SECTION 2: EXERCISE DESIGN SUMMARY

Exercise Purpose and Design

This exercise was designed with the intention of training members of the community, in both volunteer and professional capacity, to fully execute an incident using the Incident Command System in preparation for a real-life event. With aid from the Local Emergency Planning Commission, Lander County was able to coordinate with the Nevada State Health Division Public Health Preparedness Program to train POD staff members/volunteers in the use of the POD trailer. The POD was designed around the POD 'drive-through lane' design introduced and explained in the 'Mass Dispensing Plan for Rural Nevada.

Exercise Objectives, Capabilities, and Activities

Capabilities-based planning allows for exercise planning teams to develop exercise objectives and observe exercise outcomes through a framework of specific action items that were derived from the Target Capabilities List (TCL). The capabilities listed below form the foundation for the organization of all objectives and observations in this exercise. Additionally, each capability is linked to several corresponding activities and tasks to provide additional detail.

Based upon the identified exercise objectives below, the exercise planning team has decided to demonstrate the following capabilities during this exercise:

- Objective 1: To pre-identify and train POD Command and logistical staff/volunteers who will fill critical roles within Lander County's POD Deployment Response plan.
 - Capability: On-Site Incident Management
 - Activity 1.1: Identify a roster of personnel and schedule a state-provided "POD Trailer Training Course."
 - Activity 1.2: Prepare the designated POD site, as per Attachment 24a/24b of the Mass Dispensing Plan for Rural Nevada (MDPRN).
- Objective 2: To activate, assemble, stage, and train pre-identified POD staff/volunteers to support this event.
 - Capability: Volunteer Management and Donations
 - Activity 2.1: Mobilize 100% of pre-identified POD staff/volunteers and have them report on time to the staging area located in the parking lot area near the Health Clinic.
 - Activity 2.2: Conduct Just-In-Time-Training (JITT) for all POD staff/volunteers as per the Mass Dispensing Plan for Rural Nevada.
- Objective 3: To conduct POD operations and demobilization in accordance with the Mass Dispensing Plan for Rural Nevada.
 - Capability: On-Site Incident Management

- Objective 4: To conduct POD operations and demobilization in accordance with agency/jurisdiction safety and health programs for clients, volunteers, and staff.
 - Capability: Responder Safety and Health
 - Activity 4.2: Open and maintain on-site first aid station within 30 minutes from the initial responder's arrival on site through demobilization.

No scenario was used for this exercise.

SECTION 3: ANALYSIS OF CAPABILITIES

This section of the report reviews the performance of the exercised capabilities, activities, and tasks. In this section, observations are organized by capability and associated activities. The capabilities linked to the exercise objectives of the Lander County POD FSE are listed below. followed by corresponding activities. Each activity is followed by related observations, which include references, analysis, and recommendations.

Capability Summary:

Activity 1: Mass Prophylaxis: Activity: Develop and Maintain Plans, Procedures, Programs and Systems

Observation 1:1 Strength-Detailed and exercised POD plans have been in place and used annually since, this was the First Rural Drive thru POD. These plans have been revised and finely tuned by experienced PHP staff with input from local partners.

Observation 1:2 No improvements

Activity 2: Activate Mass Prophylaxis Dispensing Operations

Observation 2:1 Strength - Event was well organized and planned and was activated promptly as advertised to the public. There was minimal waiting and the traffic flow was steady without back logs.

Observation 2:2 Area to improve – More signage where to enter at, more help for filling out the consents.

Activity 3: Establish Points of Dispensing

Observation 3:1 Strength – The POD went very well at this location.

Observation 3:2 Area for Improvement – Communication with the nurses filling the syringes inside the building for the count down.

Activity 4: Conduct Triage for Symptoms

Observation 4:1 Strength - Screening for symptoms was an integrated part of the questionnaire for vaccination. A medical officer was available to the screeners at all times if there were questions about eligibility for prophylaxis.

Observation 4:2 Area for improvement – Consider including signage placed upon entering the event, describing symptoms, if any, that would exclude participants from receiving vaccination. This will reduce exposure to non-sick persons and prevent persons

with symptoms from waiting in line unnecessarily.

Activity 5: Monitor Adverse Events

Observation 5:1 Strength - Participants were given written information in a language that they can understand (VIS) at the time of registration, which describes adverse reactions, what actions to take and when to obtain follow up care for these symptoms. Staff was educated on the VAERS program prior to this event.

