## From The Desk Of The Mayor



Dear residents, neighbors and friends:

During this time of year when we transition from autumn to winter, the change is evident. The village has been busy changing the look of some areas of the village. We are focusing on streets that need repair and have targeted abandoned buildings that are an eyesore to the community. By the end of this year, the Village will have completed demolishing several buildings, including seven residential properties, and repaved many major streets. Some before and after pictures of the demolitions and pictures of the street repair projects are documented within this edition of The Villager.

The Village will soon look brighter. We will replace street lights with LED lighting throughout the Village. LED lighting is much brighter than the lighting currently used in Hazel Crest. The LED Street Light Replacement Program is funded by a grant from Commonwealth Edison. And finally, construction will begin this month on the Metra Station (at 170th & Park Avenue). Completion of the \$3 million-dollar renovation is due by the summer of 2018.

I would like to remind everyone to review the calendar of events the Village has scheduled for the rest of the year. Village staff works hard to provide activities for residents of all ages to participate in and enjoy. So please come out, bring your family, friends and neighbors to enjoy all the activities provided for our wonderful community.

Plan to bring your family to the Community Health and Information Day event at the Village Hall on Saturday, October 28 beginning at 10:00 a.m. All the health screenings and services are free – and there will be valuable information and an opportunity to sign up for assistance programs.

## **Open House For Fire Prevention Week**

The health and safety of residents is the number one priority for firefighters and rescue personnel. With this point in mind, the Hazel Crest Department of Fire & Rescue hosts an Open House at the fire station (2903 W. 175 th Street) in observance of Fire Prevention Week Hazel Crest firefighters welcomed visitors on October 7 for tips and live demonstrations on ways to avoid fires and other dangers. This year's open house included a demonstration of vehicle extracation in the event of an accident and the apparent difference in a home with a sprinkler system versus a home without one.



The structure on the left burned for quite some time, while the one on the right was extinguished almost immediately as the Hazel Crest Fire Department demonstrated the benefit of having a sprinkler system in place in the event of a fire.



### Metra Station Renovation

Plan review is underway and work will soon begin to renovate Hazel Crest Metra Station. Village staff attended a meeting in September with Metra staff and contractor representatives from the Bowa Group to discuss the reported \$3 million dollar project that includes replacement of the street level depot and new elevator. Details are forthcoming about a ground breaking ceremony at 170th and Park Avenue.

## Happy Birthday Johnny Appleseed

Johnny Appleseed, born John Chapman on September 26, 1774, collected apple seeds from cider presses, carried them into the frontier and established apple orchards. This was important for settlers who arrived at the frontier (known as western Pennsylvania, Ohio and Indiana) to find apples which could supplement heir diet in the form of fruit and cider. Members of the Open Lands Commission hosted the annual celebration on September 23 with stories and a tour of the open land area. There were even guests introduced as descendants of Johnny Appleseed. Of course, the celebration would not have been complete without the menu of apples, apple cider and apple pie.

The Village has 12 volunteer boards and commissions composed of residents appointed by the Village Board who have special expertise and are committed to maintaining the standards of Hazel Crest. Many decisions made by Village Government are based upon the recommendations of these boards and commissions. This summer, Village Clerk Isaac Wiseman administered the oath of office to new and returning members of the following commissions:

#### Adjudication Commission

On call

Oversees the local adjudication courts for non-moving traffic violations and for property code violations.

#### The Beautification Commission

Meets 1st Monday, 6:30 p.m., at the Fire Station (2903 W. 175 th Street) Promotes the beautification of residential and commercial properties within the community and to promote the use and care of trees throughout the Village and maintain our Tree City USA Designation.

#### The Board of Fire & Police Commissioners

Meets 2nd Wednesday, 2:00 p.m., at the Fire Station (2903 W. 175 th) Tests, appoints, and handles general disciplinary matters of personnel within the Police and Fire Departments.

#### The Clergy Commission

Meets 3rd Thursday, 6:30 p.m., at the Fire Station (2903 W. 175 th) Plans activities and programs; serves as an advocate and acts as a broker of information to residents.

#### The Community Relations Commission

Meets 1st Thursday 5:30 p.m., at the Fire Station (2903 W. 175 th) Maintains positive relations among all persons living and working within the Village of Hazel Crest and hosts village events.

