Watch Out for Scams

A call from a resident who was almost the victim of a scam, prompted this warning to senior citizens. NEVER give out your bank information, social security number, or Medicare I-D number to people contacting you on the phone or email. Some common scams are: (1) notification you won a contest but are required to provide personal information and/or a check to secure prize, (2) claim your loved one has an emergency & needs you to wire money, (3) fake IRS email notifying you owe money & instructions how to wire payment or set up bank payment(s), (4) notification you have a virus on your computer & a number to call for assistance. If you are suspicious of call/email/mail you receive, err on the side of caution and consider it a scam.

Federal Grant Awarded For Village's Water System

The Village of Hazel Crest received a \$1.3 million federal grant through the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for work to continue protection and improvement of the village's water system infrastructure. The project is scheduled to break ground in Spring 2020. Be on the lookout for additional information about this project and possible impacts resulting from the associated project construction.

Project Location 2: Maple Lane water main replacement Elm Drive to Linden Drive

Project Location 3: Rear yards behind Poe Avenue 175th Street to 173rd Street

Be Informed

Squatting vs. Trespassing



Trespassing: considered a criminal matter when someone intentionally,

wrongfully enters onto another person's land or property without the owner's permission and without a legal privilege to do so.

Squatting: considered a landlord-tenant matter when someone moves into a vacant or abandoned property, often putting utilities in their name and getting mail at the property address, openly taking possession to reside there for either a short or long term.

Returning home from a vacation to find someone in your home is very different than leaving a property vacant without deed transfer. Real estate agents report they frequently run into squatters when dealing with foreclosures. If the property was not vacant, Illinois criminal law may make it possible for officials to remove squatters. But Illinois law prevents property owners from taking matters into their own hands to recover their property. Call police to remove the uninvited occupant. If the police are unble to remove them, due to squatters rights, the property owner must go through a civil eviction. Consult a real estate attorney to help you navigate the process.

Did You Know?

* Is your toilet running? Take a look inside the tank before you pay a plumber a minimum of \$75 for a service call. Usually a running toilet means the "flapper" at the bottom of the tank isn't closing properly. Sometimes, adjusting the flapper chain or cleaning the seal does the trick, or you might need a new \$5 flapper, which almost anyone can install in five minutes.
