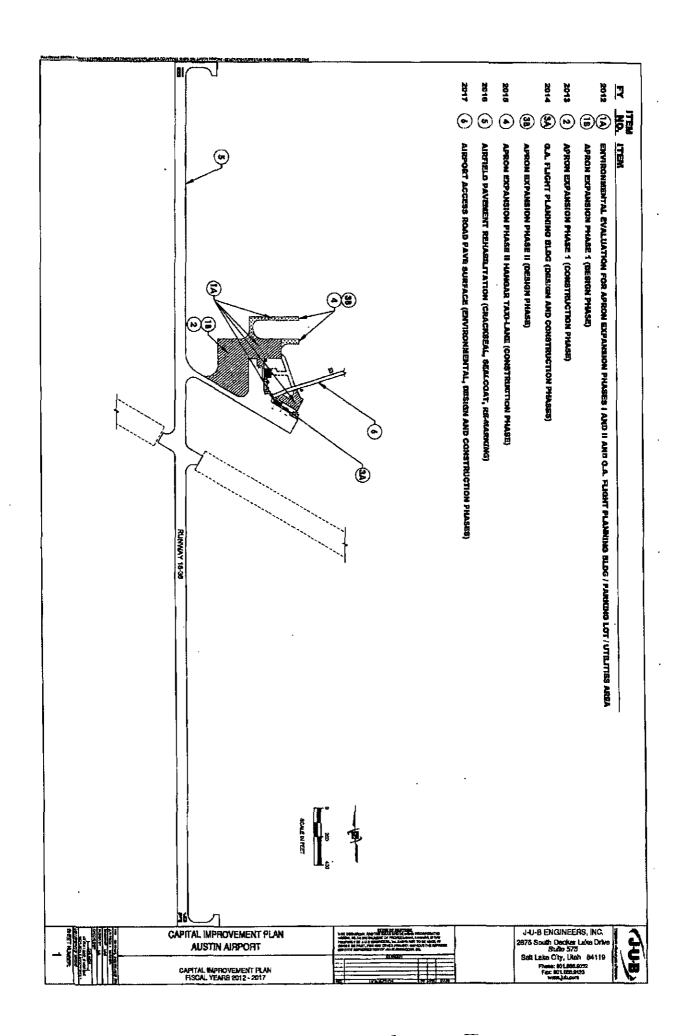

The Federal Aviation Administration is conducting our annual update of the ACIP. The FAA uses the ACIP to identify and prioritize airport capital improvement needs, and to plan the distribution of Airport Improvement Program (AIP) funds. All proposed projects must comply with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEFA); be depicted on your approved Airport Layout Plan (ALP); and be included in your ACIP submission in order to compete for AIP funding.

As part of your ACIP submittal, we request you use the enclosed ACIP Data Sheet [Enclosure (1)]. For the 5-year cycle from Federal fiscal year 2013 through 2017, please identify all proposed projects that you are requesting grant funding for. If you have no projects for any particular year, please state so on the form.

Clearly depict each project including a short narrative of the purpose, a brief justification of the need and a sketch, as further described below:

- 1. The sketch should be an 8 %" x 11" up to 11" x 17" and should clearly depict each project listed on your ACIP Data Sheets, including overall dimensions. Use a separate sketch for each fiscal year, if necessary for clarity.
- 2. The proposed project must be shown on an FAA approved ALP. The ALP should be updated for FAA approval every 3 years and should be in conformance with FAA Advisory Circular (AC) 150/5300-13. An ALP checklist is available on the FAA Western-Pacific website.
- The ACIF should reflect logical project progression. Program your planning, aeronautical surveys, environmental and design requirements before construction.
- 4. Expansion projects should be consistent with reasonable forecasts of aviation demand and the latest Airport Master Plan. The Airports District Office must approve revised aviation forecasts.
- 5. For capacity projects over \$10 million, a Benefit Cost Analysis is required in accordance with the December 15, 1999 Federal Register Notice, \*FAA Policy and Final Guidance Regarding Benefit Cost Analysis (BCA) on Airport Capacity Projects for FAA Decisions on Airport Improvement Program (AIP) Discretionary Grants and Letters of Intent (LOI)" and the October 24, 2011 Federal Register

Notice, "Airport Improvement Program: Modifications to Benefit Cost Analysis (BCA) Threshold."

Construction and equipment acquisition grants must be based on bid results.
 For projects that will require multiple grants over successive years, plan a logical construction sequence.

To help the FAA ensure that all projects comply with the National Environmental Policy Act, please identify the NEPA compliance status for the various projects in your ACIP. There are three levels of environmental documentation available to the FAA: A Categorical Exclusion (CATEX), an Environmental Assessment (EA) and an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). The types of projects that normally qualify for CATEX, EA or EIS are identified in FAA Orders 1050.1E and 5050.4B. The form for requesting a CATEX is provided as Enclosure 2. Projects that do not qualify for a CATEX determination require either an EA or EIS. The enclosed ACIP data sheet includes a section for you to identify the NEPA status of your airport's proposed projects. Please complete this section of the data sheet based upon your knowledge of the proposed project. Once the fiscal year 2013 candidate project list is finalized, we require sirports sponsors to have environmental approval for any construction projects on the candidate list by December 2012.

To facilitate the programming of your proposed projects, the due date to submit your updated ACIP is January 16, 2012. Please send your ACIP Data Sheets and project sketches to FAA at the following address:

