### Petition to Add a Sound/Safety Wall add on I-80 as it passes Battle Mountain house division and Battle Mountain High School

Petition summary and background  61 :2 44 61 M16 8102	When Interstate 80 was built around the town of Battle Mountain, NV the resident of Gold Creek Avenue, Wildhorse Way, Indian Springs & Wilson Avenue, along with others, were greatly affected by the noise pollution created by the large amount of high speed traffic both night and day which now travels at 75 mph or more along that Interstate. All of these locations, and maybe more, are being affected 24 hours a day, every day. Even more alarming is the safety issue that exists. The backyards of the houses on the south side of Gold Creek Avenue are a mere 25 yards from this 75 mph traffic. The local high school is not much farther away. There was short sound/safety wall built a few years ago which only covers the small fishing pond area on the east side of the high school The reason for the building of this wall in this location is really unknown.  There have been at least two semi-tractor/trailer wrecks along this stretch of Interstate in the last few years. There was also a wreck involving an automobile leaving the Interstate which ended up in the fence behind the high school.  Sound/Safety walls are abundant in the larger cities where there is a high way or freeway passing by.  As concerned citizens of Battle Mountain, we believe that there is a great need for this wall to rid us of the noise pollution and the potential safety issues that were created by the building of this Interstate stretch so close to the existing town.

## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING Between BATTLE MOUNTAIN CHAMBER OF COMMERCE and LANDER COUNTY

This Memorandum of Understanding, hereinafter referred to as "MOU", made this 28<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2018 by and between Larder County, a political subdivision of the State of Nevada, hereinafter referred to as "Owner", and the Battle Mountain Chamber of Commerce, hereinafter referred to as "BMCC."

#### RECITALS

WHEREAS, BMCC desires to use the Owner's property for the purpose of disseminating information to the public, and particularly to promote tourism in Battle Mountain, Nevada; and

WHEREAS, Owner is authorized to lease property to a nonprofit charitable or civic organization if the property is actually used for charitable or civic purposes pursuant to NRS 244.284, and

WHEREAS, Owner does not need exclusive use of the subject southeast room of building and adjacent grounds located at 625 South Broad, Battle Mountain, Nevada 89820, hereinafter referred as "Room," at the present time for other public purposes; and

WHEREAS, BMCC qualifies and shall continue to qualify as a nonprofit or civic organization: and

WHEREAS, both parties recognize the public need for an appropriate location to disseminate information to the public and promote tourism.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, conditions and other good and valuable consideration contained herein, the parties hereby agree as follows.

#### TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. Purpose: BMCC shall, subject to all terms, conditions, and limitations specified hereinafter, have the exclusive right to occupy the Room for the purpose of providing information to the public; and promoting tourism.
- 2. Term: This MOU shall remain in effect for a period of three (3) years, commencing on the 1st day of July, 2018 and ending on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2021. This term shall be subject to earlier termination as hereafter provided.

- 3. Maintenance and Utilities: Maintenance obligations are as follows:
  - A. Owner shall be responsible for the maintenance to the exterior of the Room, landscape, and the grounds, and shall keep these in good and safe order.
  - B. Owner shall be responsible for the maintenance and repair to the plumbing heating and electrical services and systems inside the Room.
  - C. BMCC shall provide general maintenance and cleaning of the interior of the Room and shall keep the interior in good and safe order.
  - D. Owner shall provide the maintenance and repairs required under this paragraph upon the submission of maintenance/repair requests submitted by BMCC and approved by Owner.
  - E. Utilities shall be paid by the owner.
- 4. Liability and Insurance: BMCC shall hold Owner harmless form any claim or assertion of liability, made at law or in equity, that may arise in connection with this MOU or the use of the Room and grounds by BMCC, BMCC's agents, employees, or any other person using the Room or grounds. BMCC further promises to provide Owner sufficient evidence of a liability insurance policy, satisfactory to Owner, which covers BMCC and names Owner as an additional insured. Said policy must indemnify and hold harmless Owner against any and all claims, in the amount of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for injury to anyone person, said policy must remain in force during the entire term of this MOU and must be subject to prior notice to Owner before cancellation.
- 5. Insurance of Property: Owner shall be responsible for the insurance of the Room and its appurtenances. Any proceeds that result from this paragraph shall belong to Owner. Owner shall be under no obligation to use said proceeds to rebuild or repair the Room to make it suitable for the purpose of the MOU.
- 6. Improvements and Alterations: BMCC shall make no improvements or alterations to the Room or grounds unless prior approval is granted in writing by the Owner. All improvements and alterations shall remain the property of Owner upon termination of this MOU unless BMCC can remove them without damage.
- 7. Surrender of Possession: BMCC agrees to surrender to Owner possession of the Room at the expiration or termination of the MOU, by lapse of time or otherwise, in as good as repair as when BMCC obtained it at the commencement of the term, excepting only ordinary wear and decay, or damage by the elements, or by act of God, insurrection, nuclear weapon, bomb, riot, invasion or commotion, or military or usurped power.

