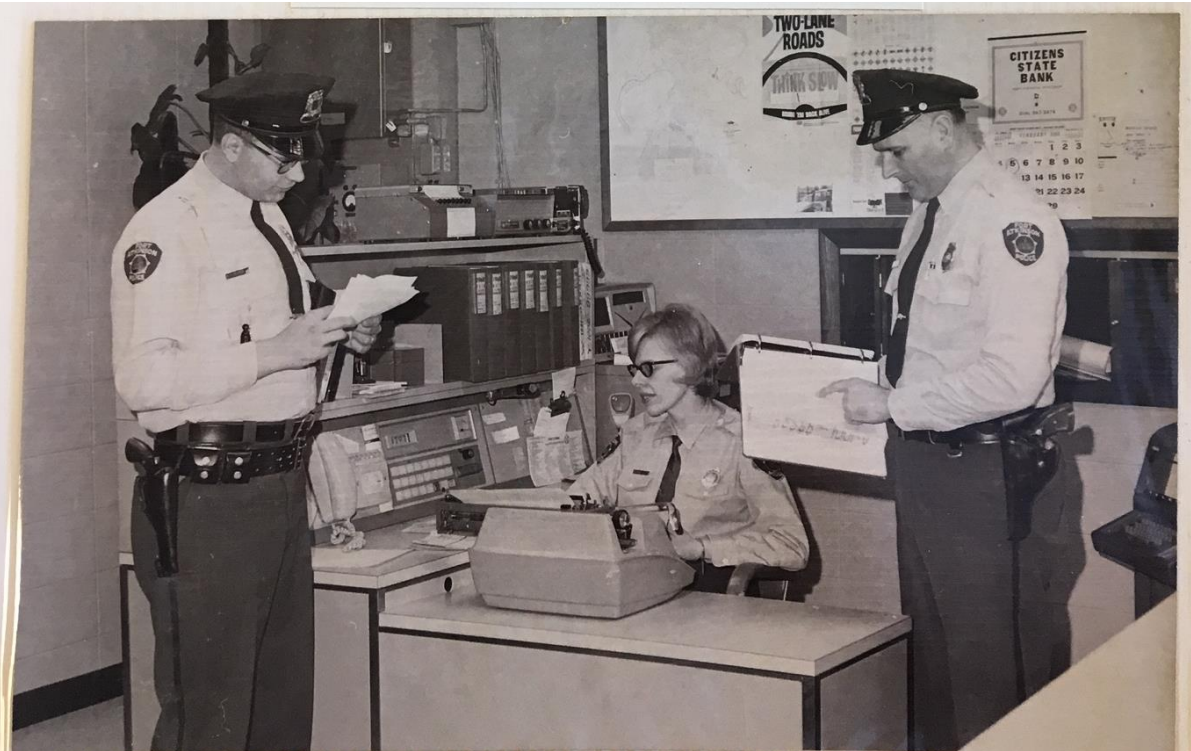

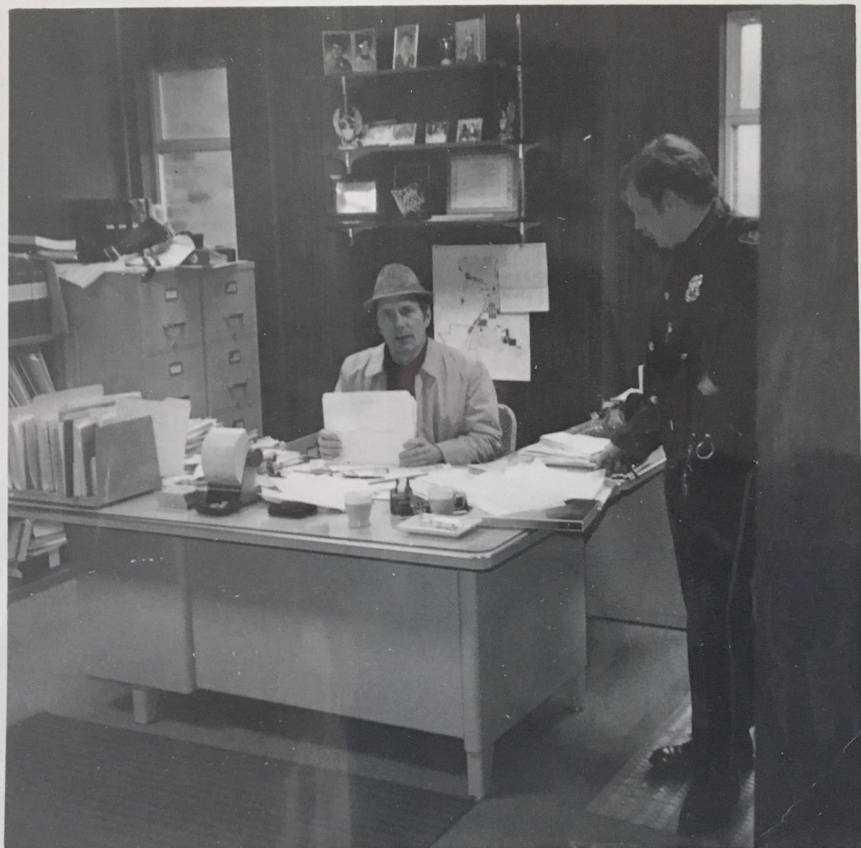
YOUR POLICE CALLS ARE BEING RECORDED — Del Hedding (left), juvenile officer of the Fort Atkinson police department, and Police Chief William Ciske were pictured looking over the department's new "logging tape recorder system." This apparatus has been installed to record all incoming and outgoing telephone calls and radio transmissions at the police station. Records of these calls are kept on tape for at least a month to provide proof of calls made and can be played back to clarify emergency calls. The total cost of this recorder was \$6,000, with the federal government paying 75 per cent through its Omnibus Crime Bill. Hereafter, those calling the police department any time of the day or night should remember they are on "candid telephone."—Daily Union Staff Photo.