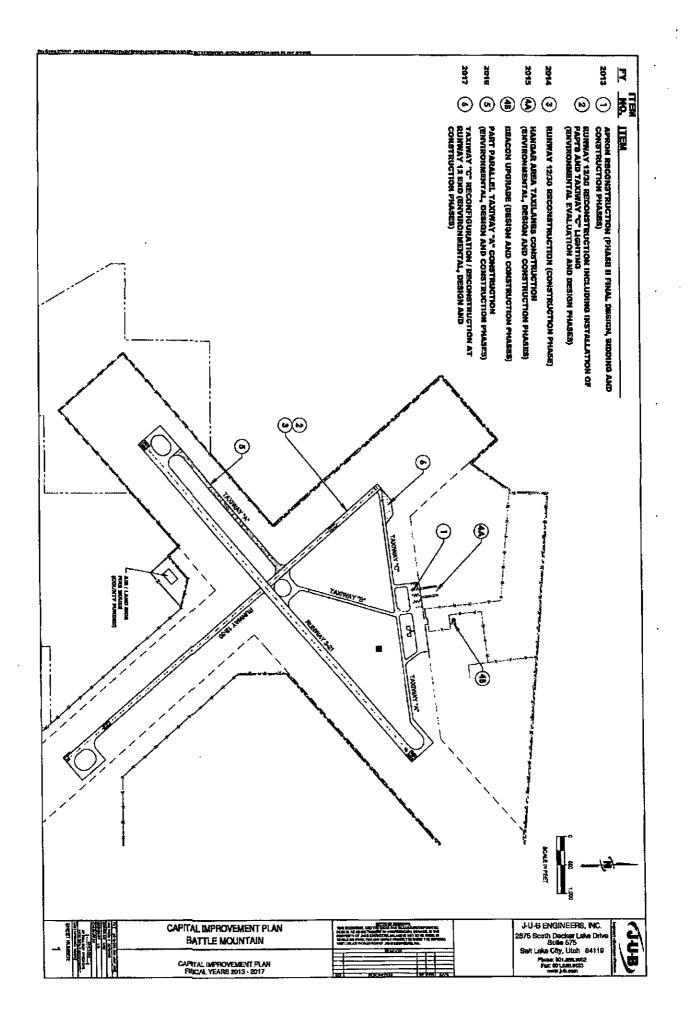

#### Dear Colonel Leady:

Battle Mountain, Nevada is a community located in Lander County on Interstate-80 (I-80) between Reno. Nevada and Salt Lake City, Utah and is at the confluence of the Humboldt and Reese Rivers. The town was flooded in February of 1962 by the Reese River prior to the construction of I-80. The flood inundated 95% of the city with 5 feet of water, with half of the homes flooding above the first floor. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) began work on a levee in May of 1962 to prevent future flooding. In 1968, a levee was constructed on the east side of Battle Mountain to prevent flooding from the Reese River. The existing levee begins at I-80 and extends downstream approximately 7,400 feet north to State Road 806. The existing levee does not provide the intended flood protection from the Reese River. It has been determined to be deficient and does not meet the current FEMA criteria to be an accredited levee. According to FEMA, a majority of Battle Mountain is located in the 100-year flood plain. Battle Mountain would be subject to significant flooding in a storm event similar to the 1962 Lander County signed a Project Cooperation Agreement (PCA) with the USACE on flood. December 11, 2000 to upgrade the levee design and to construct the necessary levee upgrades. However, the project never went to construction. Since the existing PCA was signed in 2000, additional hydrologic and hydraulic analyses have been conducted by Summit Engineering on behalf of Lander County. Several flow obstructions have caused the Reese River to flood outside of its natural flood plain including I-80, US Highway-40, the Southern Pacific Railroad, and several local roads. Multiple studies by the USACE and Summit Engineering on behalf of Lander County have analyzed solutions to fix the flood problems.

The Lander County Commission, on behalf of Lander County intends to seek approval from the USACE for permission to alter the Reese River Levee Project. The existing Reese River Levee Project is located in the Town of Battle Mountain in Lander County, Nevada (Section 17 & Section 20, T 32N, R 45 E). The existing levee is deficient and does not meet the FEMA requirements for an accredited levee per 44 CFR Section 65.10. In order to certify the levee and provide the necessary documentation to receive FEMA accreditation for the levee, several

design modifications and construction modifications are required to bring the levee up to current FEMA

standards. Modifications will include raising the levee in order to meet the current freeboard requirement per 44 CFR Section 65.10. Levee intersections with US 40 and Mule Shoe Road will require to be raised to meet the new height of the levee, while the configuration of the rail road crossing will require a re-design.

On behalf of *Lander County*, the *Lander County Commission* requests the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) determine the appropriate Section 408 classification for the proposed alteration. Further, in cooperation with *Lander County*, we request the USACE initiate compliance with the provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act.

Due to the existing Reese River Levee's deficiencies, this is an issue of primary importance to the Lander County Commission and the Battle Mountain Community. We respectfully request your assistance on this issue. Lander County has contracted with Summit Engineering to assist with the design and construction services for the required levee modifications. The land is included in a parcel, APN 11-320-02, that was donated by the Edna J. Miller Living Trust to Lander County to facilitate the acquisition of the runway visibility zones at BAM.

It became necessary for Lander County to acquire the privately-held parcels of land within the runway visibility zones at BAM to facilitate the Battle Mountain Airport Fencing Project. This particular parcel needing to be acquired by the County, then held by the Edna J. Miller Living Trust, was approximately 2.125 acres in area. The Edna J. Miller Living Trust donated a much larger parcel to the County, (20 acres), that included BOTH the 2.125 acres needed to maintain the runway visibility zone AND the approximately five (5) acre parcel upon which Mr. Elquist has placed a residence.

Mr. Elquist maintains various documents inferring that a land swap occurred between the Millers and himself. The documents evidence a swap of five (5) acres of land to be under the ownership of Mr. Elquist upon certain conditions having been met. The conditions included bringing electricity to and drilling a well on the lot. Elquist performed met the terms of the land swap and placed a manufactured home on the lot in 1977.