Observation 5:2 No improvement

Activity 6: Demobilize Mass Prophylaxis Operations

Observation 6:1 Strength - Again, the staff is well-versed in set up and break-down of the POD unit. There were adequate staffers to start breaking down half of the lanes prior to the close of the POD, allowing the POD trailer to be partially packed prior to the close of the event. The trailer "map" was used and the equipment was packed in the trailer in place for the next event, without extensive organizing. All equipment was accounted for at the end of the event.

Observation 6:2 No improvement

Analysis:

Lander County Incident Command collaborated with the Nevada State Health Division for medical and non-medical supplies, including the POD trailer, communications equipment and expertise. The POD trailer was successfully demobilized within one hour.

The POD Organizational Chart was completed and people were matched with their duties in accordance with training and skills sets. A representative from NVHSD briefed all POD participants on processing procedures, just-in-time-training (JITT), and volunteering in a POD FSE.

Recommendations:

- 1. Increase the safety by turning the Medical Dispense Station 15 degrees.
- 2. Increase the number of vaccines administered by having the consents available prior to the event.
- 3. Improve the flow into POD area by increase signage.
- 4. Improve the communications between logistics/operations.
- 5. Aggressive no walking publicity campaign of "no walk policy and free transportation provided".

 Recruit and train addition staff to fill key roles within the ICS used to maintain command, control, and coordination of emergency response during a public health emergency.

SECTION 4: CONCLUSION

The 2011 Lander County POD Deployment FSE exercise provided POD Command staff and volunteers the opportunity to receive training and execute a drive-through POD design. The County was able to work together as state, county and local entities to plan and implement a POD FSE. Additionally, residents were given the opportunity to receive the Seasonal Influenza Vaccine and protect themselves and their loved ones against the flu.

The 'Mass Dispensing Plan for Rural Nevada' calls for 25 persons to fill the staffing requirements. The 2011 Lander County POD Deployment had 34 participants. Together, the POD staff was able to demonstrate the capabilities described in section three: Communications, On-Site Incident Management, Critical Resource Logistics and Distribution, Volunteer Management and Donations, and Mass Prophylaxis.

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INDEPENDENT BUILDING INSPECTOR AGREEMENT

This INDEPENDENT BUILDING INSPECTOR AGREEMENT, hereinafter referred to as "Agreement" is made by and between the Lander County Building Department, hereinafter referred to as ("BUILDING DEPARTMENT"), and Guy Rock, an individual, hereinafter referred to as ("ROCK").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, ROCK desires to provide professional services for a professional fee in connection providing building inspection services in Southern Lander County as an Independent Contractor for BUILDING DEPARTMENT; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, conditions and other good and valuable consideration contained herein, the parties hereby agree as follows:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. <u>Purpose</u>: ROCK shall, subject to all terms, conditions, and limitations specified hereinafter, perform the professional building inspection services in Southern Lander County as an Independent Contractor for BUILDING DEPARTMENT to conduct building inspections and other duties as provided to ROCK by BUILDING DEPARTMENT.
- 2. <u>Term</u>: This Agreement shall remain in effect from July 1, 2012 to the June 30, 2013. This term shall be subject to earlier termination as hereafter provided.
- 3. Payment: ROCK shall work on an as needed basis and BUILDING DEPARTMENT shall pay ROCK seventy dollars (\$70.00) per hour, one half hour (1/2 hr) minimum per inspection. ROCK shall receive compensation for his mileage at the rate allowed by Lander County in the process of carrying out the services set forth in this Agreement, hourly rate to include travel to and from inspections. ROCK shall submit bi-weekly statements of services rendered and reimbursable expenses, and BUILDING DEPARTMENT shall provide prompt payment to ROCK, not to exceed thirty (30) days of receipt of bi-weekly statement. Service invoices must be received by the Building Official by no later than twelve o'clock noon (12:00) on the Wednesday one week prior to each scheduled Commission Meeting.
- 4. <u>Liability and Hold Harmless</u>: To the extent authorized by law, ROCK agrees to indemnify and hold harmless BUILDING DEPARTMENT and Lander County from any loss, damage, liability, cost or expense to the person or property of another, which is caused by the intentional or negligent acts of ROCK, its officers, employees or agents.

Moreover, ROCK agrees to indemnify and hold harmless BUILDING DEPARTMENT and Lander County from any claim or potential claim from ROCK, its officers, employees, agents or guests resulting from any loss, damage, liability, cost or expense caused by any reason.

