# **The Vernard L. Alsberry Jr. Municipal Center Opens**

The former Hazel Crest Professional Office Park building, located at 3601 W. 183rd Street, is the site of the new village hall. The Village purchased the building last year from the South Suburban Land Bank & Development Authority. Design plans to retrofit and renovate the space were presented to, and approved by, the Village Board of Trustees before holding a groundbreaking ceremony last October. The Architect for this redevelopment was Revere Properties, Ujamaa Construction served as Construction Manager and IRH Developments was the Project Manager.

The new village hall is located along 183rd Street, which makes it easily accessible by car and those on public transportation. It boasts updated state-of-the-art space for Building & Inspectional Services, Community & Business Relations, Economic Development, Human Resources, Water, Public Works Administrative Support, village elected officials, banquet and meeting facilities. Police Department personnel and Public Works crew remain at the former village hall location (3000 W. 170th Place) where senior citizen activities and community events are still held.

# Census 2020: Be Counted

It is vital that everyone participate in the 2020 Census. If we are not all counted, our communities will get fewer federal resources.

We stand to lose one billion of your federal tax dollars to other states, if you or your neighbors go uncounted. For each person not counted, we lose an average of \$14,000 over the next ten years. Losing this funding would mean drastic cuts to more than 100 critical programs, including Medicaid, federal student loans, and highway funding. We could also lose two Congressional seats, which means reduced representation in Washington D.C.

So, it's imperative that we are all counted. Representation, services and federal dollars are on the line.

As a reminder, there is no citizenship question on the Census. Likewise, federal law requires that Census information remain confidential and individual records cannot be used by anyone, including law enforcement.

We encourage everyone to share this information with family, friends and neighbors. Please urge them to be counted. Help them fill out the form. Show them how to use the webform. Do anything and everything you can to spread the word about the importance of the Census. The impact the Census has on our federal investment will last for more than a decade, so it's critical that everyone is counted. For more information, log on to www.census.gov.

### VILLAGE VEHICLE STICKERS

Village Stickers will be available to purchase starting Monday, December 2nd. Stickers must be purchased and displayed on or before January 31, 2020 to avoid a penalty. Starting February 1<sup>st</sup>, a late fee of an additional \$10 per sticker will be imposed. Starting March 1<sup>st</sup>, a late fee of an additional \$45 per sticker will be imposed.

ALL vehicles registered to a Hazel Crest address require a sticker, even those not operative. Vehicles registered without displaying a valid sticker are subject to fines. For more information, including different vehicle fees, log on to www. villageofhazelcrest.org.

#### Improvements on the Horizon at Mobile Home Park

The Village is working with the new owners of the mobile home park, located at 16902 Dixie Highway, on efforts



to improve the area. Impact Mobile Homes (formerly Horizon RV Mobile Homes) has submitted a plan to the Inspectional Services Department that divided the project into three phases:

1. Demolition & replacement of 14 of the mobile units (as pictured) - *completed this Summer* 

2. Remove trees that pose a threat (falling onto units & root interference with gas line) - *set for Fall* 

3. Safety improvements (i.e. new lighting and fencing around the mobile home park) - *planned for Spring*