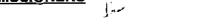

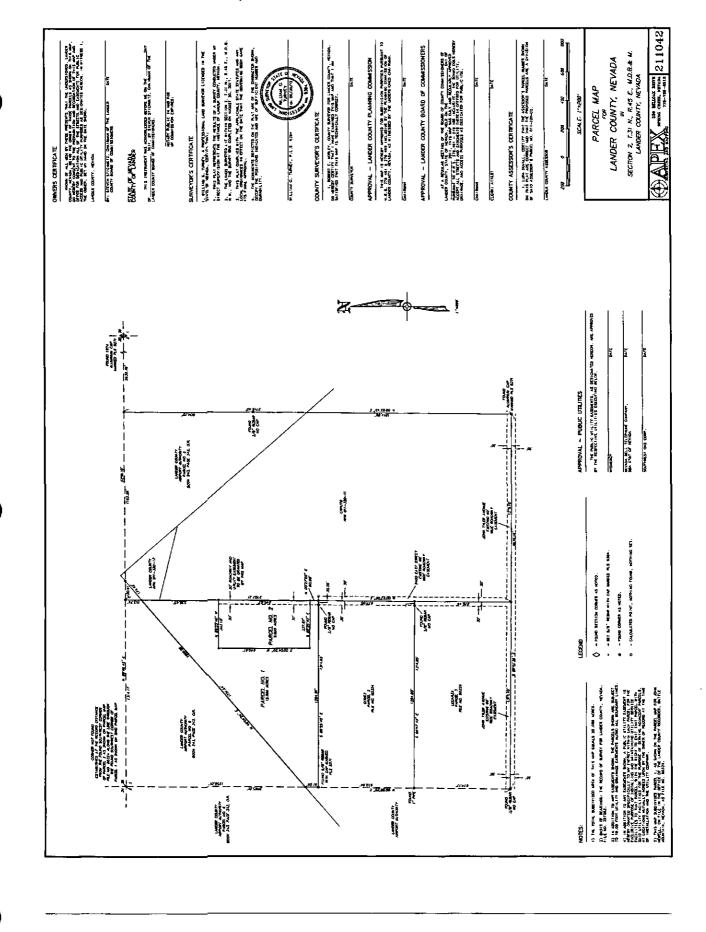

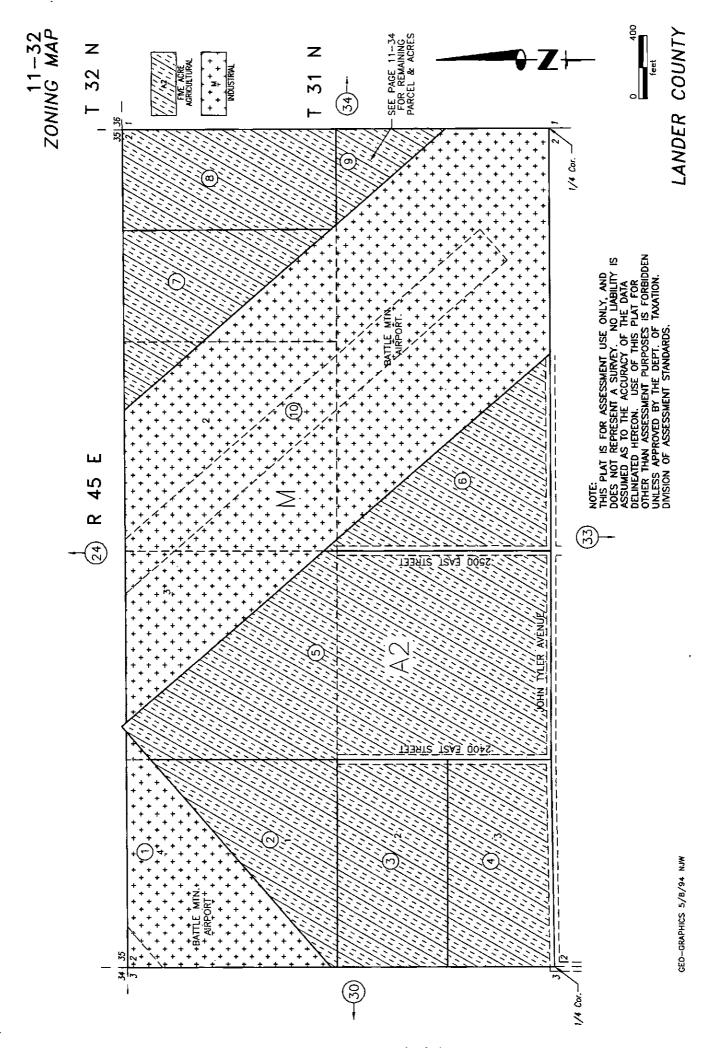

This provision was put into LCC through the passage by the Commission of Lander County Ordinance No. 2007-09 in February 2007. This restriction does not apply to mobile or manufactured homes already in existence within the County.

The Lander County Planning Commission met in regular session on January 11, 2012 and unanimously approved a recommendation for approval of the amendment of Lander County Code 15.24.030(D), to change the allowable age of mobile and manufactured homes from five (5) to fifteen (15) years old, by the Lander County Board of Commissioners.

Approval of this recommendation would be facilitated by proposing an Ordinance to Change Lander County Code (LCC) 15.24.030(D) to be formally introduced at the next Commission meeting.

An ordinance amending Section 15.24.030(D) of the Lander County Code to allow a mobile home or manufactured home to be permanently installed in Lander County if it has been constructed or manufactured not more than fifteen (15) years prior to the date of application for a building or moving permit; and other related matters.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 15.24:030(D) OF THE LANDER COUNTY CODE TO CHANGE THE ALLOWABLE AGE OF MOBILE AND MANUFACTURED HOMES FROM FIVE YEARS TO FIFTEEN YEARS OLD WHEN THEY ARE PERMANENTEY INSTALLED IN BANDER COUNTY. A MOBILE OR MANUFACTURED HOME MUST BE CONSTRUCTED OR MANUFACTURED NOT MORE THAN FIFTEEN (15) YEARS PRIOR TO THE DATE OF THE APPLICATION OF A BUILDING OR MOVING PERMIT; AND OTHER RELATED MATTERS

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LANDER COUNTY, NEVADA, DOES ORDAIN:

SECTION 1: Amendment. The Lander County Code Section 15.24:030(D) is amended in the following manner:

15.24.030 Permitted uses of travel trailers and mobile homes.

D. Any mobile home or manufactured home which is to be permanently installed in Lander County must have been constructed or manufactured not more than five fifteen (15) years prior to the date of application for a building permit or for a moving permit. This subsection shall not apply to valid non-conforming uses, nor to mobile homes which have already been validly permitted.

(SRK) is pleased to present this proposal to Lander County to prepare an update to the closure and postclosure cost estimates, prepare a Site Capacity Report, and permit and coordinate the replacement of two monitoring wells at the Battle Mountain Landfill. The scope of work described below was developed based on our conversations during my site visit on October 18, 2011, and a subsequent conversation with Jon Taylor at the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection, Bureau of Waste Management, Solid Waste Branch (NDEP) on October 19, 2011. The following sections describe the proposed scope of work and project cost estimate.