- 5. <u>Training</u>. ROCK shall, at his expense, maintain required CEU's required by ICC to perform inspections, copies of all training certificates must be provided to BUIDING DEPARTMENT.
- 6. Communication. ROCK and BUILDING DEPARTMENT shall maintain, at minimum, weekly communication via e-mail or telephone or in person regarding all projects associated with inspection services or violations. BUILDING DEPARTMENT shall issue project permits and provide project plans to ROCK via e-mail, US mail or by personal visit. In the event Rock is absent from the area and inspections have been scheduled during the absence, the Building Department shall be notified as far in advance as possible of the absence in order to schedule said inspections through the Battle Mountain Office. A weatherproof container shall be kept at the ROCK property for storage of files/documents and construction plans in the event the Battle Mountain Inspector must perform inspections. All construction documentation for each scheduled project must be accessible during ROCK's absence and shall be left at the storage location after each inspection has been completed by the Battle Mountain Inspector.
- 7. Independent Contractor. ROCK is associated with BUILDING DEPARTMENT and Lander County only for the purposes and to the extent specified in this Agreement, and in respect to performance of the contracted services pursuant to this Agreement, ROCK is and shall be an independent contractor and, subject only to the terms of this Agreement, shall have the sole right to supervise, manage, operate, control, and direct performance of the details incident to its duties under this Agreement. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall be deemed or construed to create a partnership or joint venture, to create relationships of an employer-employee or principal-agent, or to otherwise create any liability for BUILDING DEPARTMENT and Lander County whatsoever with respect to the indebtedness, liabilities, and obligations of ROCK or any other party. ROCK shall be solely responsible for, and BUILDING DEPARTMENT and Lander County shall have no obligation with respect to: (1) withholding of income taxes, FICA or any other taxes or fees; (2) industrial insurance coverage; (3) participation in any group insurance plans available to employees of the State; (4) participation or contributions by either ROCK or Lander County to the Public Employees Retirement System; (5) accumulation of vacation leave or sick leave; or (6) unemployment compensation coverage provided by Lander ROCK shall indemnify and hold BUILDING DEPARTMENT and Lander County harmless from, and defend BUILDING DEPARTMENT and Lander County against, any and all losses, damages, claims, costs, penalties, liabilities, and expenses arising or incurred because of, incident to, or otherwise with respect to any such taxes or fees. Neither ROCK nor his or her employees, agents, nor representatives, shall be considered employees, agents, or representatives of Lander County.

- 8. Amendment or Modification: Both parties acknowledge and agree that they have not relied upon any statements, representations, agreements, or warranties, in entering into this Agreement, except as are stated herein, and no amendment or modification of this Agreement shall be valid or binding unless expressed in writing and executed by both the parties.
- 9. <u>Termination</u>: This Agreement may be Terminated prior to the expiration of the term as follows:
 - a. BUILDING DEPARTMENT or ROCK may terminate this Agreement with or without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice served upon the other party as provided in this Agreement.
 - b. BUILDING DEPARTMENT and ROCK may agree in writing to terminate this Agreement at any time.
 - c. Upon termination, ROCK shall be compensated work performed prior to the termination.
 - d. Upon termination, ROCK shall return to BUILDING DEPARTMENT all materials, code related and office related previously provided by BUILDING DEPARTMENT.
- 10. <u>Notices</u>: All notices or other communications required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given if delivered personally in hand or mailed certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid on the date posted, and addressed to the other party at the address set forth below:

- 11. <u>Waiver</u>: Any waiver by either party of any breach of any kind or character whatsoever by the other, whether such be direct or implied, shall not be construed as a continuing waiver of, or consent to, any subsequent breach of this Agreement.
- 12. <u>Assignment</u>: The rights granted and responsibilities incurred under this Agreement may not be assigned without the written consent of BUILDING DEPARTMENT.
- 13. <u>Third Party Beneficiaries</u>: The enforcement of the terms and conditions of this Agreement and all rights of action relating to such enforcement shall be strictly reserved to the parties of the Agreement. There are no third party beneficiaries to this Agreement,

