

METRA STATION RENOVATIONS




The renovation for the new Hazel Crest Metra station is underway. On November 29th, Village President Vernard L. Alsberry, trustees and staff were joined by State Representative Will Davis and representatives from Metra for a groundbreaking ceremony. The ceremony marked the start of renovations of the Hazel Crest Metra Station at 170th and Park Avenue. The \$3-million dollar project, funded by Metra's share of proceeds from the state bond program, will be completed this year. Commuters can expect to see a new roof; new glass and lighting in the warming shelters on the platform; a new elevator that is ADA accessible; and, replacement of the street level depot that could be used as a future vendor space. The station will remain open during renovation and construction notices will update commuters of necessary access detours. Completion is expected in the summer.

The Village is geared up to offer another round of the STEAM After School Program presented by Mentoring Youth Through Technology (MYTT). The next eight-week session starts Monday, January 29 at the new Family Community Center, 2000 W. 170th (the corner of 170th & Dixie Highway). STEAM is designed to introduce children to Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math in a way suitable to spark and enhance their interests, including future careers. The children who participate in the Hazel Crest STEAM After School Program presented by MYTT are in a prime position to learn and grow as trail blazers. We want our children's interest in science and math to develop and keep pace with ever-changing innovations. From video games to web design and coding, STEAM allows participants to use their creativity and artistic ability to invent, build and develop in engineering and technology. Although some students may receive an introduction to STEAM in school, the staff of Mentoring Youth Through Technology (MYTT) provides enriching activities resulting in children's budding passion for robotics, coding and the arts. In addition to STEAM, staff wants to see each child develop effective communication, team building and leadership skills during the eight-week session.

This is the second time the Village of Hazel Crest is offering the STEAM After School Program. The first session was held this past fall. At the conclusion of the eight-week session, the children were able to demonstrate the skills they learned by showcasing their completed robotics projects. President Vernard L. Alsberry and members of the Village Board stopped in for a visit to see the class in action and to speak with the children who proudly presented their inventions. The children were excited when representatives from Comcast announced the company's support of the STEAM program to the tune of \$18-thousand dollars. Like the village, the cable company supports educational programming and wants to provide digital literacy for children. MYTT Executive Director Randle Carter thanked Comcast, President Alsberry, the Village Board and staff for supporting the program. He and his staff love to work with children to spark interest in science, technology and engineering through robotics and they look forward to working with children in the next go round.

Happy New Year! As we welcome in 2018, let us reflect on all the major strides we have made in the Village of Hazel Crest during the past year. In 2017, we engaged Hazel Crest residents in activities for families, seniors, youth and our military veterans. We demolished dilapidated homes and buildings and brought new business to our community. The year 2018 brings more community activities, business growth, and major construction to our community. We anticipate completion of the new Hazel Crest Metra Station. Also on the eastside of the Village, the site of the original South Suburban Hospital (171st and Dixie Highway) will undergo rehabilitation to provide office and training space for new businesses that want to



locate into Hazel Crest. These two new construction projects will mark the third enhancement to our eastside along with the 2017 renovation of the new Hazel Crest Community Center (formerly known as Fire Station One). The new community center (at 170 th and Dixie Highway) offers another space to hold village programs and events. Currently, the community center houses our Hazel Crest Community Policing Office and our Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math (STEAM) Program. Speaking of STEAM, I encourage parents to register their children for the STEAM Program. The next session of the after school program begins Monday, January 29.

The eastside is not the only part of the Village that is booming. The year 2018 will see construction and renovation of buildings for new use. We have targeted a building at 3601 W. 183rd Street (the Village West Office Center) to renovate for use as the new Village Hall and Police Station. Completion of the combined Hazel Crest Municipal Center and Police Station is expected in early 2019. In 2018, the Village will continue our street repaving program. A few of the scheduled repaving projects include Edgewater Drive, Central Park, Maple Drive and the completion of 183rd to Pulaski on which we're partnering with the City of Country Club Hills. In closing, the Village Board and I thank you for your support in 2017 and we look forward to serving you in 2018. Please read this first 2018 edition of The Villager. Inside you will find information that will guide you to activities, events dates and times that will assist you in knowing more and enjoying more in our community.