- 8. Holding After Termination: if, after the expiration of this MOU the BMCC shall remain in possession of the Room without a written agreement as to the holding, then holding over shall be deemed to have taken place and shall be a holding upon a periodic tenancy from month to month at a monthly rental equivalent to the last monthly payment provided above or payable in advance on the same day of each month as provided above. All other terms and conditions of this MOU shall remain the same.
- 9. Amendment or Modification: Both parties acknowledge and agree that they have not relied upon any statement, representations, agreements, or warranties, in entering into this Agreement, except as and expressed herein, and no amendment or modification of this MOU shall be valid or binding unless expressed in writing and executed by both parties.
- 10. Damage or Loss to BMCC's Property: All personal property of any kind kept in the Room shall be kept there at the BMCC's sole risk and Owner shall not be held liable for any damage done to or loss of that personal property, arising from bursting, overflowing or leaking of water, sewer, or steam pipes, or from heating or plumbing fixtures, or from electric wires, or from gases, or odors, or caused in, any other manner. Owner has no duty to provide security for the building.
- 11. Termination: This MOU may be terminated prior to the expiration of the term as follows:
  - A. Owner or BMCC may terminate this MOU without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice served upon the other party personally or by certified mail sent to the last known address.
  - B. Owner may terminate this MOU upon thirty (30) days written notice served upon BMCC personally or by certified mail, sent to the last known address, if BMCC fails to comply with any of the provisions contained in this MOU, or violates any state, local or federal laws, or commits repeated acts of incompetence, negligence, inattention or irresponsibility. This includes violations or acts caused by BMCC's employees, assistants or other agents.
  - C. Owner may terminate this MOU upon thirty (30) days written notice upon the Room not being used for the stated purpose and/or the BMCC losing its status as a nonprofit charitable or civic organization.
  - D. This MOU shall automatically terminate upon the destruction of the building. For purposes of this paragraph the building shall be considered destroyed if it becomes physically unsuitable to operate as an office to disseminate information to the public or promote tourism, by way of any cause, or state, local, or federal law prohibits its use as an office to disseminate information to the public or promote tourism.

- 12. Waiver: Any waiver by Owner of a breach by BMCC, BMCC's employees, agents, or assistants of the terms of this MOU shall not constitute a waiver by Owner of future breaches of the same or other provisions.
- 13. Notices: Any notices made hereunder must be sent to the following addresses:

- 14. Proof of Corporate and/or Nonprofit Status: BMCC shall provide Owner with satisfactory evidence of BMCC's corporate and/or nonprofit status within twenty (20) working days after receiving it written request.
- 15. Assignment: this MOU may not be assigned. BMCC may no sublease.
- 16. Governing Law: This MOU shall be construed and governed by the laws of the State of Nevada.
- 17. Severability: If any Covenant, phase, clause, paragraph, section, condition or provision contained within this MOU is invalidated by a court of competent jurisdiction, then the invalidity shall in no way affect any other covenant, phrase, clause, paragraph, section, condition, or provision contained in this MOU.

## NRS 244.284 Lease or conveyance of real property of county to corporation for public benefit.

- 1. In addition to the powers conferred by NRS 450.500, the board of county commissioners may:
- (a) Lease any of the real property of the county for a term not exceeding 99 years; or
- (b) Convey any of the real property of the county, except property of the county that is operated or occupied by the county fair and recreation board, without consideration,
- if such real property is not needed for the public purposes of the county and is leased or conveyed to a corporation for public benefit, and the property is actually used for charitable or civic purposes.
- 2. A lease or conveyance pursuant to this section may be made on such terms and conditions as seem proper to the board of county commissioners.
- 3. If a corporation for public benefit to which property is conveyed pursuant to this section ceases to use the property for charitable or civic purposes, the property automatically reverts to the county.
  - 4. As used in this section, "corporation for public benefit" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 82.021. (Added to NRS by 1963, 690; A 1969, 218; 1975, 571; 2001, 1710; 2003, 918)

#### RECITALS

WHEREAS, Lander County is a political subdivision of the State of Nevada hereinafter referred to as "County"; and

WHEREAS, Battle Mountain General Hospital, a District hospital formed and existing pursuant to the provisions of chapter 450 of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS), hereinafter referred to as "Hospital," pursuant to NRS Chapter 277; and

WHEREAS, County and Hospital recognize the necessity of entering into a mutually satisfactory arrangement to provide for the immunizations, medication and supplies for the Community Health Nurse (CHN);

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, conditions and other good and valuable consideration contained herein, the parties hereby agree as follows:

### TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. Obligations of BMGH:
  - A. BMGH shall provide the immunizations, medication and supplies for the CHN.
  - B. BMGH shall provide these items at cost and bill County at the address listed below.
- 2. Obligations of County:
  - A. County CHN shall provide in written form all immunizations, medication and supplies necessary in the performance of her duties. All items must be signed for and picked up by the CHN only.
- 3 Effective Date: This Agreement shall not become effective until and unless approved by appropriate official action of the governing body/official of each of the parties.
- 4. Liability and Hold Harmless: To the extent authorized by law, County agrees to indemnify and hold harmless BMGH from any loss, damage, liability, cost or expense to the person or property of another, which is caused by the intentional or negligent acts of County, its officers, employees or agents. Moreover, County agrees to indemnify and hold harmless BMGH from any claim or

potential claim from CHN, its officers, employees, agents or guests resulting from any loss, damage, liability, cost or expense caused by any reason.

- 5. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and may not be changed except by an instrument in writing signed by County and BMGH. In the event any provision shall be determined to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect the other or remaining provisions.
- 6. Termination: This Agreement may be Terminated prior to the expiration of the term as follows:
  - A. BMGH or County may terminate this Agreement with or without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice served upon the other party as provided in this Agreement.

# INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT Between LANDER COUNTY And LANDER COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE

### RECITALS

WHEREAS, LCSO operates a county jail facility in Lander County, Nevada, which houses inmates, and other persons awaiting legal proceedings;

WHEREAS, from time to time, LCSO must provide certain testing and immunizations, and follow up to certain inmates housed within its jail facility;

WHEREAS, the County and LCSO recognize the necessity of entering into a mutually satisfactory arrangement to provide for the non-emergency medical needs of the inmates;

WHEREAS, the parties desire to provide for an agreement in connection with medical services required for the non-emergency needs of the inmates during the term of the Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, conditions and other good and valuable consideration contained herein, the parties hereby agree as follows:

### TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. Obligations of Community Health Nurse (CHN): CHN shall provide the following to LCSO:
  - A. CHN shall provide routine lab collection's, immunizations, and various testing (i.e.: STD, TB, Pregnancy) required in the care of inmates housed at the jail facility. These services will be provided on a fair and equal basis.
  - B. CHN agrees to perform all work and functions at all times in strict accordance with ethical and professional standards of the American Medical Association, and other applicable codes
- 2. Obligations of LCSO: LCSO shall provide the following to CHN:
  - A. LCSO shall provide a suitable room with appropriate lighting, cleanliness standards, and equipment, including such equipment and supplies as may be necessary to prevent the spread of infectious disease of inmates housed in the facility.

- B. LCSO shall provide appropriate protection to insure the safety of the CHN.
- Effective Date: This Agreement shall not become effective until and unless approved by appropriate official action of the governing body/official of each of the parties.
- Liability and Hold Harmless: To the extent authorized by law, CHN agrees to indemnify and hold harmless LCSO from any loss, damage, liability, cost or expense to the person or property of another, which is caused by the intentional or negligent acts of CHN, its officers, employees or agents. Moreover, CHN agrees to indemnify and hold harmless LCSO from any claim or potential claim from CHN, its officers, employees, agents or guests resulting from any loss, damage, liability, cost or expense caused by any reason.
- 5. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and may not be changed except by an instrument in writing signed by Lander County and Lander County Sheriff's Office. In the event any provision shall be determined to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect the other or remaining provisions.

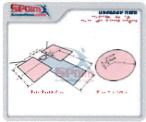

### **Field Hockey Field Dimensions**

Any official field hockey game governed by the International Hockey Federation (IHF) is played on a synthetic surface called turf. Grass is rarely used for national and international games these days, although small local hockey clubs may still use this surface.

The hockey field, also called pitch is a standard size around the world and includes basic markings. Markings should be drawn in white and as solid lines or arcs, with a width of 3 inches (0.075 meter) which is already factored into the measurements given below.

Dimensions and Markings for the Field Hockey Pitch

### Pitch boundary:

The pitch on which field hockey is played has a length of 299 feet, 10 inches (91.4 meters) and a width of 180 feet, 5 inches (55.0 meters). This boundary is marked on the turf and the shorter lines are called backlines.

### Centerline:

A straight line is drawn midway between the backlines, and parallel to them. This centerline divides the pitch into two equal parts.

#### 25-yard line:

In each half, another parallel line is drawn at a distance of 75 feet, 2 inches (22.9 meters) from the backline. This distance converts to 25 yards, hence this is called the 25-yard line. Now the pitch is divided into four equal parts.

### Striking circle or "D":

From the center of each backline, a point is marked 6 feet (1.8 meters) away and a quarter-circle arc having a radius of 48 feet (14.6 meters) is drawn from here on the inside of the field. The two quarter-circles are joined at the top by a straight line measuring 12 feet (3.7 meters) to form the D-shaped striking circle, also referred to as the "D". Another set of quarter circles are drawn outside these and 18 feet, 1 inch (5.5 meters) away. These arcs are not solid, but dashed.

### **Penalty Spot:**

From the center of the baseline, this point is marked 21 feet (6.4 meters) towards the inside of the pitch with a width of 6 inches (0.2 meter).

### **Penalty Corner Defender's and Attacker's Marks:**

#### 6/15/2018

At 16 feet, 5 inches (5.0 meters) and 32 feet, 10 inches (10.0 meters) away from the center of each backline in either direction, a line having a length of 1 foot (0.3 meter) is drawn. Thus, each backline will have four such markings. These are known as the penalty corner defender's and attacker's marks, respectively.

### Long Corner Attacker's Mark:

Along each sideline at 16 feet, 5 inches (5.0 meters) from the backline, a line 1 foot (0.3 meter) long is drawn to form this mark.

Dimensions and Specifications for the Goal Area

#### **Goal Post:**

Each goal post has a height of 7 feet (2.14 meters) and a width of 2 inches (0.05 meter). These posts are white.

#### Goal:

Each post is placed 6 feet (1.83 meters) away from the center of the backline, one on either side, with a depth of 4 feet (1.2 meters). This makes the total goal width 12 feet (3.66 meters).

### Sideboards and Blackboards:

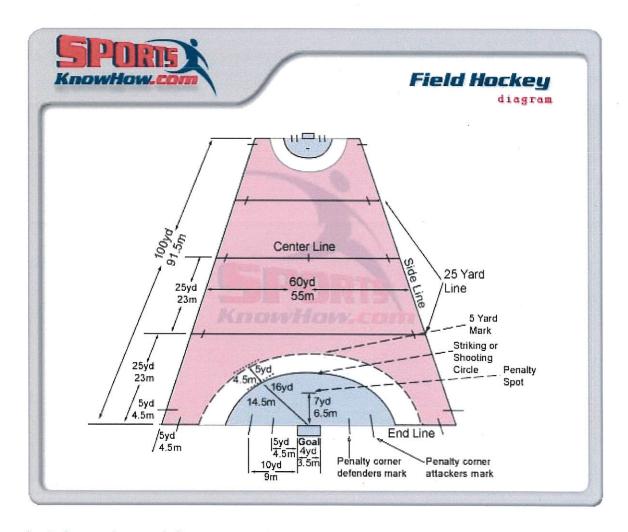
These have a height of 1 foot, 6 inches (0.5 meter) from the ground. The backboard runs the length of the goal and is 12 feet (3.66 meters) across. The sideboard depth is 4 feet (1.20 meters) at ground level and both are placed in parallel for each goal, perpendicular to the backboard. The color of the backboard and sideboards should be darker than that of the pitch.

