➔ Spring Forward

➔ Delinquent Utilities



Any account for village provided utilities (water, sewer, trash) that are 6 months delinquent and unpaid by June 1st, 2022 will be assessed to village property taxes.

Low Income Household Water Assistance



The Village of Cassopolis has enrolled in Southwest Michigan Community Action Agency's Low Income Household Water Assistance Program. This program assists with water and waste water arrearages for eligible clients living in the Village of Cassopolis. Direct payment assistance for water and wastewater utilities may be available for residents at or below 150% Federal Poverty Level and currently receiving one or more of: TANF, SSI, SER, or FAP/SNAP. Michigan Homeowner Assistance Fund (MIHAF)



The Homeowner Assistance Fund was established to mitigate hardships associated with the coronavirus pandemic by providing funds to prevent homeowner mortgage delinquencies, defaults, foreclosure, loss of utilities or home energy services and displacements of homeowners experiencing financial hardship. The U.S. Department of the Treasury allocated \$242,812,277 to the Michigan Homeowner Assistance Fund (MIHAF).

Who Is Eligible?

- Homeowners with household incomes less than 150% of Area Median Income (AMI)
- Homeowners who own and occupy the property as their primary residence
- Homeowners must have and explain a financial hardship directly related to COVID-19 on or after January 21, 2020.

Up to \$25,000 Grant Per Household to Pay:

- Delinquent property taxes
- Delinquent homeowner's insurance,
- Delinquent land contract payments, mobile home consumer loan payments
- Delinquent utilities, gas, electric, water, sewer, internet broadband
