COUNCILMEMBER BATES: That is not consistent with what Ms. Konoian informed me in that it was mechanical only and residential combination.

MR. ENTSMINGER: Okay. Well, the fax that I got from them says "both categories."

COUNCILMEMBER BATES: And in my conversation with her, I referenced this letter that she wrote and I said, "Could you please define for me what 'both categories' means?" And she informed me mechanical and residential combination.

I asked her for a definition of residential combination; she said anything dealing with residential. I asked her for a definition of mechanical; she said commercial mechanical.

That is what's listed on the ICC web site as of 4 o'clock this afternoon. I can't give you anymore than what she provided me when I called her.

MR. ENTSMINGER: Well, I think Ms. Fleming got a thing from DCA which shows the categories.

And then whatever the remainder are, my understanding is the City's already got an outside consulting building inspector, and as long as they've got somebody who can do the remainder of the codes, then you're covered.

So would that be helpful?

COUNCILMEMBER SPANGLER: Well, Mr. Weed, I thought you had already done the research and you've already discovered what qualifications he does have.

ATTORNEY WEED: No, sir, that's not accurate.

What I had done was I was asked to confirm whether or not -- at the point that I was brought into this, to determine underneath Georgia law if he was a qualified inspector underneath the definition. I did that and issued an opinion.

Now he is in my opinion a qualified inspector underneath Georgia law. But what I didn't know -- and I sent an e-mail out to the Council about this -- was with regard to 8-2-20, which items Chuck is already qualified to do and which ones we might have to get a third party to do.

COUNCILMEMBER FLEMING: It does list them in alpha code, though I do not know what the codes are. And based on the DCA codes from

Dekalb County, Mr. Entsminger has more certification than does anybody else.

So I was unclear about what those initials meant, but I printed out the definitions of them also because that's one of the things I looked at was the DCA web site also.

And by that, I mean to say in Section 8-2-20, there's the listing of what are the minimum state codes relevant to -- I think what we care about would be Subsection B(i), and then with regard to that with the codes, Chuck maybe can tell us, you know, which ones he already is certified for.