Safety First

- Don't leave your car running while unattended.
- Keep car doors locked and be aware of your surroundings (i.e. while driving, stopping at stop signs/traffic lights, parking, and when getting in and out your car).
- Make sure that you keep your car doors locked while parked; most car thefts are from cars where the owners have left the doors unlocked.
- Make sure that your garage door opener is not left in your car when parked away from your home; you don't want any unexpected visitors.
- Have delivery alerts sent to your phone/email to know when to expect package deliveries.
- Have packages delivered to a neighbor or where you work, if you will not be home to accept delivery.
- Report suspicious subjects and circumstances.
- When going to and coming from your home, be aware of your surroundings.
- Have a buddy system set up with your neighbors. (Look out for one another)!
- It is a felony offense to discharge a firearm. (Remember, what goes up, must come down)!

HOW MUCH DO YOU KNOW ABOUT THE VILLAGE OF HAZEL CREST?

Although many residents have lived a long time in Hazel Crest, many are unaware about village departments, purpose and operations.

- Did you know that in addition to extinguishing fires, our firefighters are also certified paramedics?
- Did you know that one of the main priorities of police is to empower residents against crime?
- Did you know inspections ensure that businesses operate in compliance with the village ordinance, county and state health, building and plumbing codes?
- Did you know that the Public Works crew is outside regardless of weather conditions to construct, maintain, operate and design public infrastructure (i.e. plowing streets, fixing water main breaks, preserving aesthetics which are related to village trees, and green spaces)?
- Did you know that Human Resources handles trainings in addition to managing personnel issues?
- Did you know that the Community & Business Relations Department that coordinates programs/ events, (i.e. Pace Senior Services) works with volunteers, serves as a liason to the village commissions and disseminates information on behalf of the village?

TIPS FOR SAVING ENERGY DURING THE WINTER

In the winter gas and electric bills can be much higher than usual thanks to people turning on their heaters, cranking up thermostats and putting up holiday lights. According to the U-S Department of Energy (DOE), a family spends at least \$2,200 a year on electricity and other utilities and a big part of high cost is from wasted energy during cold months. However, you can save on winter energy costs by making some changes in your home:

Lighting - Improve the lighting in your home and save energy.

Replace traditional light bulbs with compact fluorescent light bulbs, which last between six and 12 times longer. Remember to turn off any lights that aren't in use.

Consider using LED lights which use 90% less energy than standard lights.

Thermostats and Heating - Keep your home warm and comfortable.

Install a programmable thermostat for your home's heating system.

Get a humidifier to add moisture to air. Moist air feels warmer and holds heat better. You can also increase the humidity in your apartment with a collection of house plants.

Frequently change the filters in your furnace.

Set the thermostat on your water heater to 120° Fahrenheit.

General Tips - Be energy efficient throughout your home.

Use the exhaust fan in the kitchen and bathrooms only when necessary.

Repair any water leaks in the bathrooms, kitchen, laundry room, etc.

Use power strips to plug in portable heaters, televisions, and cell phone chargers. That way, you can turn off the power switch when the devices are not in use.

Thinking of replacing your appliances? Look for the Energy Star Logo to indicate products are energy efficient.

Programs for Low-Income Families

There are government programs to help low-income families with their energy bills during the winter. The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program, or LIHEAP, helps families pay some of their heating costs. 

Re: Renewal Notices, Building Permits, Inspections, Property Maintenance & Neighborly Acts

Please be aware renewal season for businesses, contractors and alarm permit holders is approaching. Renewal notices will be mailed March 16, 2018. A return envelope will be included for your convenience. Please make sure all appropriate documents are returned to Inspectional Services office to ensure proper processing.