#### SCOPE OF WORK

For the purposes of proposal preparation and project management, the scope of work has been divided into three main tasks with subtasks, as follows:

Task 0000 - Project Management

Task 0100 - Reporting Requirements

Subtask 0101 - Site Visit

Subtask 0102 - Closure/Postclosure Cost Update Report

Subtask 0103 - Site Capacity Report

Task 0200 - Monitoring Well Relocation

Subtask 0201 - Research and File Review

Subtask 0202 - Waiver Application NDWR (for new monitoring wells)

Subtask 0203 - Request for Approval - NDEP Solid Waste

Subtask 0204 - Driller Coordination/Bid Solicitation

Subtask 0205 – Logging and Driller Oversight (incl. Preparation)

Subtask 0206 - As-Built Report (NDEP)

Subtask 0207 - Outside Services - Drilling Contractor

#### Task 0100 - Reporting Requirements

Although SRK completed one site visit already in preparation for the project, we anticipate that one additional visit may be required, either as part of the preparation of the disposal capacity report, or to coordinate with a

driller. We therefore have included costs for an additional trip to the site under this task. Closure and postclosure costs are required to be updated annually in accordance with Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 444.6851(3) and 444.68515(3), respectively. The last update was prepared by SRK in 2009. SRK will complete a new update of closure and postclosure costs according to the method recommended by NDEP. The report will be prepared as a letter report from SRK to Lander County for transmittal to NDEP.

Similarly, updated site capacity reports are required by NAC 444.702(7) once every 5 years. SRK will utilize the landfill survey completed in 2009 and subsequent semi-annual reports to prepare a summary of the remaining site disposal capacity. As with the cost update report, SRK will prepare this correspondence in the form of a letter report from SRK to Lander County for transmittal to NDEP.

#### Task 0200 - Monitoring Well Relocation

Under this task, and based on the recommendation of NDEP, SRK will visit NDEP's offices to review the case file and obtain a copy of the existing permit application to evaluate the most efficient means of revising the well locations. SRK will prepare a Monitoring Well Waiver application and an Affidavit of Abandonment for both new wells for submittal to the Nevada Division of Water Resources. SRK will also prepare a request for approval of well relocation to be submitted to NDEP by Lander County. The format of the request will be determined following the file review described above.

Once the required approvals are in place, SRK will prepare a solicitation for drilling bids and assist the County as necessary with driller selection. SRK's field engineer or geologist will oversee drilling and well construction operations in the field and prepare an as-built report with well construction logs once the field work is complete. For the purposes of proposal preparation, SRK has included an estimate of drilling costs in the cost estimate described below, including a 10 percent administrative mark-up. Lander County can avoid this added fee by contracting directly with the driller.

#### **HEALTH AND SAFETY**

SRK maintains an internal Health and Safety Policy which addresses the completion of work by all SRK personnel including travel to and from the project site. Prior to departing for the project site a project-specific health and safety plan will be prepared and reviewed by SRK personnel travelling to the project site. While on-site, SRK personnel will conform to Lander County's health and safety policies governing the project site, to include attending any required site-specific safety training, and participating in safety shares with each individual being responsible for the safe completion of the project work in which he or she is engaged.

#### PROJECT QUALITY PLAN

All work will be completed in a manner consistent with accepted standards of professional practice. The completed work products will be prepared by SRK's project team, reviewed by SRK's Nevada engineering Practice Leader, and submitted in draft form for Lander County's review and comment prior to being finalized.

#### PROJECT COST ESTIMATE

SRK proposes to complete the scope of work described above for an estimated cost of \$37,583. Note that the drilling costs are only estimated for proposal preparation. SRK will work closely with Lander County once drilling bids are obtained to evaluate the impact of those costs on overall project costs. Estimated costs for each task described above are detailed in attached Table 1. Professional time and expenses will be invoiced on a time-and-materials basis. Project funds not used during the completion of this project will not be invoiced.

SRK will begin the proposed scope of work within two weeks of receipt of written approval to proceed. Authorization to proceed may be signified by signing in the space provided below and returning one copy to SRK. The scope of work described in this proposal can be completed under the terms of an executed Agreement for Consulting Services established between Lander County and SRK. A copy of the agreement is included herein for your review.

This Master Services Agreement (the "Agreement") is made effective as of November , 2011, between:

LANDER COUNTY, a municipality having an office at 315 South Humboldt Street, Battle Mountain, Nevada 89820 (the "Client"); and

SRK CONSULTING (U.S.), INC., a Colorado corporation having an office at Suite 300 - 5250 Neil Road, Reno, Nevada, USA 89502 ("SRK")

#### 1. SRK Obligations.

- 1.1 Services to be provided. The client agrees to receive and SRK agrees to provide services ("Services") as set forthin work orders or letter proposals that reference and incorporate the terms of this agreement (each a "Work Order").
- 1.2 Changed Conditions and Change Notices. If SRK identifies changed conditions that will impact on the Services, including but not limited to changes in the scope of the Services, additional work required, or additional fees required (a) SRK shall notify the Client of these changed conditions; and (b) the Client and SRK shall promptly use reasonable best efforts to agree to an addendum to the Work Order or a new Work Order that will take the changed conditions into account.
- 1.3 Performance. SRK shall perform the Services with the degree of care, skill and diligence normally provided in the performance of services in respect of projects of a similar nature to that contemplated by the Work Order at the time and place that such services are rendered. In rendering its Services SRK may, at its discretion, engage subcontractors to perform services necessary to enable SRK to carry out the Services.

## 2. Client Obligations.

- 2.1 Right of Entry and Safety. The Client shall provide to SRK the right to enter, or otherwise assist SRK to gain entry, to any premises or locations where the Services are required to be performed (the "Site"). Responsibility for damage to and safety in, on or about the Site will remain the responsibility of the Site owner, except for the activities of SRK and SRK's employees, officers, directors, affiliates and contractors which shall be the responsibility of both parties. SRK shall carry out the Services in accordance with SRK's health and safety policy and the policies of the Client, as communicated to SRK, SRK will not have control of the operations or activities of others, nor shall it be inferred by any party that SRK is responsible for site safety. - the transportation provided, if the individual involved is of the opinion that the transportation is not safe or secure. Any additional costs associated with providing replacement transportation or making the current transportation safe and secure, including any costs or standby charges resulting from any delay, shall be borne by the Client.
- 2.3 Information Provided by Client. The Client shall make available to SRK all relevant information or data pertinent to the Services which is required by SRK, including, but not limited to, all regulatory, legal or other governmental conditions relating to the Services or work on the Site. The Client shall inform SRK of all reports or other materials that relate to SRK's work, and furnish or otherwise assist SRK to gain access to them.