- and nothing contained in or implied by this Agreement shall give or allow any such claim or right of action by any other or third person.
- 14. Governing Law: This Agreement shall be construed and governed by the laws of the State of Nevada. Any action arising from this Agreement must be filed in the Sixth Judicial District Court in and for the County of Lander.
- 15. Attorney's Fees: Should either party be required to pursue legal action to enforce the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled reasonable attorney fees and court costs.
- 16. Governmental Immunity: Nothing contained herein waives or is intended to waive any protections that may be applicable to BUILDING DEPARTMENT, Lander County or any of its elected or appointed officials, employees, or agents under any applicable statutes, rules or regulations providing governmental immunity, or any other rights, protections, immunities, defenses or limitations on liability to BUILDING DEPARTMENT or such related parties that are provided by law.
- 17. <u>Captions</u>: The headings used in this Agreement are inserted for reference purposes only and shall not be deemed to define, limit, extend, describe, or affect in any way the meaning, scope or interpretation of any of the terms or provisions of this Agreement or the intent hereof.
- 18. <u>Integration</u>: This Agreement shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties; all prior agreements between the parties, whether written or oral, are merged into this Agreement and shall be of no force or effect.
- 19. <u>Relationship</u>: This Agreement shall not be deemed to create a partnership between the parties in their respective endeavors or otherwise, nor cause them to be considered joint venturers or members of any joint enterprise.
- 20. <u>Force Majeure</u>: Neither party shall be responsible for any failure or delay in its performance under this Agreement due to causes beyond its reasonable control, including but not limited to, labor disputes, strikes, lockouts, shortages of or inability to obtain labor, energy, raw materials or supplies, war, riot, acts of God or governmental action.

Public comment.

Background:

The Agreement between Lander County and Scott Bullock, Bullock Mechanical, for lease of the storage/maintenance shop facility "Old Battle Mountain Water and Sewer Yard" located at 145 West Third Street, Battle Mountain, Nevada, is presented for Commission consideration.

The "Bullock Mechanical Lease Agreement" follows the parameters discussed and approved by the Commission for the lease of this County-owned facility during the regular meeting held August 23, 2012, (Agenda Item #4).

Recommended Action:

It is recommended that the Commission approve the Agreement between Lander County and Scott Bullock, Bullock Mechanical, for lease of the storage/maintenance shop facility "Old Battle Mountain Water and Sewer Yard" located at 145 West Third Street, Battle Mountain, Nevada.

BULLOCK MECHANICAL LEASE AGREEMENT

This Lease Agreement, hereinafter referred to as "Agreement" is made by and between Lander County, a political subdivision of the State of Nevada, hereinafter referred to as "Lander County," and Bullock Mechanical, hereinafter referred to as "Bullock."

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Bullock desires to use Lander County's property for the purpose of serving the local community with maintenance and repair services; and

WHEREAS, Lander County does not currently need or utilize the storage/maintenance shop located at 145 West 3rd Street, Battle Mountain, Nevada 89820, hereinafter referred to as "Shop," at the present time for other public purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Shop is less than 25,000 square feet and Lander County has complied with the provisions of NRS 244.2833 with regard to the Shop;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, conditions and other good and valuable consideration contained herein, the parties hereby agree as follows:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. <u>Purpose</u>: Bullock shall, subject to all terms, conditions, and limitations specified hereinafter, have the right to continue to use the Shop for the purpose of serving the local community with maintenance and repair services.
- 2. <u>Term</u>: This Agreement shall remain in effect from the date it is approved by both parties to the 15th day of September 2013. This term shall be subject to earlier termination as hereafter provided. This Agreement shall automatically renew each year, for a one year term unless terminated as hereafter provided or replaced by another agreement.
- 3. <u>Effective Date</u>: This Agreement shall not become effective until and unless approved by appropriate official action of the governing body/official of each of the parties.
- 4. Rental Payment: Bullock shall pay as rent two hundred dollars (\$200.00) per month upon execution of this agreement.
- 5. Maintenance and Utilities: Maintenance and utility obligations are as follows:
 - A. Lander County shall be responsible for the maintenance to the exterior of the Shop, landscape, grounds, and the parking lot.

- B. Lander County shall be responsible for the maintenance and repair to the plumbing, heating and electrical services and systems inside the Shop.
- C. Bullock shall provide general maintenance and cleaning of the interior of the Shop and shall keep the premises in good and safe order.
- D. Bullock is responsible for power and water utilities.