#### Net:

The black net consists of mesh whose spacing should not exceed 1.6 inches (0.04 meter). It is fixed to the goal posts, bar, sideboards and backboard at intervals of 6 inches (0.15 meter) or less, to form netting around the top, sides and back of the goal. This net should not be fixed too taut; this is to stop the ball that is hit into the goal from rebounding off the net.

#### **Overall Rink Dimensions**

The official size of a hockey rink is 200 ft long and 85 ft wide. The rounded corners will have a radius of 28 feet. The rink will be surrounded by "boards" made of wood or fibreglass which will be not less than 40" high, and no higher than 48" above the ice surface. The ice and boards will be white, except where authorized by the league, eg: board advertising and on ice advertising. Around the entire length of the boards there will be a yellow kickplate.

#### **Goal Posts and Nets**

The net is placed in the centre of a line 2" wide line sand 13 feet from the back of rink and centred between the side boards. This line extends across the entire width of the rink and up the boards and is commonly known as the goal line. The net is held in place by 8" yellow flexible pegs. If the rink is longer than 200 feet, the goal line may be placed no more than 15 feet from the end boards with prior approval of the league.

Two goal posts 48" high and 6 feet apart when measured from the inside and a cross bar made of the same material as the posts extends from the top of one post to the other.

A white nylon mesh is attached to the frame of the net so that when the puck is shot into the net, the puck will not come out of the net. Around the base of the net is a white canvas skirt. This skirt has to fastened 6" back from the goal post and cannot prevent the puck from entering the net, and cannot be more than 1" higher than the base plate.

The goal posts and cross bars must be painted red, and all other exterior surfaces will be white.

#### The Goal Crease

The area in front of the goal is an area known as the crease an is demarked by a 2" wide red line.

The goal crease also includes the space above the ice surface as defined by the crease up to the height of the goal (4ft). The area inside the crease is painted light blue (paint code PMS 298) and the area inside the goal is painted gloss white.

### **Division of Ice Surface**

The ice is divided into 3 parts by the two blue lines which are located 60' from the goal lines. Each blue line is 12" in width, and is painted across the rink and continue up the sides of the boards.

The defending zone is that zone where the team defending the goal is located. The attack zone is the zone at the far end of the ring opposite the defending zone, and the neutral zone is the area between the attacking and defending zone.

The centre red line is 12" in width and is painted across the ice divides the rink into two equal halves. The red line is broken up in equal divisions, but has continuous edges.

### **Centre Ice Spot and Circle**

Exactly in the centre of the rink a 12" blue spot will denote the centre of the rink. Using this as a centre point, a circle with a 15' radius, and 2" wide blue lines shall be drawn.

### **Face off Spots in the Neutral Zone**

These are 2' in diameter and are 5' from the blue line. They are 44 feet apart and equidistant from the boards on each side of the rink.

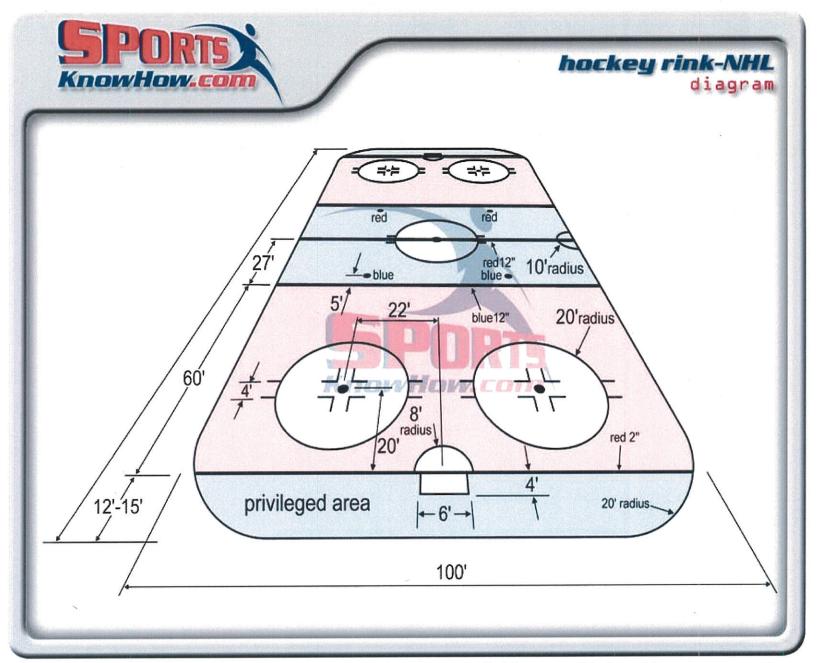
### **End Zone Face-off Spots and Circles**

In each end zone, on both sides of the rink a red face off spot is marked. The circle is 2' in diameter. Running parallel to the end boards, a 3" wide line is drawn down each side of the face-off dot. Using the face off dot as the centre point, a face off circle with a radius of 15' is drawn with 2" wide lines. Two red lines are drawn on the outer edge of the circle to denote player positions during a face off. These lines are painted parallel to the goal line at the points on the circle that are closest to, and furthest from the boards. The lines are 2" wide, 2 feet long and 3 feet apart. Hash marks are drawn on the ice to denote the position of the players who are taking the face off.