#### 3. - 5.2 Press. SRK may use and publish the Client's name and a general description of SRK's services to the Client when describing SRK's experience and qualifications to others. To maintain the high standards associated with SRK's work and to ensure that it is adequately described, the Client will not make any press releases or release publications, other communications or promotional material referring to SRK or the Services without the prior written consent of SRK, except to the extent that it is required by law to do so.
- 5.3 Ownership of Work Product. All documents issued by or through SRK, as instruments of service, which are incorporated into the Services, including but not limited to drawings, plans, models, designs, specifications, bore logs, field data, field notes, laboratory test data, reports, photographs, surveys and other data, and all variations and modifications thereto (the "Work Product") shall become the property of Client. SRK is entitled to a copy of the Work Product. Any Work Product furnished to the Client or its agents and not paid for will be returned upon demand and will not be used by the Client. If the Services include the provision of a formal report, SRK may include language in the report that identifies the existence of the Agreement or Work Order and any terms therein.
- 5.4 Ownership of Intellectual Property. All concepts, products or processes, copyright, trademark, patent or other intellectual property ("IP") contributed by SRK or Client shall remain the property of the contributing party, and any IP produced by or resulting from the services rendered by SRK in connection with the Services or which are otherwise developed or first reduced to practice by SRK in the performance of its services shall be and remain the property of SRK. SRK shall grant to the Client a non-exclusive, irrevocable, royalty free, fully paid licence to use any IP embodied in the Work Product as required to use, reproduce and distribute the Work Product, to the extent SRK has the right to license the IP.

#### 6. Delays and Disputes.

6.1 Delays. If, as a result of strike, lockout or other labor dispute; fire; flood; storm; ice floe; lightning; earthquake; volcanic eruption; explosion; war; civil disturbance; blockade; act of God; governmental restraint imposed or caused by federal, state, county or municipal law or by any rule, regulation, ordinance or order of or delay or failure to act by a federal, state, county, municipal or other government agency or Proper Authority; inability to secure required federal, state, county, municipal or other governmental permits, approvals or easements; any judicial acts or restraints; accidents; uncontrollable delays in delivery or transportation of materials to the site of use; inability to obtain necessary materials in the open market; or any other cause, except the inability to pay money ("Force Majeure"), a Party is unable to carry out, in whole or in part, its obligations under a Work Order, such

Party shall give the other Party prompt and reasonably detailed notice of the Force Majeure. Except for obligations to make payments of money, the obligations of the Party giving the notice, so far as they are obligations affected by the Force Majeure, shall be suspended during, but no longer than, the existence of the Force Majeure. The affected Party shall use all reasonable diligence to remove the Force Majeure as quickly as possible; except, however, that the affected Party shall not be required to settle any strikes, lockouts or other labor disputes, and the handling of such matters shall be entirely within the judgment and discretion of the affected Party. Except as provided in this section, neither party shall be responsible to the other for costs, time charges, damages or performance delays caused by circumstances beyond the control of that party, provided however, that SRK shall be entitled to recover amounts for disbursements paid or incurred and fees at its prevailing fees and expense reimbursement policy for time lost where such circumstances could not reasonably have been anticipated or prevented.

- 6.2 **Termination.** Either party may terminate any Work Order under this Agreement if:
  - 6.2.1 a Force Majeure lasts an aggregate of 45 calendar days during the term of the Agreement; or
  - 6.2.2 the other Party fails to correct a default within 7 calendar days of written notice of the default from the non-defaulting Party.

In addition, any Work Order may be terminated by SRK if:

- 6.2.3 SRK believes that compliance with the Client's instructions would cause SRK to compromise applicable standards, professional ethics, or laws;
- 6.2.4 the Client fails to pay undisputed amounts within 30 calendar days of the date due, as set forth herein; or
- 6.2.5 if control of the Client changes or the Agreement is assigned contrary to section 7.7.

Termination shall occur upon the date set out in a written notice of termination provided by the terminating Party. These rights of termination will not limit any other right or remedy of either Party whether in law or equity. If a Party terminates a Work Order as provided for in this Agreement, that Party will not be liable for any penalties, costs or damages to the other Party. The Client shall within 30 calendar days of termination pay SRK's fees for services rendered and costs incurred, in accordance with SRK's prevailing fees and expense reimbursement policy, including demobilization costs.

6.3 Dispute Resolution. Except for disputes solely involving a question of law, the Client and SRK will attempt to resolve all disputes, claims, and other matters in question (a "Dispute") between the parties hereto arising out of or relating to the Agreement, a Work Order, or the breach thereof by mediation, and will use their best efforts to







agree on the choice of a mediator. If a Dispute cannot be resolved by mediation within 90 days after one of the parties notifies the other in writing of an intention to mediate the Dispute, the parties will submit the matter in controversy to a single arbitrator for binding arbitration in accordance with the American Arbitration Association in accordance with its Arbitration Rules in effect as of the commencement of arbitration, subject to the limitations and restrictions stated below. The agreement to arbitrate and the determination arising from such arbitration will be specifically enforceable under the prevailing law of any court having jurisdiction. No arbitration arising out of the Agreement may include any person or entity who is not a party to the Agreement without the written consent of both parties.

## 7. Other Provisions.

- 7.1 All notices required under the Agreement shall be in writing and effective if delivered in person, sent by email or registered mail or courier addressed to the party for whom it is intended at the address set out above or the email address set out below. A notice will be considered to have been received (a) if delivered by hand, upon receipt by a responsible representative of the receiver; (b) if sent by email, upon the sender receiving confirmation of the message; (c) if mailed or couriered in Canada or the United States, upon the fifth business day following posting; and (d) if mailed or couriered outside of Canada or the United States, upon the tenth business day following posting, except that in the case of a disruption or an impending or threatened disruption in postal services every notice will be delivered by hand, courier or email. The address or email of either party may be changed by notice.
- 7.2 The Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws in force in Colorado, and the parties submit to the jurisdiction of this State's courts.

