I am pleased to announce that we have received a clean "unmodified" audit opinion, with "no" findings related to internal controls or compliance. This clean audit exemplifies our commitment to adhering to applicable standards and regulations, showcasing sound financial practices and effective internal controls.

DIGE DATA INFORMED COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

DATA INFORMED COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT (DICE) IN CONTINUED EFFORTS TO DELIVER EQUITABLE POLICING TO HAZEL CREST, OUR POLICE DEPARTMENT PARTNERED WITH SIMSI AND RIPL TO BRING RISK TERRAIN MODELING AND DATA INFORMED COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT (DICE) TO OUR VILLAGE. DICE FOCUSES ON PLACES, NOT ONLY PEOPLE, TO PREVENT CRIME. OUR POLICE DEPARTMENT HOSTED 6 MEETINGS IN 2024. THESE MEETINGS BRING COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDERS TOGETHER AND EMPOWERS EACH OF THEM TO PLAY A ROLE IN CRIME PREVENTION AND RISK MANAGEMENT.

IN THE DICE MEETING, EACH OF STAKEHOLDERS' KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES ARE USED TO APPLY TOWARDS A SOLUTION TO CRIME. THE POLICE DEPARTMENT USES RISK TERRAIN MODELING TO BETTER UNDERSTAND THE ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS THAT ENABLE CRIME TO EMERGE AND PERSIST OVER TIME. RISK TERRAIN MODELING DIFFERS FROM HOT SPOT MAPPING, AS IT IDENTIFIES RISKY AREAS BASED ON QUALITIES OF THE PHYSICAL ENVIRONMENT THAT ARE ATTRACTIVE FOR ILLEGAL BEHAVIOR. COMMON UNDERLYING CAUSES AMONG DIFFERENT LOCATIONS WHERE CRIME OCCURS ARE IDENTIFIED AND RISK NARRATIVES ARE APPLIED TO DISRUPT THE RISK OF CRIMES OCCURRING IN THAT AREA. AN INITIATIVE THAT CAME FROM THESE MEETINGS WAS A CAMPAIGN TO REMIND MOTORISTS TO LOCK THEIR VEHICLE DOORS BEFORE ENTERING ANY BUILDING. POSTER BOARDS WERE DESIGNED AND DISPLAYED IN MOST OF THE BUSINESSES IN TOWN.

A DATA DASHBOARD WAS ESTABLISHED TO HELP SHARE INFORMATION ABOUT THE POLICE DEPARTMENT'S ACTIVITY AS PART OF THE PROCESS OF DISSEMINATING DATA.

Automated License Plate Readers (ALPR) - In February, the police department's Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) policy went into effect. This policy provides officers with guidelines on the proper use and deployment of ALPR devices. Automated License Plate Readers (ALPR) are a high-resolution digital camera with an infrared filter to capture images of vehicle registrations. As vehicles pass through the field of view of the ALPR camera, a picture of the rear of the vehicle is taken, including the license plate. ALPR devices affixed to a pole were purchased from FLOCK SAFETY. This year saw the installation of 3 additional ALPR devices at the locations of Laurel and Kedzie, 175th and Kedzie, and Appletree and 175th street. This brings the total amount of active ALPR devices to 10. 7 ALPR devices are scheduled to be installed in the future.

POLICE CALLS FOR SERVICE - In 2024, the Hazel Crest Police Department responded to 13,486 911 calls and non-emergency incidents that required a police response. Coupled with calls that did not require a police response, the police department fielded 17,363 calls for service. These call types range from traffic stops, premise checks, follow ups, and other self-initiated actions.

The Youth Voices for Violence Prevention Program (YVVP)

The Youth Voices for Violence Prevention (YVVP) program offers a platform for young individuals, aged 13 to 21, to share their stories and perspectives in constructive dialogue, in a participant-sensitive setting, with a diverse audience of community stakeholders, including educators, law enforcement, business owners, social service providers, public officials and local residents. Their voices will inform and improve policies, programs, and practices that impact youth and family development across the Southland. The program is sponsored by Hazel Crest Village President Vernard Alsberry, Police Chief Mitchell Davis, and the Cook County Southland Juvenile Justice Council (SJJC).

During the first year of the program, we accomplished the following:

- Hosted 4 YVVP listening sessions to date.
- Engaged 9 student panelists to share life experiences and aspirations to a broad audience of stakeholders.
- Students provided insights to 34 individuals representing a range of entities from the community; including social workers, mental health providers and clinicians, youth and family program leaders, homeowners association representatives and other area residents, educators, village staff, elected officials, and law enforcement leadership.
- Secured and distributed stipends to each panelist for each listening session as a token of their thought leadership.
- In a few instances, panelists were referred to potential summer employment opportunities, foster home support, and assistance with preparation for graduation in one instance.

The second cycle of YVVP listening sessions will begin in February of 2025.

REFUSE OR GARBAGE CONTAINERS

Hazel Crest, IL Code of Ordinances

Sec. 12-5. - Same—Placement of containers.

- No refuse or garbage containers may be placed in a (a) front yard or parkway, except during the period from 7:00 p.m. on the evening prior to collection until the evening of collection day. No refuse or garbage container may be left in a front yard or on the parkway after 7:00 p.m. of collection day.
- No container used for the storage, collection and (b) removal of garbage or other refuse shall be placed so as to constitute a nuisance to adjacent property or the occupants thereof.
- In all cases when a garbage or refuse container is (C) placed on the rear of the lot for the purpose of having its contents removed, it shall be entirely within the lot line.