The face off circles are located 20 feet out from the goal line, and 22 feet away from a line drawn between the centre of the 2 goals.

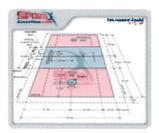

The midfield line divides the length of the field in half. Markings on the midfield line include perpendicular markings for the "wing area"

The "wing area" is marked 10 yards in from the sidelines (20 yards in from the center) of the field.

### **Attack Area & Defensive Area**

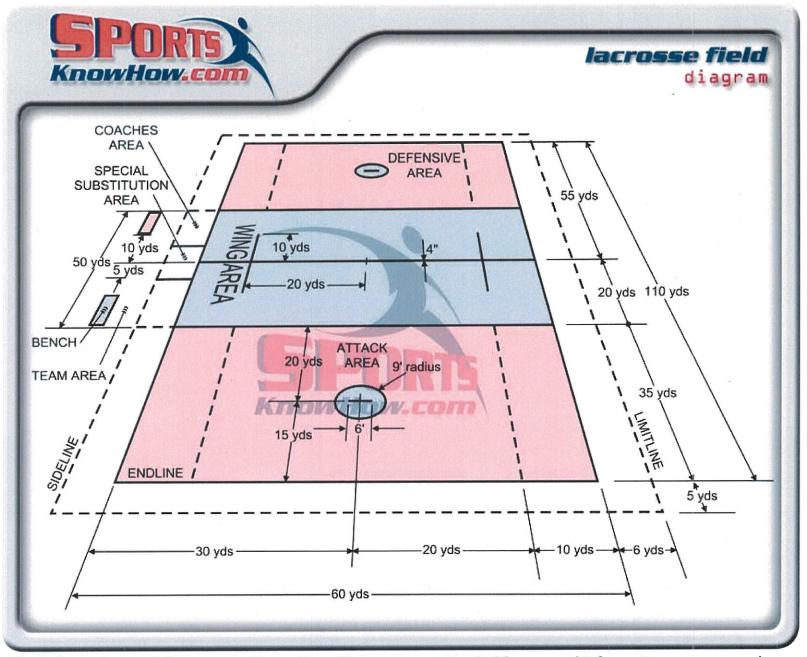

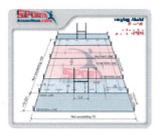

### **Outside Dimensions**

The exterior dimensions of a rugby field are not to be greater than 144 meters long including the Dead Ball Line. The width should not be greater than 70 meters

### **Halfway Line**

The halfway line marks the field in half regardless of the size of the field.

### 10 Meter Line

The 10 meter line is marked 10 meters from the halfway line on either side. The 10 meter line marks the distance that a kickoff must go before the opposing team may gain possession of the ball.

#### 22 Meter Line

The 22 meter line is measured from the goal line (or try line). This is the line marks the spot play is restarted.

#### In Goal

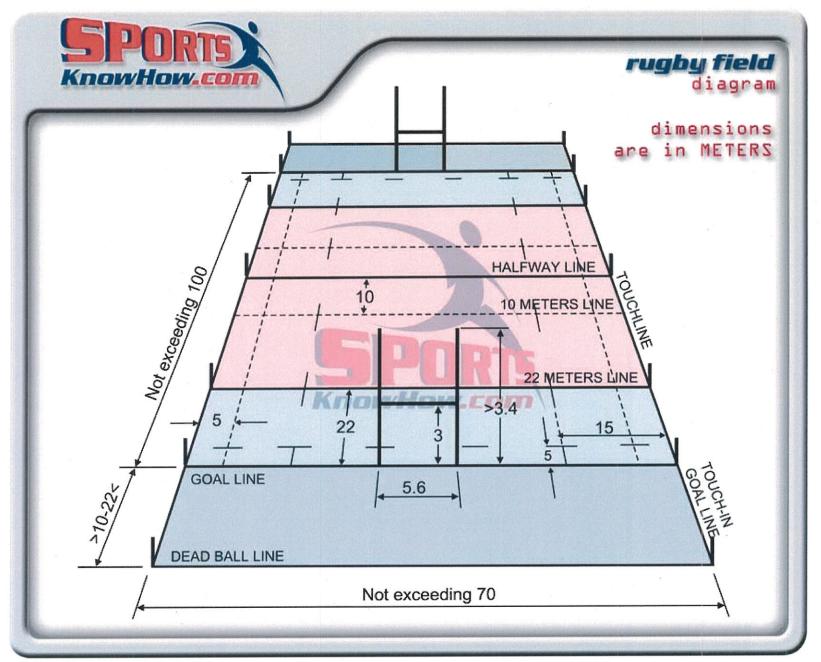
The "in goal" is the equivalent of the end zone in football. It is marked by the Goal Line and the Dead Ball Line. The size of the In Goal is not less than 10 meters and not greater than 22 meters.

### The Goal Post

The goal post in Rugby shares the same dimensions as NFL Football. In meters the goal is 5.6 meters wide and 3 meters high at the crossbar.