- 7.3 The parties will execute and deliver all other appropriate supplemental agreements and other instruments, and take any other action necessary, to give full effect to the Agreement and to make the Agreement legally effective, binding, and enforceable as between them and as against third parties.
- 7.4 The failure of a party to insist upon the strict performance of any term of the Agreement, or to exercise any right or remedy contained in the Agreement, will not be a waiver or a relinquishment by that party for the future of that term, right, or remedy.
- 7.5 If any term of the Agreement is determined to be invalid or unenforceable, in whole or in part, the invalidity or unenforceability will attach only to that term or part term. and the remaining part of the term and all other terms of the Agreement will continue in force and effect.
- 7.6 The Agreement is the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes any prior agreement relating to the Services to be provided under a Work Order incorporating this Agreement, other than those incorporated by reference. There are no representations or warranties, express or implied, statutory or otherwise, and no agreements collateral to the Agreement, other than as expressly set out or referred to in the Agreement. The Agreement may be amended or supplemented only by a written agreement signed by each party.
- 7.7 The Agreement shall enure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties hereto and their successors and permitted assigns and shall not be assigned in whole or in part by either party without the prior written consent of the other party. Any assignment made without that consent is void and of no effect.
- 7.8 Neither the execution of the Agreement nor the performance by a Party of any of its rights and obligations under the Agreement will create any partnership or joint venture between the Parties.

SRK Consulting (U.S.), Inc. (SRK) is pleased to present this proposal to Lander County to prepare an update to the closure and postclosure cost estimates, prepare a Site Capacity Report, and permit and coordinate the replacement of two monitoring wells at the Battle Mountain Landfill. The scope of work described below was developed based on our conversations during my site visit on October 18, 2011, and a subsequent conversation with Jon Taylor at the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection, Bureau of Waste Management, Solid Waste Branch (NDEP) on October 19, 2011. The following sections describe the proposed scope of work and project cost estimate.

#### SCOPE OF WORK

For the purposes of proposal preparation and project management, the scope of work has been divided into three main tasks with subtasks, as follows:

Task 0000 - Project Management

Task 0100 - Reporting Requirements

Subtask 0101 - Site Visit

Subtask 0102 - Closure/Postclosure Cost Update Report

Subtask 0103 - Site Capacity Report

Task 0200 - Monitoring Well Relocation

Subtask 0201 - Research and File Review

Subtask 0202 – Waiver Application NDWR (for new monitoring wells)

Subtask 0203 - Request for Approval - NDEP Solid Waste

Subtask 0204 - Driller Coordination/Bid Solicitation

Subtask 0205 – Logging and Driller Oversight (incl. Preparation)

Subtask 0206 - As-Built Report (NDEP)

Subtask 0207 – Outside Services - Drilling Contractor

#### Task 0100 - Reporting Requirements

Although SRK completed one site visit already in preparation for the project, we anticipate that one additional visit may be required, either as part of the preparation of the disposal capacity report, or to coordinate with a

driller. We therefore have included costs for an additional trip to the site under this task. Closure and postclosure costs are required to be updated annually in accordance with Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 444.6851(3) and 444.68515(3), respectively. The last update was prepared by SRK in 2009. SRK will complete a new update of closure and postclosure costs according to the method recommended by NDEP. The report will be prepared as a letter report from SRK to Lander County for transmittal to NDEP.

Similarly, updated site capacity reports are required by NAC 444.702(7) once every 5 years. SRK will utilize the landfill survey completed in 2009 and subsequent semi-annual reports to prepare a summary of the remaining site disposal capacity. As with the cost update report, SRK will prepare this correspondence in the form of a letter report from SRK to Lander County for transmittal to NDEP.

#### Task 0200 - Monitoring Well Relocation

Under this task, and based on the recommendation of NDEP, SRK will visit NDEP's offices to review the case file and obtain a copy of the existing permit application to evaluate the most efficient means of revising the well locations. SRK will prepare a Monitoring Well Waiver application and an Affidavit of Abandonment for both new wells for submittal to the Nevada Division of Water Resources. SRK will also prepare a request for approval of well relocation to be submitted to NDEP by Lander County. The format of the request will be determined following the file review described above.

Once the required approvals are in place, SRK will prepare a solicitation for drilling bids and assist the County as necessary with driller selection. SRK's field engineer or geologist will oversee drilling and well construction operations in the field and prepare an as-built report with well construction logs once the field work is complete. For the purposes of proposal preparation, SRK has included an estimate of drilling costs in the cost estimate described below, including a 10 percent administrative mark-up. Lander County can avoid this added fee by contracting directly with the driller.

#### **HEALTH AND SAFETY**

SRK maintains an internal Health and Safety Policy which addresses the completion of work by all SRK personnel including travel to and from the project site. Prior to departing for the project site a project-specific health and safety plan will be prepared and reviewed by SRK personnel travelling to the project site. While on-site, SRK personnel will conform to Lander County's health and safety policies governing the project site, to include attending any required site-specific safety training, and participating in safety shares with each individual being responsible for the safe completion of the project work in which he or she is engaged.

#### PROJECT QUALITY PLAN

All work will be completed in a manner consistent with accepted standards of professional practice. The completed work products will be prepared by SRK's project team, reviewed by SRK's Nevada engineering Practice Leader, and submitted in draft form for Lander County's review and comment prior to being finalized.

#### PROJECT COST ESTIMATE

SRK proposes to complete the scope of work described above for an estimated cost of \$37,583. Note that the drilling costs are only estimated for proposal preparation. SRK will work closely with Lander County once drilling bids are obtained to evaluate the impact of those costs on overall project costs. Estimated costs for each task described above are detailed in attached Table 1. Professional time and expenses will be invoiced on a time-and-materials basis. Project funds not used during the completion of this project will not be invoiced.

SRK will begin the proposed scope of work within two weeks of receipt of written approval to proceed. Authorization to proceed may be signified by signing in the space provided below and returning one copy to SRK. The scope of work described in this proposal can be completed under the terms of an executed Agreement for Consulting Services established between Lander County and SRK. A copy of the agreement is included herein for your review.