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- E. Lander County shall provide the maintenance and repairs required under this paragraph upon the submission of maintenance/repair requests submitted by Bullock and approved by Lander County.
- 6. <u>Liability and Hold Harmless</u>: To the extent authorized by law, Bullock agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Lander County from any loss, damage, liability, cost or expense to the person or property of another, which is caused by the intentional or negligent acts of Bullock, its officers, employees or agents. Moreover, Bullock agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Lander County from any claim or potential claim from Bullock, its officers, employees, agents or guests resulting from any loss, damage, liability, cost or expense caused by any reason.
- 7. <u>Insurance of Property</u>: Lander County shall be responsible for the insurance of the Shop and its appurtenances. Any proceeds that result from this Paragraph shall belong to Lander County. Lander County shall be under no obligation to use said proceeds to rebuild or repair the Shop to make it suitable for the purpose of this Agreement.
- 8. Improvements and Alterations: Bullock shall make no improvements or alterations to the Shop or grounds unless prior approval is granted in writing by Lander County. All improvements and alterations shall remain the property of Lander County upon termination of this Agreement unless Bullock can remove them without causing damage to the Shop. Bullock shall not receive any credit towards rent for any improvements or alterations.
- 9. <u>Surrender of Possession</u>: Bullock agrees to surrender to Lander County possession of the Shop at the expiration or termination of the Agreement, by lapse of time or otherwise, in as good repair as when Bullock obtained it at the commencement of the term, excepting only ordinary wear and decay, or damage by elements, or by act of God, insurrection, nuclear weapon, bomb, riot, invasion or commotion, or of military or usurped power.
- 10. Amendment or Modification: Both parties acknowledge and agree that they have not relied upon any statements, representations, agreements, or warranties, in entering into this Agreement, except as are stated herein, and no amendment or modification of this Agreement shall be valid or binding unless expressed in writing and executed by both the parties.

11. <u>Damage or Loss to Bullock's Property</u>: All personal property of any kind kept in the Shop shall be kept there at Bullock's sole risk and Lander County shall not be held liable for any damage done to or loss of that personal property, arising from bursting pipes, overflowing or leaking of water, sewer, or steam pipes, or from heating or plumbing fixtures, or from electrical wires, or from gases, or odors, or caused in any other manner. Lander County has no duty to provide security for Shop.

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- 12. <u>Termination</u>: This Agreement may be Terminated prior to the expiration of the term as follows:
 - A. Lander County or Bullock may terminate this Agreement with or without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice served upon the other party as provided in this Agreement.
 - B. Lander County and Bullock may agree in writing to terminate the lease at any time.
 - C. This Agreement shall automatically terminate upon the destruction of the Shop.

Upon termination, Bullock shall remove all of his property from the premises.

13. <u>Notices</u>: All notices or other communications required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given if delivered personally in hand or mailed certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid on the date posted, and addressed to the other party at the address set forth below.

- 15. <u>Assignment</u>: The rights granted and responsibilities incurred under this Agreement may not be assigned without the written consent of Lander County. Bullock may not sublease.

16. Third Party Beneficiaries: The enforcement of the terms and conditions of this Agreement and all rights of action relating to such enforcement shall be strictly reserved to the parties of the Agreement. There are no third party beneficiaries to this Agreement, and nothing contained in or implied by this Agreement shall give or allow any such claim or right of action by any other or third person.

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- 17. Governing Law: This Agreement shall be construed and governed by the laws of the State of Nevada. Any action arising from this Agreement must be filed in the Sixth Judicial District Court in and for the County of Lander.
- 18. <u>Attorney's Fees</u>: Should either party be required to pursue legal action to enforce the terms and conditions of this agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled reasonable attorney fees and court costs.
- 19. Governmental Immunity: Nothing contained herein waives or is intended to waive any protections that may be applicable to Lander County or any of its elected or appointed officials, employees, or agents under any applicable statutes, rules or regulations providing governmental immunity, or any other rights, protections, immunities, defenses or limitations on liability to Lander County or such related parties that are provided by law.
- 20. <u>Captions</u>: The headings used in this Agreement are inserted for reference purposes only and shall not be deemed to define, limit, extend, describe, or affect in any way the meaning, scope or interpretation of any of the terms or provisions of this Agreement or the intent hereof.
- 21. <u>Integration</u>: This Agreement shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties; all prior agreements between the parties, whether written or oral, are merged into this Agreement and shall be of no force or effect.
- 22. <u>Relationship</u>: This Agreement shall not be deemed to create a partnership between the parties in their respective endeavors or otherwise, nor cause them to be considered joint venturers or members of any joint enterprise.
- 23. <u>Force Majeure</u>: Neither party shall be responsible for any failure or delay in its performance under this Agreement due to causes beyond its reasonable control, including but not limited to, labor disputes, strikes, lockouts, shortages of or inability to obtain labor, energy, raw materials or supplies, war, riot, acts of God or governmental action.
- 24. <u>Severability</u>: If any covenant, phrase, clause, paragraph, section, condition or provision contained within this Agreement is invalidated by a court of competent jurisdiction, then the invalidity shall in no way affect any other covenant, phrase, clause, paragraph, section, condition, or provision contained in this Agreement.