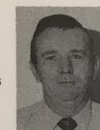

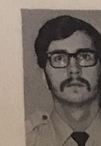

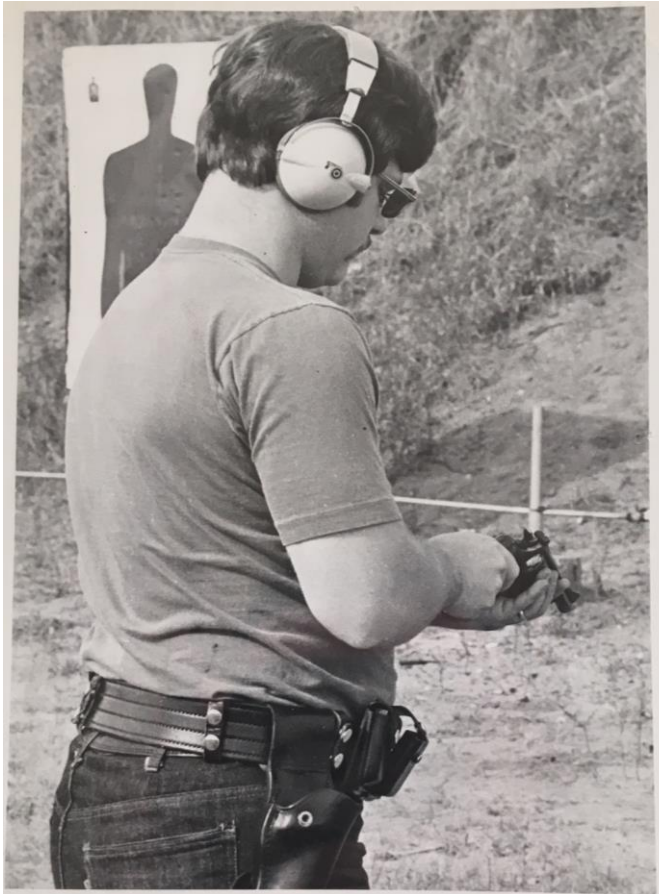

FORT ATKINSON POLICE SHARPEN THEIR PISTOL FIRING EYES—One of the requirements of being an officer with the Fort Atkinson police department is regular target practice at the police range located on the Wisconsin club grounds in Rock River park. This picture shows Patrolman Fritz Piepenbrok, 519 High st., firing off a quick series of rounds at a routine practice this week. All officers, including Chief William Ciske, must qualify with a score of at least 80 per cent. According to Ciske, a program is being set up to have the personnel qualify every two weeks; that will include night firing, shotgun firing, and firing under varying conditions. The local department has spent considerable time and money improving the range and plans to do still more work on it. This week, all off duty and on duty officers turned out for the qualifying.

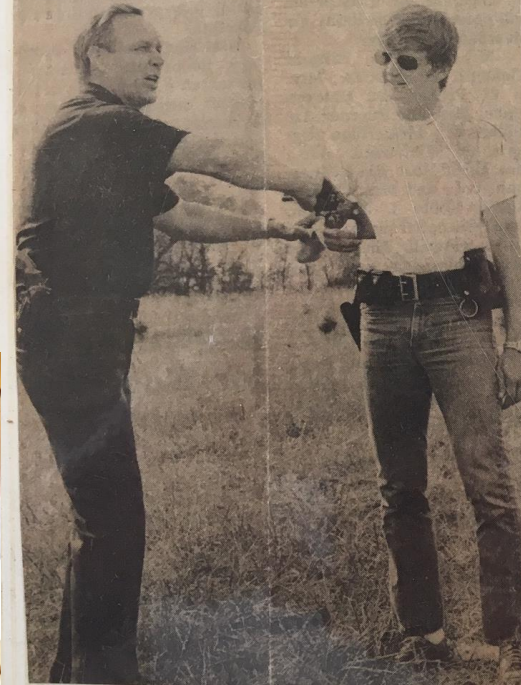

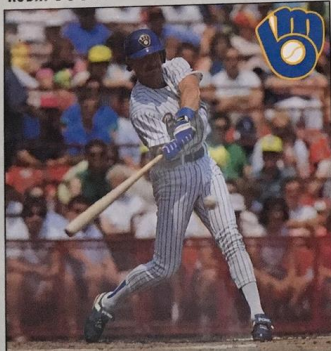
To Improve Fort Atkinson's Protection
