A WORD FROM OUR PRESIDENT

Dear fellow Hazel Crest residents, neighbors and friends:

As we move from spring to summer, I feel a renewed commitment to serving the community. The Village Board now consists of a new Village Clerk, Isaac Wiseman, and two new Village Trustees, Marlon Rias (former Village Clerk) and Java Rogers who join Trustees Mary Grant, Kevin Moore, Ben Ramsey, and Sandra Slayton. I welcome these new board members to our team and look forward to the work we will do.

If you have not visited the Hazel Crest Village Hall lately, come by and look at our new landscaping. The old bushes and grass are gone, replaced by a new fresh look. Kudos to our Public Works Department and Karl Persons who led the design of the new landscaping at the Village Hall. Also, I would like to acknowledge the six teens who provided much of the hands-on work, along with Karl and Public Works staff, to make the beautiful transformation of the Village Hall landscape.

The Village Board of Trustees, Village Clerk, and I extend special thanks to 38th Legislative District State Representative Al Riley. He sponsored a youth education initiative program that paid for the six Hazel Crest teens to do community work within the Village.

We are expanding youth programs this summer. In addition to the six teens sponsored through the education initiative, we have hired teens for summer work with the Public Works Department and in the Village Hall. We have resumed the Village President's Summer Bridge Program for youth in 7th, 8th, and 9th grades. The six-week summer program, that focuses on English, Math, and Science, is designed to assist students in making successful transitions into junior high and high school. We have also initiated the Youth Intern Policing Program, a paid internship for Hazel Crest college students who are interested in pursuing careers in law enforcement.

Hazel Crest celebrated the 4th of July with the Hazel Crest Village Board and the Village of Hazel Crest Park District partnering to provide the fireworks show for our residents. This was the first time in more than 20 years that the Village of Hazel Crest has had fireworks on the actual 4th of July holiday. Hundreds of residents, families and friends from neighboring communities came out to watch the fireworks display. The Village Board of Trustees, Village Clerk and I would like to thank the Village of Hazel Crest Park District Commissioners and Board President for their cooperation and partnership in celebrating the birthday of our nation's democracy.

Join us for the upcoming events, like the Annual Hazelnut Festival that is expanding to three days this year – August 4, 5 & 6. On Friday, August 4, we will kick off the festival with a carnival from 5:00 pm to 9:00 pm. Saturday, August 5, at 8:00 am, the Hazel Crest Police Department, will feature a 5K Run/Walk/Bike Ride Against Violence. The 5K Run/Walk/Bike event will be followed at noon by the Hazelnut Parade. Later Saturday at 4:00 pm, we will have our first King and Queen Chicken Wing Cook Off with judging for best wings, followed by musical entertainment featuring the Intruders and Delfonics Revue. This year's Hazelnut Festival will end Sunday August 6, with the carnival, comedy, Jazz and Gospel music. I look forward to seeing you all there.

We have a very active and exciting summer planned, so please look for other events and activities included in this edition of The Villager and add them to your calendars.

Finally, the Village Board, staff and I will continue to make all residents Hazel Crest Proud!

RULES & CRITERIA

- No obvious artificial flowers
- Minimal weeds (including driveway)
- Avoid overuse of pots
- Edging in place
- Shrubs trimmed and maintained
- Color around the sides of the house as well
- If different colored rocks are used, the different colored areas maintained
- Grass mowed and in good shape
- House maintained- no peeling paint, hanging gutters, etc.
- Hoses and other tools neatly contained- generally out of sight
- No vegetation growing out of gutters

The Village of Hazel Crest Presents The Village President's Bridge Program

The 2017 rendition of the Village President's Summer Bridge program facilitated by Academic CDC will feature the theme "Hidden Figures", based on the massively popular movie of the same name. The six week program will consist of 3 days of academic instruction and 2 days of enrichment/community involvement projects geared toward preparing incoming seventh and eighth grade students for their respective new grades. This year's program will include a unifying



theme challenging students to see connections between the curriculum and real life. For instance, Math instruction will be centered around the topics of problem solving, geometry, and concepts in algebra, all the while exploring the role Math plays in Astronomy. Reading instruction will place a heavy emphasis on writing, starting with basic concepts such as simple and compound sentences and progressing to the point at which students will be able to write a synopsis on the film Hidden Figures.

Students will also read the novel Hidden Figures and answer comprehensive questions. Participants will also be introduced to the MLA (Modern Language Association) format of writing. The Science portion of the curriculum will consist of a study of planetary properties, volcanology, gravity and rockets, and the study of the moon. The lesson format will feature a heavy emphasis on engaging, hands on activities. And Finally, we've added a TV Production component where students will gain an understanding of the role and responsibilities in the production management, digital video and/or television. This class focuses on such topics as the stages of production and the roles of each crew member, including producer, director, assistant director, editor, camera operator, script supervisor and audio attendant.



This year's Bridge program is poised to build on the promise of all three previous years, inviting students to embrace a lifelong love of learning and preparing them for the challenges ahead in the coming school year and beyond!



The Village is petitioning to tear down six residential properties through the Fast Track Demolition Process. Fast Track Demolition is typically reserved for extremely distressed properties where the owners have not come forward to challenge the petition.

The benefits of the Fast Track Demolition Ordinance, authorized by 65 ILCS 5/11-31-1 are:

-authorizes the Village to board up, repair, or demolish residential and commercial buildings -- three stories or less in height -- that are vacant, open, and constitute a hazard to the community.

-provides that all owners/interested parties of record are notified and given an opportunity to board, repair, or demolish the structure. If they fail to properly respond, the Village may take action --- meaning we may demolish

-allows the Village to avoid time-consuming & costly process of seeking a court ordered demolition

We used this process last year to tear down the abandoned commercial buildings along 170th in The Proper, as well as the former house at 3201 Fountainbleau. Many of you may soon see these bright reddish orange signs posted on properties. These signs serve as the official notice of our intent to demolish the building.

Benefits or the success metrics of Fast Track Demolition include:

1. Increased revenues
2. Increased compliance
3. Reducing the "spillover" effort to neighboring properties and thereby stabilizing properties values and possibly increasing property values
4. Crime reduction
5. Fostering neighborhood pride
6. Recapturing the value of vacant properties
7. Improved quality of life for residents
8. Reduction in homeowner's insurance for property owners
9. Increased investment in the community