### **Adult Soccer Field Dimensions:**

### **Overall Dimensions**

The overall dimensions of a regulation soccer field is 100 yards long and 60 yards wide.

#### **Midfield Line**

The middle of the field is divided lengthwise by the midfield line.

#### **Center Circle**

In the center of the field a 10 yard circle marks the area where defenders must stay outside of at the start of a kickoff

### **Penalty Area**

A rectangular box (sometimes called the "penalty box") centered on the goal marks the penalty area. This box is 44 yards wide by 18 yards deep. It includes an arc 10 yards from the "penalty mark". Fouls comitted in this area may result in a penalty kick.

### **Penalty Mark**

The penalty mark inside the "penalty area" 12 yards from the end line. The penalty mark is where "penalty kicks" are placed.

### **Goal Area**

The goal area is a smaler rectangle inside the "penalty area", centered on the goal. The measurements of this box are 20 yards wide by 6 yards deep. This box marks the area from which a goal kick must be placed.

#### **Corner Kick**

A one yard quarter circle is marked on each corner of the field to mark where a player must place the ball prior to a corner kick.

### The Goal

The adult soccer goal is 24 feet wide by 8 feet high.

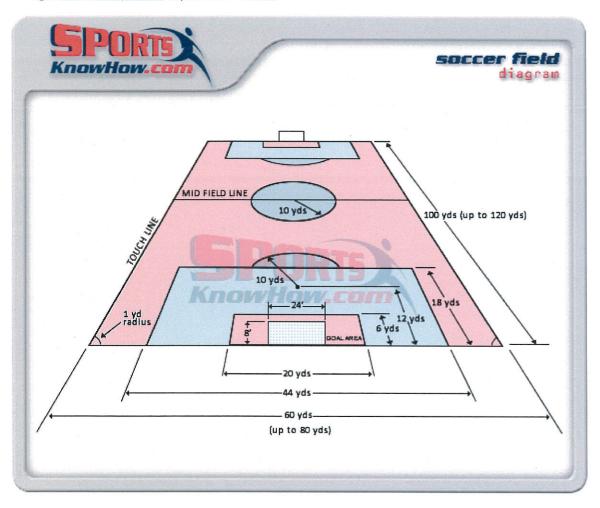

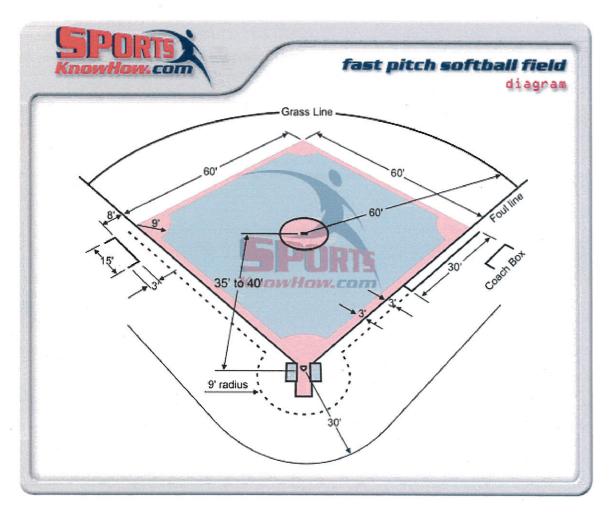

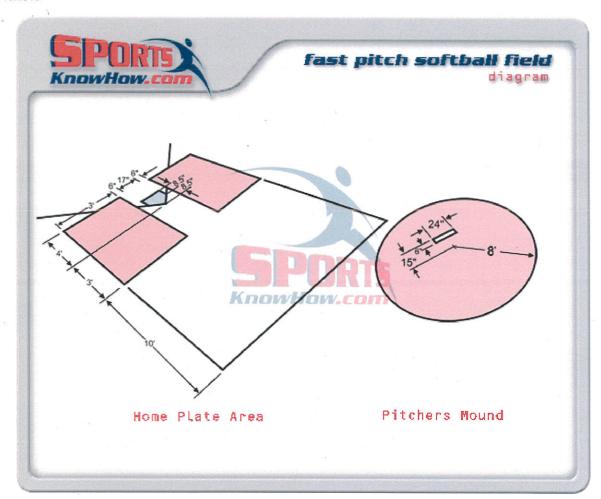

## FAST PITCH SOFTBALL FIELD DIMENSIONS

### **Outfield Measurements**

Softball Field Dimensions vary in overall size when you are talking about the outfield measurements. Many times these measurements are affected by the size of the lot the field is on. Softball leagues themselves will adopt differing outfield sizes depending on levels of play and other factors.

Common fence distances start at 150 feet for the younger ages and extend to over 225 feet for the older ages. These measurements are also different for men's verses women's leagues and fast pitch vs. slow pitch rules.

### **Distances Between Bases**

The typical distance between the bases for a softball field is 60 feet.

## **Pitchers Mound**

The distance from Pitchers Mound to Home Plate vary by age and type of softball field also. For adult slow pitch this distance can range from 35 to 53 feet. For fast pitch softball the measurement is more likely 35 to 40 feet.

### The Grass Line or Rim of the Infield

Typically the Grass Line is 60 feet in a semi-circle in cumference from the Pitchers Mound (rubber).

#### **Catchers Area**

The catchers area is usually designated by a 9 foot radius around Home Plate until it intersects with the 3 foot mark designating the baselines.

#### **Coaches Box**

The Coaches Box are generally placed along the 1st and 3rd baselines in line with the respective bases. The box itself is usually 15 feet long by 3 feet wide.

