Campers (parents please read to the child(ren))

Welcome to camp from home! Today we have a schedule full of activities and games! Follow along the schedule to complete each activity. Click on each activity to open up instructions on how to do them. Before we get started, this time frame is to get prepped and get energized! Breakfast is an essential part of your day, so take the rest of this time to eat. Get set up for your first activity and we hope you enjoy what we have planned.

Telephone – Game Instructions

How to Play the Telephone Game

1. Getting Started. Players must sit in a circle or stand in a straight line. They need to be close enough that whispering is possible, but not so close that players can hear each other whisper.
2. Begin the Game. The first person in the line or circle whispers a word or phrase into the ear of the person sitting or standing to their right.
3. The Game Continues. Players whisper the phrase to their neighbors until it reaches the last player in line.
4. The Conclusion. The last player says the word or phrase out loud so everyone can hear how much it has changed from the first whisper at the beginning of the circle or line.

Rules for Telephone Game:

- The word or phrase can only be whispered once, so players must pay close attention.
- The word or phrase should never be a too familiar; you want to make sure it changes as it is whispered.
- Only one player – the first – should know what the word or phrase is. The facilitator of the game may wish to have the original phrase or word written down.

Barnyard – Game Instructions

How To Play:

- Each person is given the name of an animal with approximately three-five people having the same animal.
- Spread the group across a field, court, classroom, etc.
- No one is allowed to tell another which animal he is. At the signal each person makes the noise of the animal that he has been given.
- The first group to find all of their animals and sit down are the winners.

Hula Girl and Mermaid

Materials

- Toilet Roll Cores
- Construction Paper
- Glue
- Scissors
- Markers (Sharpies are best)
- Glitter Glue Pens
- Craft Paint
- Paint Brush



Instructions:

1. First, paint your toilet paper tubes in peach, tan, or brown. (I didn't have any of those colors, so I mixed together orange, green, and white to create a nice tan color.) Once the paint is dry, draw on the faced with your Sharpie marker.
2. Cut out the hair, bra, skirt, and tail bits from brightly colored construction paper. Use your glitter glue pens and Sharpie markers to add the fun details.

Notes:

3. To make the hair, I simply cut out a long horizontal piece to make the bangs, and shorter pieces to make strands of hair.
4. I made two tails for the mermaid and waited until the end to decide which one I liked the best.
5. To make the grass skirt, I cut some paper fringe.
6. Curl your construction paper strips around a marker to create wavy hair.
7. Glue everything onto your toilet paper tubes to create your dolls! Here's our happy hula girl and her lovely mermaid friend!