- 25. <u>Construction</u>: This Agreement shall be construed without to the identity of the party who drafted various provisions of the Agreement. Moreover, each and every provision of this Agreement shall be construed as though all parties to this Agreement participated equally in the drafting of this Agreement. As a result of the foregoing, any rule or construction that a document is to be construed against the drafting party shall not apply.
- 26. <u>Confidentiality</u>: Each party shall keep confidential all information, in whatever form, produced, prepared, observed or received by that party to the extent that such information is confidential by law or otherwise required by this Agreement.
- 27. <u>Proper Authority</u>: The parties hereto represent and warrant that the person executing this Agreement on behalf of each party has full power and authority to enter into this Agreement and that the parties are authorized by law to perform the services set forth in this Agreement.
- 28. Compliance With Law: The parties hereto represent and warrant that they will comply with all relevant local, state, and federal laws and regulations and further represent and warrant that any failure to comply with such laws is a material breach of contract and that the breaching party will indemnify the other party from any and all claims or damages arising out of such breach.

Lander County Yucca Mountain Project Summary of Proposed Activities and Program Plan 10/01/2012-9/30/2013

Activity 1. Program Management and Administration

A repository program office operates in Battle Mountain with a smaller office maintained in Austin.

The Battle Mountain office will be responsible for:

- Maintenance of the geographic information systems and assistance with Yucca Mountain impact studies.
- Coordinate Yucca Mountain public tours and speakers.
- Maintain and update public information website for Yucca Mountain.
- Coordinate various impact assessment efforts and reports (participate in study update)
- Assist with Yucca Mountain newsletter and other public information development and distribution in Lander County.
- Attend periodic meetings related to directly to Yucca Mountain, AULG status and funding, and meetings for public information purposes.
- Maintain public information library for Yucca Mountain related information.
- General program administration for the Lander County Yucca Mountain Oversight Program.
- Provide financial management for Yucca Mountain Oversight program and related activities.
- Participate and monitor NRC licensing proceedings.
- Participate in project suspension activities, if required.

Administrative Assistant (Part-time Position in Austin)

- Maintain Yucca Mountain public information library in Austin.
- Review all news clips and maintain an active 30-day file for Yucca Mountain.
- Label and distribute Yucca Mountain newsletters as well as other public information documents related to Yucca Mountain project.
- Maintain and stock a Yucca Mountain public information displays in the courthouse and other locations.
- Help coordinate public school and adult tours.
- Attend County Commission meetings on DOE Yucca Mountain related matters.
- Provide Yucca Mountain related information to local service groups.

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- Periodically review internet sites for pertinent information about the repository program.
- Perform various administrative procedures related to the Yucca Mountain Oversight Program.
- Help coordinate Yucca Mountain Community Survey efforts.
- Assist with any project close-out and suspension activities.

The County anticipates the acquisition of additional computer equipment and software, office furniture, and telephones for Yucca Mountain program related activities at the Battle Mountain and Austin office. Rent will also be charged for office space established in Battle Mountain for Yucca Mountain oversight office, and for the Austin office.

Lander County may utilize the services of its auditor to periodically review Yucca Mountain program related accounting and control procedures.

Program administration is understood to refer only to the administration of Yucca Mountain oversight funds. The County's Yucca Mountain planning and management contractor will also participate in management and administrative functions for the oversight program.

Activity 2: Program Oversight Activities

The primary function of oversight activities is to attend program related meetings, conferences and workshops, review program activities and other related information, and provide periodic reports to the Board of County Commissioners. County staff, elected officials, and the planning and management consultant, will provide oversight functions. The County will also monitor DOE's activities to help evaluate impacts to Lander County and provide for public information.

