President's Letter

Dear Residents,

As Spring approaches, I hope you have noticed that chair the next forum which will not only is the weather improving, but so is Hazel Crest. The dedication, planning and hard work of the Village of Hazel Crest staff, Village Trustees, Commission members and volunteers are making a difference. Economic development is on the rise with the recent and future openings of more than a dozen new businesses, including a new Burger King at 183rd & Kedzie, Teddy's Meat Market at 175th & Kedzie, Prosperity Tax Consulting at 17505 Kedzie (just in time for tax season, and Bionic Prosthetics. In the next few weeks and months we will see grand openings for Anytime Fitness (a 24-hour fitness center) in the Commons Plaza at 183rd & Kedzie next to Dollar Tree. Pricilla's Ultimate Soul Food Café at 3840 W. 183rd Street, Wired Designer Boutique at 17509 S. Kedzie and Hollywood Beauty Supply at 17500 S. Kedzie, to name a few. Please continue to shop Hazel Crest to support our economic growth because the more sales tax we generate, the less property taxes we pay.

Despite having repayed, repaired or replaced over 25% of the Village streets in the recent years, the construction season will begin again this Spring so we can maintain all roads impacted by the continuous truck and car traffic. Residents in the Highland subdivision should be on alert for the signs of construction on Birchwood, Central and Maple and in the Pacesetter subdivision, residents should be aware that the paving of Grandview will start soon. While temporarily inconvenient, it is a long-term improvement in safety and aesthetics, in addition to eliminating annoying potholes and dips. Travelers down 183rd Street may have noticed the brighter LED lights that were installed from Pulaski to Kedzie, which are part of a program to install village wide as part of an energy and cost saving grant program through the State of Illinois.

Hazel Crest is developing a job training program for young people entering the workforce in partnership with neighboring communities, local businesses, colleges, elected officials and religious leaders. This work is being done through an initiative called Peace With A Purpose. as developed by the South Suburban Regional Mayoral Black Caucus (SSRMBC). As Vice

President of SSRMBC, I will be held at Governor's State University. This will be the third forum and the parties will continue developing strategies to move the Southland Region forward by providing good paying jobs, quality education, and safe, stable communities. There is much work to be done. but we are up to the challenge and are optimistic about the economic future of Hazel Crest and the south Cook County.

Priscilla's Soul Food Cafe Is Now Open!





Long Term Strategic Planning Meeting

Every successful organization examines itself to establish where they are and where they want to be in five years (or longer) to make sure they are on the right track. Whether a formal or informal process by governments, businesses or individuals, long term strategic planning is important to fulfilling a core mission.

The Village hosted a Long Term Strategic Planning meeting on Tuesday, January 17, 6:00 PM at the village hall. Lester McCarroll, Jr. served as facilitator of the meeting, which was designed as an open forum for the public to participate. Mr. McCarroll explained the ongoing process to compile and analyze data and community input to draft operational initiatives and examine priorities of the village. The first part of the process is data collection. In addition to the initial forum held January 17th, one-on-one interviews have been conducted with residents, business owners and village officials. Scheduling for the next round of interviews is underway and will include residents, village staff and other key persons in the community.

Mr. McCarroll urged residents to give their input because it is important for the direction of the village. By participating in this process and by attending the village board meetings, residents remain engaged in the happenings and have their voices heard. Some of the areas of thought are:

1. Consider a successful 5 year run by the village. What do things look like for the Village of Hazel Crest from your point of view? (Use the following categories to evaluate your thoughts):

Infrastructure: Roads, water, gas, lighting and electricity, utilities housing, food, health, internet connectivity, communications.

Safety and Security: Protection from the elements, disaster recovery, security, order, law, stability, freedom from fear.

Collaboration, Belonging, and Community: Ways to build relationships and bonds between people, families, singles, neighbors, community members, businesses, surrounding villages, etc. Creating a feeling of belonging and support among residents and people who do business or work in the village.

Achievement: Environment for Education, Careers, Job Opportunities, Entrepreneurship, Entertainment, Recreation, Recognition, Economic Development

Self-Actualization and Improvement: Efforts and opportunities for improvement of the village, things in place for residents and businesses to improve and reach their full potential. Data, planning, analysis, etc.

- 2. What are the Village of Hazel Crest's key internal strengths and challenges, and most important opportunities and threats from outside the village?
- 3. Name one short term and one long term priority for the Village of Hazel Crest.

Safe Medication Disposal Tips From The USDA

The Village of Hazel Crest has a **Medication Disposal For Safer Communities Program** Residents can dispose their unwanted or outdated medication in a "Medication Disposal Container" located in the lobby of the Village Municipal Building located at 3000 W. 170th Place. When was the last time you cleaned out your household supply of over-thecounter (OTC) medicines? Just like the dosing instructions and additional information on the label, the expiration date on the packaging is there for reason. Once a medicine has reached its expiration date, it may not provide the treatment that

you need. To ensure the medicines you take are both safe and effective, keep an eye on the expiration dates and safely dispose of any expired or unwanted medicines. In-home disposal of all OTCs is safe and convenient—here's how to do it! Follow these simple steps from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to dispose of OTCs in your household trash: Mix medicines (do not crush tablets or capsules) with an unpalatable substance such as kitty litter or used coffee grounds. Place the mixture in a container such as a sealed plastic bag. Throw the container in your household trash.

^{*} Brush must be placed neatly and accessible along the curb BEFORE 8:00 AM on each scheduled Monday.

^{*} Vehicles must be removed from the street between 7:00 AM and 4:00 PM during the scheduled week of street sweeping.

- Obtain building permits prior to starting renovations

- Park vehicles on the driveway and not the grass
- Make sure that vehicles can operate under its own power
- Prohibit your dog from barking at night or for excessive periods of time
- Clean up after your pets
- Store excess trash and debris in approved containers
- Keep you grass cut on a regular basis; do not let it exceed five inches
- In winter, keep sidewalks free of snow and ice build up
- Be considerate of the time, close your doors/windows, and keep music at reasonable levels

Public Works Saves The Day (And Our Basements)

On the evening of Tuesday, February 28th, the Village of Hazel Crest was hit by a series of severe thunderstorms that dropped several inches of rain in a short amount of time, as well as several rounds of hail that caused some low-lying areas of the village to flood. Village Manager Donna Gayden and Public Works Director Jeff Hon drove around the entire village to assist residents and the village employees

who worked all night to clear drains, rescue stranded motorists, and respond to emergency calls. The Village encourages residents to prepare an emergency plan ahead of the next bad storm. And reminds to never drive through a flooded roadway -- it only takes six inches of water to reach the bottom of a car and possibly stall an engine.

What's A Buffalo Box?

Every building has a Buffalo Box event if you don't know what it is. Originating in Buffalo, New York (hence the name), the Buffalo Box is the shut off valve between individual homes or businesses and the main water line owned and maintained by the village. Public Works employees must frequently repair Buffalo Boxes to allow them to quickly stop the flow of water in case of an emergency, just as the NICOR or ComEd can turn off utilities from outside a building.





The Buffalo Box is almost always located in the parkway between the street and sidewalk along with other buried utilities, making access difficult and repair workspace tight. Before any construction or home repair effort begin, homeowners and contractors are always required to call J.U.L.I.E. (811) to mark the location of these utility lines to avoid damage and injury to the workers. Avoiding the water line itself, other utilities, trees, streetlights and sidewalks requires a skilled operator of a backhoe along with a "Top Man" to serve as a safety person behind the backhoe and "Bottom Man" working in the ground to make the repairs.
