Advocate South Suburban Hospital to Expand & Modernize

Over the next two years, the public will see lots of activity on the campus of Advocate South Suburban Hospital (17800 Kedzie Avenue). The hospital is set to undergo a \$97,630,432 expansion and modernization project. Plans include replacing the 45-year old surgical suite with nine larger, technologically advanced operating rooms and three cardiac catheterization labs. Expanded preparation and recovery rooms will serve inpatients, outpatients and their families. Modernization of the existing procedure suite will include five endoscopy and bronchoscopy rooms to serve an increasing aging population that needs timely outpatient diagnostic and therapeutic care. After the expansion, Advocate plans to use vacated space for non-clinical functions including medical staff and administration offices, educational classrooms, and materials management. Project completion is expected by the end of 2021.

Advocate, the largest healthcare system in Illinois, took over South Suburban Hospital in 1971 providing service to the residents of Hazel Crest and the surrounding community.

DOCUMENTS NEEDED TO APPLY:

- Proof of current 30-day gross income from all household members.
- Copy of most recent heat and electric bills if you pay for your home energy directly. (Must provide entire bill)
- Proof of Social Security Numbers of all household members (Hard-copy of Social Security cards, printout from the Social Security Administration or any other form of government-issued identification that shows both name and Social Security number.)
- If a member of your household receives TANF, you must bring their Medical Eligibility Card
- Applicants that have their utilities included in the rent must bring proof of rental agreement stating monthly rental amount, that utilities are included, and landlord contact information. (Rent costs must be greater than 30% of current household 30day gross income).
- FOR FURNACE ASSISTANCE Proof of property ownership (two of the following): Current property tax bill, Mortgage billing statement or mortgage payment book, (Quit Claim Deed along with a Mortgage Statement).
 - Vehicle Title (for mobile homes only).

Inspectional Services Recommends: Winter Home Maintenance & Preventive Care

Housing experts recommend developing a system where you inspect one area of your home, per season, to ensure regular inspection of each area. The following list of areas to check may help:

- Check for water leaks
- Have a heating professional check your heating system each year
- Purchase a new -or- test your emergency generator
- Have chimney inspected, clean flues & check fireplace damper
- Inspect & clean dust from the covers of your smoke & carbon monoxide alarms
- Make sure caulking around doors & windows is adequate to reduce heat loss
- Keep firewood at least 20 feet away from your home
- Acquaint responsible family member(s) with the gas main valve & other appliance valves
- Clean the exhaust duct on the clothes dryer, damper and area under the dryer
- Clean the kitchen exhaust hood & air filter
- Check your water heater
- Check water hoses on the washer machine, refrigerator icemaker, and dishwasher for cracks
- Test your sump pump
- Test all AFCI and GFCI devices

Building & Inspectional Services staff remind residents that regular home maintenance and preventive care is less stressful and often less expensive than to pay for unexpected repair bills. As always, Building & Inspectional Services will answer question you may have. Walk-in hours are 8:00am to 4:30pm, Monday through Friday or call 708-335-9600 X700.

Be In Compliance

- Pet licenses go on sale on May 1, 2019. Residents may purchase pet licenses at the Village Hall front desk. Cost = \$5 (for each pet). The pet's rabies certificate must be presented at time of purchase.
- Renewal Season is Fast Approaching for Business Owners, Contractors & Property Owners/Residents. Renewal notices are mailed in March for business permits, contractor registration & alarm permits. Make sure to return all appropriate documents to Building & Inspectional Services for processing.



Hazel Crest Receives Energy Efficiency Award

The Village received recognition from Commonwealth Edison for its energy savings in relation to the installation of LED street lights throughout the village. On December 6th, representatives from Com Ed (pictured on stage L to R with Mayor Alsberry: Lisa Aprati, Michael Fountain, and Bonita Parker) presented Hazel Crest with an incentive check in the amount of \$203,358.00 as part of its Energy Efficiency Program. The money reflects the amount the village has saved since installing LED street lights in 2018.

ABC IL Offers Apprenticeship Training Program

Congratulations to the students who recently graduated from the Associated Builders & Contractors Illinois Chapter's Community Builders Program. The ten students (pictured) were part of a 12-week training course to learn core construction & carpentry. Staff with Associated Builders & Contractors (aka ABC IL) was set to start classes for the training program when they hit a snag with the site where classes were to be held. Village officials found out about the issue and immediately arranged for the classes to be held at the Hazel Crest Family Center (16990 Dixie Highway).

From November 5, 2018 through this past January 2019, Community Builder trainees learned skills and benefitted from hands-on training. The space at

the Family Center is large enough to accommodate the structures students built.

"We are excited to bring our Community Builders Program to Hazel Crest and hope to receive additional funding that will allow us to continue training and assisting with employment placements in construction for the residents of the Hazel Crest Community," said ABC IL President & CEO Alicia Martin.