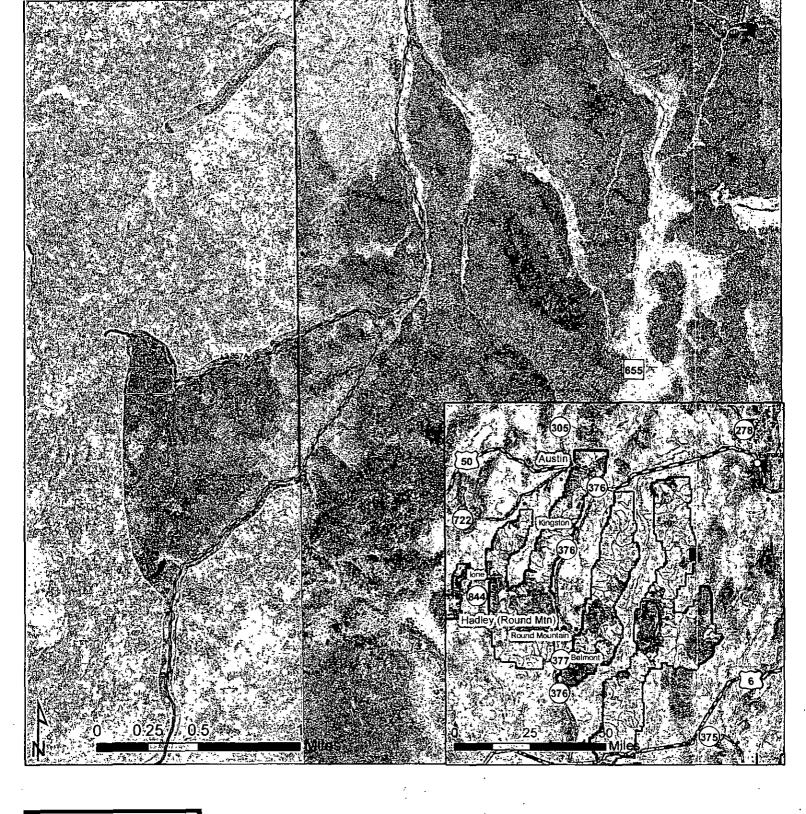

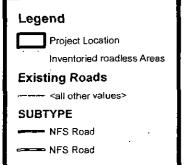

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor, Nevada is experiencing abnormally dry conditions. It is likely that a continuation of these weather conditions will result in a drought, and affect plant growth and water yield availability.

As a permittee, you are aware that drought results in decreased vigor and food reserves of perennial plants, diminished root growth, and a reduction of vegetation production and soil cover. If these conditions persist, we expect that many water sources will be dry or will dry up much earlier in the grazing season. This will put additional grazing pressure on areas around remaining water sources including riparian areas by all users. Increased grazing pressure during drought can cause long lasting damage to soils, plants, stream channels and water quality.

During a drought, forage production is usually not sufficient to provide for livestock grazing on public lands at the same levels or in the same manner as in average production years. The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) Battle Mountain District is aware that temporary changes to your livestock operation may be necessary because of poor water availability or forage conditions and as a result, can cause economic hardship and management stress. The BLM would like to work with you now to plan for the upcoming grazing season so that any changes that must be made are anticipated in advance. This will allow you an early opportunity to adjust your operation if needed.

If drought conditions persist and acceptable voluntary adjustments are not requested, the authorized officer for the Mount Lewis Field Office and/or Tonopah Field Office will be required to take appropriate action. Pursuant to 43 CFR §4110.3-3(b), "When the authorized officer determines that the soil, vegetation, or other resources on the public lands require immediate protection because of conditions such as drought, fire, flood, insect infestation, or when continued grazing use poses an imminent likelihood of significant resource damage, after consultation with, or a reasonable attempt to consult with, affected permittees or lessees, the interested public, and the State having lands responsible for managing resources within the area, the authorized officer shall close allotments or portions of allotments to grazing by any kind of livestock or modify authorized grazing use... Notices of closure and decisions requiring

modification of authorized grazing use may be issued as final decisions effective upon issuance or on the date specified in the decision."

I encourage you to contact your assigned Rangeland Management Specialist to discuss your specific situation in order to identify any temporary changes in grazing use that will be required to mitigate the effects of drought for the 2012 grazing season.

In support of the above-mentioned management actions, the Battle Mountain District is developing a Drought Management Environmental Assessment (EA) for the district. The primary purpose of the EA is to analyze a range of management alternatives that will be used to mitigate the effects of drought and to avoid emergency situations. These alternatives will provide a suite of drought response actions that would be implemented during various stages of drought. Drought response actions will address; grazing management, wild horse and burro management, wildlife needs, riparian resource concerns and a variety of other resources and management actions associated with the public lands located within the Battle Mountain District.

Dear Interested Public:

Current Bureau of Land Management (BLM) livestock grazing regulations which became effective August 21, 1995 contain many provisions for public participation in the BLM's decision making process. Consultation, cooperation and coordination (CCC) are the core of the public participation process and provide the BLM decision-maker the opportunity to consider the most complete information before making decisions. The current regulations require CCC with permittees, State, County, other Federal agencies, Tribal and local government entities, institutions, organizations, corporations, associations, and interested publics prior to a decision being made on the following types of actions: -

- Designating or changing allotment boundaries
- Increasing or decreasing permitted use
- Increasing or decreasing permitted use
  Modification of terms and conditions of grazing permits
- .- Development or revision of Allotment Management Plans
- Planning range developments or range improvement programs
- Issuance or renewal of grazing permits
- Reports which evaluate monitoring data (i.e. allotment evaluations/assessmets)
- Issuance of non-renewable grazing permits (i.e. Temporary Non-Renewable)
- Closures of allotments due to drought, fire, flood, insect infestation, or when continued use would pose significant resource damage

The current grazing regulations define an interested public as:

"An individual, group or organization that has submitted a written request to the authorized officer to be provided an opportunity to be involved in the decision making process for the management of livestock grazing on specific grazing allotments or has submitted written comments to the authorized officer regarding the management of livestock grazing on a specific allotment."

In the past, we have utilized our general Resource Management Plan mailing list to solicit comments regarding grazing related issues. During the past several years we have also generated more specific allotment mailing lists as we have completed allotment evaluations. Since, August 1995, we have been utilizing these mailing lists to provide for CCC as required by the grazing regulations. However, we suspect that not everyone on these mailing lists may be interested in La Kartali Salah Fara ( Carana di

participating in the decision making process for all the specific types of grazing management actions listed above.

Therefore, in an effort to create a more accurate mailing list and reduce unnecessary mailings, we are asking that you notify this office in writing of your desire to be an interested public for livestock grazing management on lands administered by the Winnemucca District Office.

The regulations require that you identify a specific allotment or allotments in which you are interested, rather than a blanket assertion that you are interested in "all" allotments. To help us formulate specific interested public lists for each type of grazing management action, we are asking that you also identify the type of action(s) you are interested in from the list above.

Therefore, your request to be an interested public should include:

- 1. The specific allotment(s) you are interested in by name; and
- 2. The specific type(s) of grazing management actions you are interested in for each allotment(s).