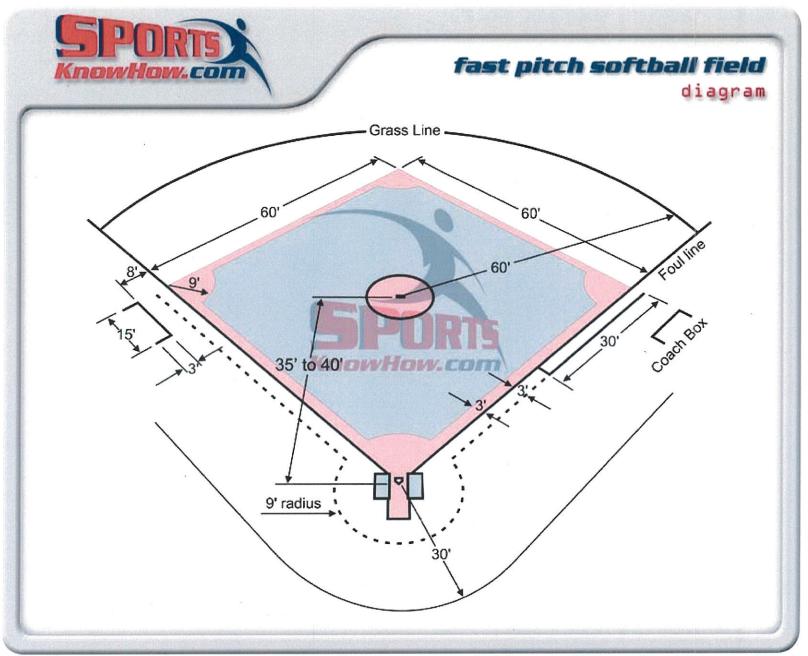
### The Infield Fence

An infield fence is constructed to protect players and fans alike extending past both 1st and 3rd base to behind the catchers box and home plate. This fence is usually 25 to 30 feet behind home plate.

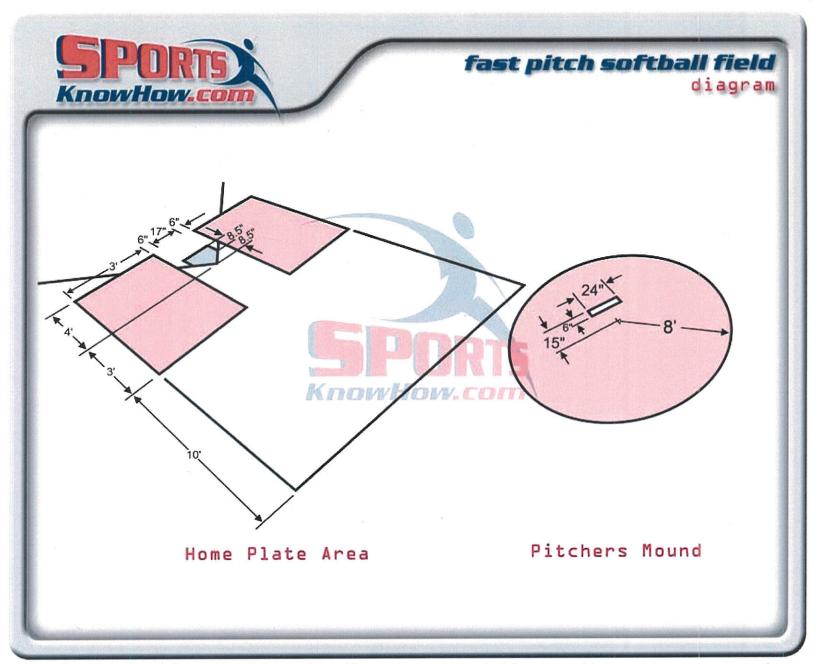

### **Overall Dimensions**

The overall size of a tennis doubles court is 36 feet wide by 78 feet long. The singles court is slightly narrower measuring 27 feet wide. Both singles and doubles courts share the same length.

#### The Service Court

The service court fits inside the singles width of the court (27 feet wide) and extends back from the net 21 feet. The service court is divided in half with a center line marking the left and right service courts.

#### The Net

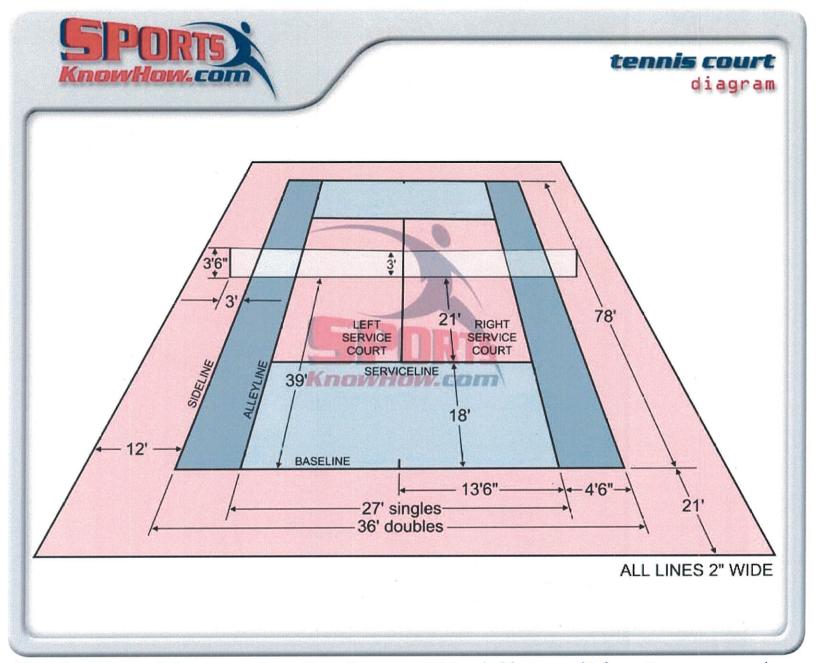
The net measures 3 feet 6 inches high at the ends and 3 feet high at the middle tape. Typically the net standards are placed 3 feet outside the outer lines of the doubles court, making the net length a total of 42 feet from pole to pole.

