps VISTA Program

Aquatic Invasive Species Pathways Program: Michigan Invasive Species Grant Program, funded through the Quality of Life Departments: Department of Natural Resources; Department of Agricultural and Rural Development; and Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy. This program was also supported by contributions from the Grand Traverse Long Lake Foundation and from Benzie County Townships: Almira, Benzonia, Blaine, Crystal Lake, Homestead and Lake.

Through a diverse array of programs and services, we collaborate on a holistic approach for preserving and enhancing all types of local environments.

Aquatic Invasive Species Pathways Program (AISPP)

- With 60 volunteers, provided free boat decontamination and education at 15 lakes throughout 4 Northern Michigan counties.
- Throughout 38 events, worked with 1,985 launch site users to survey 703 boats, and decontaminated 389 that were determined to be potential transporters of aquatic invasive species.
- Surveyed 25 lake access sites for aquatic invasive species.

Educational outreach

1. Connecting with landowners for site visits

The majority of what I do is speak with landowners during one-on-one onsite property visits. These can be powerful conversations that have the potential to bring a lot of change to the landscape, and now that my second year as District Forester has wrapped up, I've been able to witness some of my landowners' efforts as I drive around the region.

Nothing brings me joy quite like seeing a field of well-planted seedlings in their tree tubes, or a cleared patch of autumn olive, or an American Tree Farm sign proudly displayed by someone's driveway. Each of these observations brings me validation to what I do, and helps confirm that these site visits are truly an impactful resource in empowering landowners to exercise good forest stewardship.

As you move forward in your own land management actions, please consider keeping me updated on any progress (or setbacks!). I appreciate any time someone lets me learn alongside them as it just helps me be a better resource for the community in the long term.

2. Building connections through professional development

As an early career professional myself, I find strengthening my technical skills and my relationships to partnering individuals and organizations to be the two most important ways to stay relevant in my job. Something I realized early on as I romped around my three counties is that I get to work with some amazing groups, but those folks don't often get to associate with each other in person.

To increase collaboration and connection between folks, I started organizing Botanizing Hikes, which are educational and networking opportunities for natural resource professionals. Each event has a co-hosting organization, a topic tied to plant identification, and a new public area to explore together. I've done these with Grand Traverse Regional Land Conservancy (GTRLC) at their Hickory Forest property (discussing spring ephemerals this past May) and Lower Woodcock Lake (identifying wetland indicator species this past fall); Grand Traverse Conservation District at Timbers Recreation Area (advising on bud and bark identification for woody species); and Benzie Conservation District for a botanizing float on Little Platte Lake (where Dr. Jo Latimore helped us with submerged aquatics).

I have numerous ideas for next year's topics, and I look forward to continuing this series and observing how it helps keep our region's environmental organizations engaged with one another.

3. Hosting educational activities and workshops

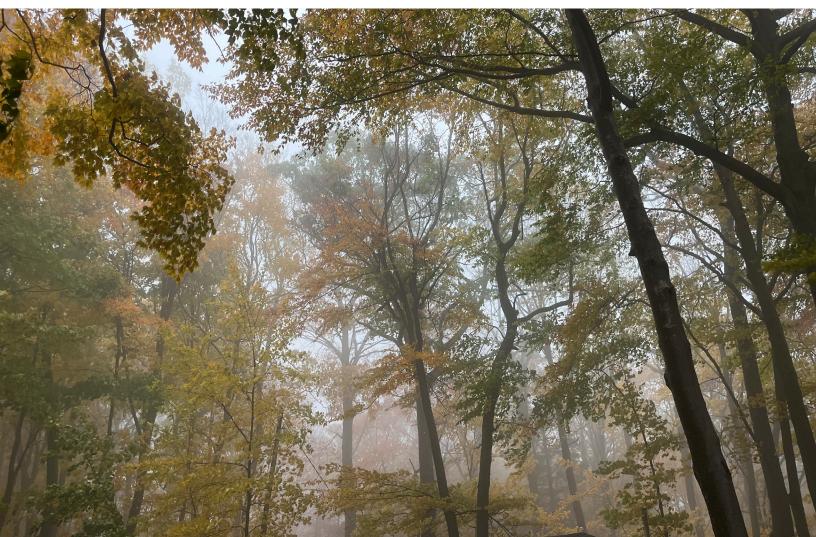