We-will-begin-utilizing-an-updated CCC-list for the grazing management actions listed above starting on March 30, 2012. If you have not sent us a written response with the appropriate information by this time, you will not receive information on grazing management actions for the coming year. This means that your name will be removed and you will not receive any future communication from this office. You may, at any time send us a letter requesting to be placed back on our mailing list, and we will gladly abide by this request. If you wish to revise a request made in response to this letter, you may do so at any time. If you are identified as an interested public for an ongoing allotment evaluation/assessment, you will remain on that list through completion of the evaluation/assessment/decision process for that allotment.

Permittees will always be kept informed on actions that affect any allotment(s) for which they have a grazing permit. If they wish to be informed of actions on any other allotment(s), they must respond to this letter.

A map and a list of the grazing allotments in the Winnemucca District are enclosed for your convenience. If you have information which you believe would be pertinent to any of these allotments, please contact the Winnemucca District Office.

### Dear Interested Public:

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM), Winnemucca District Office, Humboldt River Field Office (WDO/HRFO) is seeking public input as it initiates an environmental analysis process for a geothermal power plant and power lines as proposed by TGP Dixie Development Company, LLC (see enclosed map). This project is located at the base of the northwest slope of the Stillwater Range, approximately twenty five miles east-southeast of Lovelock, in Pershing County, Nevada.

The proposal includes the construction and operation of an up to 70-Megawatt, geothermal power plant, up to 45 total geothermal production, injection and/or observation wells, up to three water wells, access roads, geothermal steam/fluid pipelines, an airstrip and airplane hangar, up to two 230-kilovolt electrical line, an electrical substation, and support facilities. The proposed power plant would be sited on one of four possible locations. Selection of the power plant site, as well as the power plant technology, would be based on characterization of the geothermal resource that would result from ongoing exploration activities. Three power line routes are being considered. Two of the routes would travel north toward Interstate 80 and the third route would connect with an existing Dixie Valley geothermal plant. One of the two northern routes (routes 1 and 2) would be chosen with a possible addition of the southern route (route 3). The power plant would require up to 60 acres, the geothermal well sites would require up to an additional 42 acres, and up to 20 acres would be necessary for pipelines, all of which is on public land. Depending on the route for the power line an additional 33, 36 or 22 acres (routes 1, 2 and 3, respectively) would be crossed overland by the poles and power line.

In accordance with Council on Environmental Quality Regulations at 40 CFR 1500, for implementing the procedural provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), the BLM WDO/HRFO, will be preparing an environmental analysis of the proposed project. This analysis will disclose the environmental impacts expected to occur should the project be implemented. The BLM is seeking your input in identifying issues and concerns or applicable knowledge to assist us with the NEPA process.

The public is invited to submit comments on the proposal within 30 days of the date of this letter. Please send written comments to Mr. Philip D'Amo, project lead, at the above address or e-mail wfoweb@blm:gov with "NYC Geothermal Project (D'Amo)" in the subject line. This letter and

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map are also available on our NEPA webpage at <a href="http://www.blm.gov/nv/st/en/fo/wfo/blm\_information/nepa0.html">http://www.blm.gov/nv/st/en/fo/wfo/blm\_information/nepa0.html</a>. In addition, a copy of their Operations Plan is available for review at the Winnemucca District Office during regular business hours for 30 days from the date of this letter.

Public comments submitted for this project, including names and addresses of commenters will be available for public review at the WDO during regular business hours 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, except federal holidays. Before including your address, phone number, e-mail address, or other personal identifying information in your comment, you should be aware that your entire comment -- including personal identifying information -- may be made publicly available at any time. While you can ask us in your comment to withhold personal identifying information from public review, we cannot guarantee that we will be able to do so.

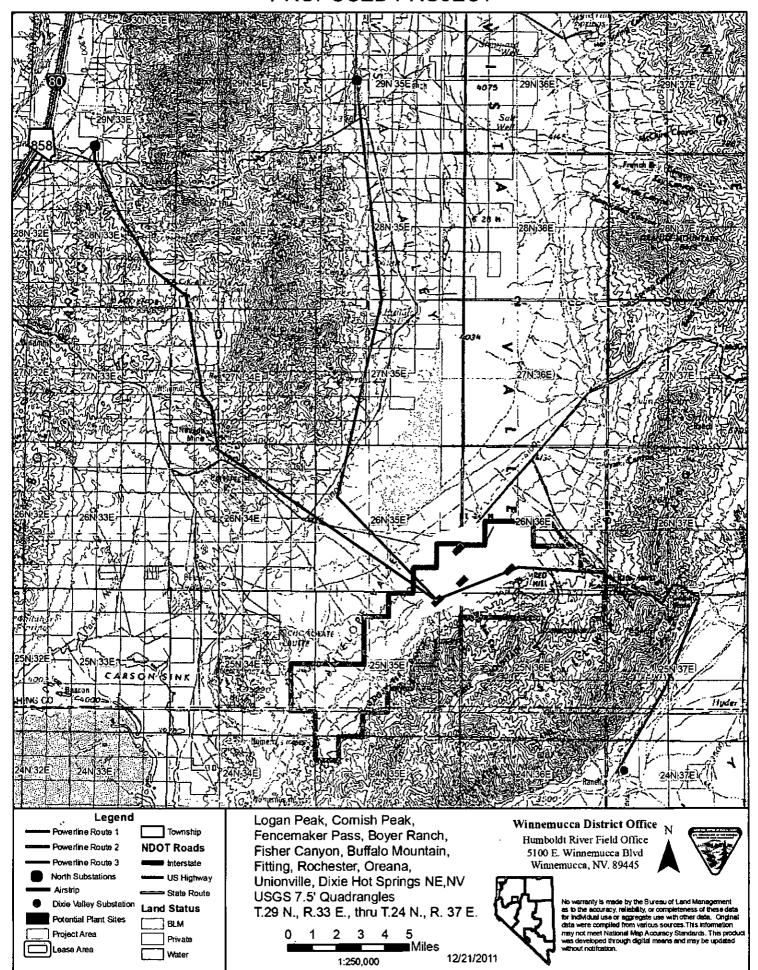

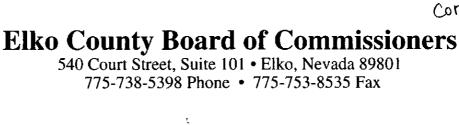