#### Economic Development Commission

Meets 2nd Monday, 7:00 p.m., at Village Hall (West Meeting Room) Unites stakeholders within the community for the purpose of creating and supporting jobs, businesses and institutions that positively impact the region.

#### Finance Commission

Meets 3rd Wednesday, 6:00 p.m., at the Village Hall (Board Room) Provides financial oversight and ensures transparency. Duties also include budgeting and financial planning, financial reporting, creating and/or monitoring of internal controls and accountability policies.

Meets 2nd Monday, 6:30 p.m., at the Fire Station (2903 W. 175 th) Works to develop, improve and beautify the Village's Open Lands areas.

#### Planning & Zoning Commission

Meets 2nd Wednesday, 6:30 p.m., at Village Hall (Board Room) Monitors and updates the Comprehensive Development Planning and Zoning ordinances for the Village and conducts public hearings on zoning classifications and variances.

#### Senior Commission

Meets 2nd Wednesday, 5:00 p.m., at the Fire Station (2903 W. 175 th) Tracks senior activities and programs offered by the private sector and townships; acts as a broker of information to residents.

#### South Suburban Mass Transportation Commission

Meets Wednesday (after 1st Thursday), 7:00 p.m., (Flossmoor Offices)

A regional board made up of representatives from 16 municipalities that oversees operation of some commuter parking lots along Metra's Electric Line.

#### Youth Commission

Meets 2nd Thursday, 7:00 p.m., at Village Hall (West Meeting Room) Plans activities and programs for Village youth; acts as a broker of information to residents.

#### Veterans Commission

Meets 1st Wednesday, 7:00 p.m., at the Fire Station (2903 W. 175th) Plans activities and programs in honor of the veterans; serves to advocate on behalf of residents who serve/served in the United States Military.

### Inspectional Services: Demolition Update

FAST TRACK DEMOLITION:

Six delegated residential properties were tagged as part of the Fast Track Demolition process where owners have not taken care of the houses. The insurance carrier paid to demolish 17047 Head. (See above before-and-after photos). There are five remaining to demolish through the Fast Track Demolition process. Bechstein Construction was selected through an RFP bid to demolish the remaining properties this fall. (See remaining five below).

**Public Works Is Working For You** 

Information & Dates To Keep In Mind

Composting Ends Saturday December 9, 2017 (weather permitting)

Tree Removal & Tree Trimming will take place during the winter months Snow Plowing Reminders:

- Vehicles should be removed from the street after a snowfall of 2" or more (so snow plows can effectively reach the entire width of the street for snow removal).
- It is impossible to avoid pushing snow into private driveways when plowing. To avoid frustration, please wait until Public Works has cleared the roadway of snow before finishing the end of your driveway. (The Village will not clear snow from private driveways).
- Keep children safe. To avoid injury, teach youngsters to stay a safe distance away from the edge of the roadway to avoid contact with the snowplow.
  - 4. Do not deposit snow into the street as it may freeze and cause a danger to drivers and emergency responders.
- Set your garbage cans away from the roadway on snow days (after snowfall of 2" or more); remember to retrieve cans as soon as they are emptied to avoid clutter.
  - Inspect your curbside mailbox for proper construction and placement away from the curb. Posts should be of 4' X 4" durability and strength. (The Village is not liable for mailboxes damaged during snow plowing).

Public Works takes great pride in the jobs we do quickly and safely. It is our goal to serve to the best of our ability in the short time needed before residents need to get to work, school and daily activities. Village Trick-or-Treat hours are 3:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.

Please comply with the following tips to ensure children have a fun and safe Halloween.

Children younger than 12 should trick-or-treat with an adult. Cross streets at corners following traffic signals and using crosswalks.

> Look left, right and left again when crossing the street. Walk – DON'T RUN – across the street.

Teach children not to cross between parked cars and never dart out into the street.

Watch for cars that are backing up or turning.

Children younger than 12 should not be out at night without adult supervision. Children older than 12 who are mature enough to be out without an adult should trick-or- treat in groups and stick to familiar, well lit areas.

When selecting a costume, make sure it is the correct size to prevent tripping and falling.

Decorate costumes and bags with reflective tape or stickers and, if possible, choose light colors.

Choose face paint and makeup whenever possible instead of using masks that can obstruct a child's vision.

Have children carry glow sticks or flashlights to help them see and be seen by drivers.

Check treats for signs of tampering before allowing children to eat them.

Remind children to eat only treats in the original, unopened wrappers.