Lander County anticipates coordination with or attendance at meetings with the following entities:

- Department of Energy/Yucca Mountain Project.
- State of Nevada-Commission on Nuclear Projects, Agency for Nuclear Projects.
- Yucca Mountain Affected Unit of Local Government Meetings.
- Nuclear Regulatory Commission and its Advisory Committee
- NRC Licensing Proceedings.
- Nuclear Waste Technical Review Board.
- Implementation efforts of the Blue Ribbon Commission's alternatives.
- Regional government meetings when topics are related to Yucca Mountain.
- Legislative and Judicial matters involving Yucca Mountain and Waste Disposal
- Energy Community Alliance Membership and participation in meetings and activities.

Oversight activities will be conducted for the purpose of obtaining public information and assessing potential impacts from the Yucca Mountain project.

Activity 3: Public Information

The public information function provides current information on repository related events through the publication of periodic newsletters, Yucca Mountain repository related tours, and coordination with community groups and Lander County residents. Proposed activities to include:

- One newsletters concerning Yucca Mountain program activities.
- Operation and maintenance of local information library for Yucca Mountain project related materials.
- Publication of newspaper articles and press releases related to Yucca Mountain and the licensing proceedings.
- Tours of nuclear power facilities and on-site storage for elected officials and those directly involved with the County's oversight activities.
- Public information survey directly related to the Yucca Mountain project.
- Update website with public information related to Yucca Mountain.

All public information activities will be used for Yucca Mountain and or the licensing proceedings. Further enhancements will be made to the Yucca Mountain website.

Activity 4: Impact Assessment Activities

County staff and the planning and management contractor will be responsible for Yucca Mountain impact assessment activities. The following impact assessment and planning activities will be considered for the coming year:

Geographic Information System (GIS) Capabilities

Lander County will continue to maintain its Yucca Mountain GIS capabilities for use in impact assessment activities, public information, and NRC licensing proceedings to support the 4-county admitted contentions. Information provided by the Yucca Mountain project such as maps and other digital data can be placed on the GIS. Any additional impact studies can utilize the GIS.

Oversight funds will be used to acquire digital databases, computer equipment, a printer and produce data to support impact analysis. The program coordinator and GIS consultants will provide technical expertise for system operations. GIS layers to be maintained include parcel base layer, and land use/zoning maps, road network, aerial photography, natural resource data (wildlife, water resources, mineral resources, land use among others). Findings for other Yucca Mountain impact assessments and baseline information will be placed on the GIS.

County Yucca Mountain staff will maintain the GIS system with the assistance of a GIS contractor. County Yucca Mountain staff may attend necessary training courses in order operate and maintain the system. Geographic information system tasks and activities will be directly related to the Yucca Mountain project. The GIS contractor will also be responsible for system upgrades and maintenance, and the transfer of data from and to other affected units of local government. Lander County may opt to transfer long-term maintenance and operation of the system to another County department.

Transportation Activities

Technical assistance will be retained by Lander County. Work performed by Lander County will only focus on Yucca Mountain rail and highway activities along the existing rail and truck transportation routes in Lander County. Transportation work done under impact assessment will support licensing activities. Additionally, Lander County will finalize its review of local emergency medical services, fire department, and hazardous materials response capabilities.

Community Survey

In 2012 Lander County prepared a survey of local residents in order to gain insights about the opinions and beliefs held by Lander County residents with respect to the repository program. This year the county will resurvey local residents to obtain their views of the waste management program. Lander County High School students will be responsible for conducting the survey and compiling the results. Various survey methods and procedures will be utilized to obtain local views of the repository program. A final report with Yucca Mountain survey results will be prepared and distributed to interested parties.

This year Lander County will prepare a comprehensive report on public opinions of the Yucca Mountain project.

• Update Annual Baseline Report

Lander County updates its baseline report annually. The baseline report tracks changes in social, economic, demographic, and environmental conditions in Lander County. The GIS will be used to enhance revisions to the impact analysis, and other impact assessment work related to Yucca Mountain. The baseline report is important to efforts to track existing conditions and monitor changes to Lander County over time.

• Comprehensive Program Review

Lander County will conduct a comprehensive program review which documents the County's involvement in all aspects of the Yucca Mountain Oversight program. The most important element will be the discussion of potential impacts and suggested mitigation requirements. As part of this effort, Lander County will build an extensive bibliography of studies and other supporting material for various positions held by Lander County with respect to the Yucca Mountain program and geologic repository in general. Examining and summarizing key studies and findings will be part of the review.

The review will also include a discussion of lessons learned from licensing activity, institutional interactions, and public relations and public information activities

Support Activities for Licensing and Contention Filed by Lander County

Lander County will engage in licensing and contention support activities, if such activities are required. Lander County will work cooperatively with the four counties and other affected units of local government participating in the proceedings as necessary.