The training program, funded through a grant from the Illinois Department of Commerce & Economic Opportunity, provides individuals the opportunity to learn an in-demand construction craft and follows through with career placements. Participants may enroll in the program with no experience in the industry and leave with a career pathway in construction making better than average wages along with opportunities for upward mobility.

ABC gets participants through the Workforceboard.org (click on American Job Centers). ABC specifically resources for public assistance recipients (people who are unemployed, parolees, people receiving SNAP, those working with a case manager at the state Department of Human Services or receiving TANF) because those individuals would receive their tuition, books and lab fees at no cost. Workforce Development Director Shoshiwa Shields said the training program is open to anyone with an interest. "The main thing that will allow an individual to be successful is their desire."

The Foundation recognizes government entities or community-based organizations for conservation efforts such as tree planting and care, Arbor Day celebrations, education, community projects and roadside beautification. Work in the Open Lands Area of the Village (along Kedzie Avenue between 171st and 172nd Street) is the subject of the award nomination. Village elected officials and staff joined owners of Anytime Fitness on January 23rd for its Ribbon Cutting/Grand Opening Ceremony for the newly built facility at 18232 Kedzie. Residents had voiced the fact they wanted a health fitness facility in Hazel Crest (in 2017 during the drafting of a Strategic Plan for the Village). In May of 2017, the village entered into a Tax Increment Financing (*TIF) Redevelopment Agreement with the owners of the strip mall at 182nd & Kedzie to encourage the occupancy of vacant commercial space – namely to build a fitness facility at the mall for Anytime Fitness. Strip mall owners, Anytime Fitness representatives and Village staff worked on a renovation plan for the 7,192 square foot space. In 2018, after completion of the renovation, Anytime Fitness opened its doors for business. Considered a "soft opening", the club welcomed the public into the facility for a first look and to sign up for membership. Residents now have no excuses for getting (and staying) fit. Just like the name says Anytime Fitness is accessible to members 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

*TIF Redevelopment Deal allows commercial property owners to be reimbursed for eligible costs that include such things as architectural fees, construction costs & materials, painting, carpeting and the like, but excluding moveable personal property such as furniture, unattached fixtures and equipment.

Ideas to Recycle · Renew · Reuse

- After changing box of baking soda in refrigerator/freezer, put near trash, then pour down drain. One box lasts for months to deodorize several areas of the home.
- At the movie, buy the large tub of popcorn and share. The larger tub (usually) costs less than two individual orders and saves paper.
- Clean the lint trap after drying each load of clothes, so the dryer doesn't get overworked. Periodically put lint trap under hot water/scrub with a soft brush to clean residue that could catch fire.
- Do not throw away clothes/shoes, appliances/furniture; sell through consignment and/or donate. Help others & receive tax credit for charitable donations (i.e. Goodwill/Salvation Army/Purple Heart).
- Instead of expensive teeth bleaching/whiteners, brush with baking soda then hydrogen peroxide. Baking soda and peroxide is gentler to teeth & gums than bleach.
- Keep empty liquid hand soap dispensers. Purchase large refill bottle to re-fill individual dispensers. Also: use one-part water and three-parts concentrated liquid soap; diluted soap still works.
- Keep old pantyhose to use on the hose of your washing machine. Less lint will go down the drain.
- Turn off faucet while brushing your teeth. (Wet brush to start, turn off water, then turn on to rinse). Over time, this will save water.
- Turn off faucet while soaping down and/or washing hair in the shower. Over time, this will save water and energy used to heat the water.
- Use old socks to dust. Socks make GREAT dust gloves. There is finally a use for socks after losing the mate!

Public Works Has WINTER Reminders for You:

1. Snow Plowing Reminders:

* Remove ALL vehicles from the street after a snowfall of two inches or more (so snow plows can effectively reach the entire width of the street). Police will issue tickets for vehicles left on the street

* It is impossible to avoid pushing snow in front of private driveways when plowing. To avoid frustration, please wait until Public Works has cleared the roadway of snow before finishing the end of your driveway. *Public Works crews will not clear snow from private driveways*.

* Do not shovel/blow snow into streets. It may freeze and cause a danger to drivers and emergency responders.

* Set your garbage cans away from the roadway on snow days (after snowfall of 2" or more); remember to retrieve cans as soon as they are emptied to avoid clutter.

* Inspect your curbside mailbox for proper construction and placement away from the curb. Posts should be of 4' X 4" durability and strength. *The Village is not liable for mailboxes damaged during snow plowing*.

* Keep children safe. Teach them to stay a safe distance away from the edge of the roadway to avoid contact with the snowplow.

2. Tree Removal and Tree Trimming will take place during the winter months.

3. Compost facility is closed during winter. Composting re-opens Wednesday, April 3rd (weather permitting).
