

## NOTICE: Water Service Material Inspection

The Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) requires public water suppliers to inventory the existing water service line materials within their system to eliminate lead water services. To do this, a sample of customer service lines has been selected for inspection.



The City of Albion was awarded a grant from EGLE to inspect 355 of the 2,811 services. Inspections include uncovering the water service to visually inspect, photograph, and document the service line material. Inspections include visually identifying the water service within 18 inches of the building. The diagram shows the locations required for inspection.

Letters have been sent to residents and businesses whose water services have been randomly selected for inspection.

South Michigan Food Bank received \$10,000 from the Fund for Greater Albion to purchase fresh food for Albion residents. This grant will help with the costs of produce and pantry staples for a year.

## **Grant Round One Recipients**

The American Red Cross of Southwest Michigan received \$2,500 for "Blood Saves Lives" project from the Fund for Greater Albion. This funding will support the cost of two community blood drives to be held in Albion.

Play Right Sports Academy received \$3,000 from the Kingsley Fund and \$2,500 from the Youth Fund. These grants will support after-school programming for Albion's youth.

Substance Abuse Prevention Services received \$2,750 from the Youth Fund. This grant will help fund "Strong Families, Safe Children" focused on giving Albion families opportunities to explore Albion.

These grants will support STEM Saturdays Everywhere, a monthly program to give children hands-on STEM activities in Calhoun County.

The Youth Advisory Committee (YAC) has been hard at work in 2023 with monthly meetings including reviewing grant applications for two grant rounds. They have been learning about philanthropy, decision making, and how to make an impact.

## The Renovation of the Victory Park **Bandshell**

In an effort to improve the parks through the Christie and Tony de Nicola Dobbins Family Foundation, and Caster Cares, the bandshell is getting a face lift.

Built in 1941, the bandshell is an unofficial historic landmark. It is an iconic part of our community and home to Swingin' at the Shell.

An approximately \$110,000 renovation is under way to make repairs and improvements to the bandshell. The structure has been power wash and repaired, along with a fresh coat of paint. Channeling 1941, the bandshell is going all white with the iconic sculptures gold. In efforts to make the location a more accessible venue, concrete paths are paved throughout the lawn for easier access to seating closer to the action.

The project should be completed by mid-July for the first Swingin' at the Shell concert on Sunday, July 23rd at 6PM with Phillip Michael Scales kicking off the summer series.