Building Permits

Please call Inspectional Services at 335-9600, ext. 700, should you have questions regarding the building permit

process. All contractors working in the Village must register with the Village of Hazel Crest before the issuance of building permits.

The reason for having building codes and requiring building permits is to help protect the health, safety and general welfare of the residents, property owners and the public. It provides a way of insuring that contractors adhere to the minimum standards for construction and that the contractor is registered with the Village of Hazel Crest.

Landlords/Property Investors:

All rental properties are required to have an annual rental inspection. Please make sure that all your rental properties have current rental certificates. The Certificate of Occupancy is good for one year from the date of the inspection clearance for the tenant listed on the certificate. Should that tenant move before the expiration date of the certificate, you are required to pay for another inspection before you move in the next tenant.

Note: Point of Sale inspections are required before the transfer of residential property. It is the responsibility of the property owner (or their listing agent) to initiate said inspection.

Residents & Business Owners:

Please make sure that your lawn is maintained at a height no longer than eight inches tall. Tickets are issued for non-compliance. Please make sure your properties are free of debris, garbage cans placed properly on said properties and you adhere to general maintenance of your property.

Treat your neighbors the way you want to be treated. If you see your neighbors' garbage can in the street and you know they don't get home until late or they are sick, then move their garbage can back onto their property. A small act of kindness goes a long way!

CAR AND EMERGENCY CHECKLIST

Are you ready for winter driving? Make an emergency kit to keep in your vehicle:

- Cell phone and portable charger
- Shovel
- Windshield scraper
- Battery-powered radio with extra batteries
- Flashlight with extra batteries
- Water and non-perishable snacks
- Extra hats, coats, and gloves/mittens
- Blankets
- Chains or rope
- Tire chains
- Canned compressed air with sealant for emergency tire repair
- Road salt/sand (and/or kitty litter for traction on ice)
- Booster cables
- Emergency flares
- Bright colored flag or help signs
- First aid kit
- Tool kit
- Road maps
- Compass
- Waterproof matches and a can (to melt snow for water)
- Paper towels





Snow Plowing

- Vehicles should be removed from the street after a snowfall of two inches or more (so snow plows can effectively reach the entire width of the street for snow removal).
- 2. It is impossible to avoid pushing snow into private driveways when plowing. To avoid frustration, please wait until Public Works has cleared the roadway of snow before finishing the end of your driveway. Public Works will not clear snow from private driveways.
- 3. Keep children safe. To avoid injury, teach youngsters to stay a safe distance away from the edge of the roadway to avoid contact with the snowplow.
- 4. Do not deposit snow into the street as it may freeze and cause a danger to drivers and emergency responders.
- 5. Set your garbage cans away from the roadway on snow days (after snowfall of two inches or more); retrieve garbage cans after they are emptied to avoid clutter.
- Inspect your curbside mailbox for proper construction and placement away from the curb. Posts should be four feet tall and four inches thick for durability and strength. The Village is not liable for mailboxes damaged during snow plowing.

Composting

The Compost Facility at 2600 W. 170th Place (California & Kaindl) opens for the season on April 4. Hours of operation: (starting April 4) Wednesdays 8:00am to 4:00pm & Saturdays 10:00am to 4:00pm

Only Hazel Crest residents with valid village sticker may use composting facility, and only grass clippings, leaves & small hedge clippings are accepted. No tree branches accepted.

Brush Pickup begins in April; pick up is scheduled on certain Mondays in 2018:

- pick up is on the following Mondays: 1 – April 2 2 – June 4 3 – August 6

4 – October 1

Zone 1: West of Kedzie Zone 2: from Kedzie to the Overpass – pick up is on the following Mondays: 1 - April

2 - June 11 3 – August 13 4 - October 8

Zone 3: East of the Overpass Brush must be placed neatly – pick up is on the following Mondays:

1 – April 16 2 - June 18 3 – August 20 4 - October 15 and accessible along the curb BEFORE 8:00am on each scheduled Monday. Crews will not circle back to collect brush that was not at the curb by 8:00am