### Distance from other Courts and Fencing

It is adviseable to have a distance of a 12 foot perimeter on each side of the sidelines and 21 feet from each baseline to create enough playing area inside fencing and adjacent tennis courts.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF LANDER COUNTY, NEVADA PROVIDING FOR THE TRANSFER OF THE COUNTY'S 2018 PRIVATE ACTIVITY BOND VOLUME CAP TO THE NEVADA RURAL HOUSING AUTHORITY; AND OTHER MATTERS RELATED THERETO

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 348A of the Nevada Revised Statutes ("NRS") and Chapter 348A of the Nevada Administrative Code ("NAC"), there has been allocated to Lander County, Nevada (the "County"), the amount of \$326,740.57 in tax-exempt private activity bond volume cap for year 2018 (the "2018 Bond Cap"); and

WHEREAS, the Nevada Rural Housing Authority (the "NRHA"), has requested that the County transfer its 2018 Bond Cap to the NRHA for the purpose of providing a means of financing the costs of single family residential housing that will provide decent, safe and sanitary dwellings at affordable prices for persons of low and moderate income ("Single Family Programs"); and

WHEREAS, the County is a local government as defined by NAC 348A.070; and

Whereas, Section 348A.180 of the NAC provides a procedure whereby the County may, by resolution, transfer to any other local government located within the same county, all or any portion of its 2018 Bond Cap; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to NRS 315.983(1)(a), the NRHA is an instrumentality, local government and political subdivision of the State of Nevada (the "State"); and

WHEREAS, the NRHA is located within the County, pursuant to NRS 315.963, which defines the NRHA's area of operation as "any area of the State which is not included within the corporate limits of a city or town having a population of 150,000 or more."

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Commissioners of the County does hereby find, resolve, determine and order as follows:

- Section 1. Recitals. The recitals set forth herein above are true and correct in all respects.
- Section 2. Transfer of Private Activity Bond Volume Cap. Pursuant to NAC 348A.180, the County hereby transfers 2018 Bond Cap in the amount of \$326,740.57 to the NRHA for its Single Family Programs.
- Section 3. Use of 2018 Bond Cap. The NRHA will use the 2018 Bond Cap for single family purposes in calendar year 2018, or carry forward any remaining amount according to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, for such purposes.

- Section 4. Representative of County. Pursuant to NAC 348A.180(1), the Director may contact Keith Westengard, regarding this Resolution at (775) 635-2885 or in writing at 825 N. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Battle Mountain, NV 89820.
- Section 5. Additional Action. The Chairman of the Board of Commissioners and the Clerk of the County are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions as necessary to effectuate the transfer of the 2018 Bond Cap, and carry out the duties of the County hereunder, including the execution of all certificates pertaining to the transfer as required by NAC 348A.
- Section 6. Direction to the NRHA. The NRHA shall notify the Director in writing as soon as practicable of the occurrence or nonoccurrence of any term or condition that would affect the disposition of the 2018 Bond Cap.
- Section 7. Representative of the NRHA. Pursuant to NAC 348A.180(3), the Director may contact Diane Arvizo, Director of Homeownership Programs of the NRHA regarding this Resolution at (775) 886-7900 or in writing at Nevada Rural Housing Authority, 3695 Desatoya Drive, Carson City, Nevada 89701.
- Section 8. Obligation of the County. This Resolution is not to be construed as a pledge of the faith and credit of or by the County, or of any agency, instrumentality, or subdivision of the County. Nothing in this Resolution obligates or authorizes the County to issue bonds for any project or to grant approvals for a project or constitutes a representation that such bonds will be issued.
- Section 9. Enforceability. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Resolution. This Resolution shall go into effect immediately upon its passage.

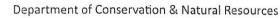

The Nevada Division of Environmental Protection (NDEP) has reviewed the *Spill Report Truck Spill US Highway 50, Mile Marker 13, Lander County, Nevada* report prepared by Anthony Dimpel CEM of McGinley and Associates (MGA) on behalf of Thomas Hoffman Trucking. This letter provides a no further action determination for the right of way on the south side of US Highway 50 near Mile Marker 13 at the above-referenced facility and applies to other places contaminants related to this release have come to be located (NAC 445A.3452).

The June 11, 2018 report contains a request for a no further action determination from the NDEP.

The NDEP has reviewed information contained in the Corrective Action file that has been provided by Thomas Hoffman Trucking and Anthony Dimpel, CEM. Based on this review, no contaminants remain in soil or groundwater above action levels or remediation standards; therefore, the NDEP has determined that no further assessment or remediation is required to be protective of human health and the environment (NAC 445A.227(1)).

NDEP may re-evaluate this decision if conditions at the site change or if new or previously unidentified information becomes available that: 1) alters the results of the site evaluation; and 2) demonstrates a potential detrimental impact on human health or the environment.