Activity 5: Licensing and LSN Related Activities

Lander County will undertake activities necessary to maintain its current NRC certification of County website. Such activities require the participation of Lander County at NRC meetings directly related to the licensing support system. Lander County will continue to update its LSN manual.

Lander County will use oversight funds for participation in the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) licensing proceedings if necessary. Lander County will continue to participate in cooperative funding agreements for legal representation in the proceedings. Lander County will participate in meetings, workshops and other activities directly related to the licensing process as required. Lander County will interact with other AULGs during the course of licensing related activities undertaken by DOE.

Lander County will also retain technical services to support licensing activities. Such services will include technical experts in areas covered by the contentions filed by Lander County. If necessary Lander County will also work with legal counsel to outline steps necessary for program suspension and or termination.

Activity 6: Project Close-out and or Suspension Activities

Due to potential changes in the direction of the spent nuclear fuel waste disposal. Lander County will identify steps required to suspend certain oversight program activities. Such steps will potentially address the following areas, among others:

- GIS maintenance and system operations
- Maintaining and properly archiving materials including legal materials associated with the NRC license.
- Requirements for LSN long-term maintenance
- Licensing related legal activities.
- Financial status report
- Website operations and other public information materials
- Complete impact assessment activities currently underway.
- Prepare lesson learned study and history of the Yucca Mountain Project.
- Develop a plan for long-term waste disposal monitoring activities.
- File and data transfer of all information.

Yucca Mountain Project:

NRC's Waste Confidence Ruling Reversed by Appeals Court

Federal judges on June 8, 2012 tossed out a Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) regulation that allowed nuclear waste to be stored at reactors. The 2010 NRC waste confidence ruling allowed waste to be stored at reactors for up to 100 years thereby reducing the immediate need for a geologic repository at Yucca Mountain. This ruling removed pressure to expeditiously move forward with the Yucca Mountain project.

NRC freezes decisions on new reactor, license renewal applications

The US Nuclear Regulatory Commission voted unanimously on August 7, 2012 not to issue final decisions on granting licenses to build new nuclear power reactors and 20-year license renewals to existing ones, pending resolution of the agency's waste confidence rule overturned by a court in June. Applications for new reactors and license renewals for 28 nuclear units have been filed with NRC.

Appeals Court Holds Yucca Licensing Decision in Abeyance

On August 3, 2012, a divided U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit decided to wait a few months before deciding whether to order the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) to restart license review of the Department of Energy (DOE) application to develop a nuclear waste repository at Nevada's Yucca Mountain. Without further clarification of Congressional intent, the Court will be "compelled" to act on the petition for Mandamus.

Senate Hearings on the Blue Ribbon Commission's Recommendation

oversight of nuclear waste, although he acknowledged partisan disagreements would prevent it from passing Congress this session. Sen. Bingaman is also responding to interest by Carlsbad, New Mexico to find and extend use for the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant. WIPP stores low-level and transuranic wastes. Chairman of the Senate Energy Committee Jeff Bingaman (D-N.M.) introduced a bill in early August to revamp federal

Unless and until the Nuclear Waste Policy Act is changed, Yucca Mountain remains the Nation's Only Authorized Waste Repository.




YUCCA MOUNTAIN PROJECT UPDATE- September 13, 2012


Resolution No. 2012-19, a Resolution for the FFY 2013 Elections for National Forest Related Safety-Net Payments (Secure Rural Schools Act) is presented for Commission consideration.

The Secure Rural Schools and Community Self-Determination Act of 2000 was reauthorized for federal fiscal year (FFY) 2012, on July 6, 2012, as part of Public Law 112-141. The "Act" provides payments to counties and states, (passed through to counties), to be used for public schools and roads, (Title I funds), special projects on the national forests, (Title II funds), and Firewise Communities activities (Title III funds). The allocation of county SRS funding receipts between the three (3) "Title" funding programs must be made pursuant to a prescribed formula.

The State Controller's Office is responsible to report all individual counties' elections for payment to the U.S. Forest Service by September 30, 2012. The deadline for submission of county elections to the State Controller's Office is September 21, 2012. The attached resolution reflects an increased percentage of funding allocated to Title II activities; special projects on national forest lands. These projects are directed through the White Pine, Eureka, Nye Resource Advisory Committee (RAC) and for Lander County projects, are implemented on forest land within the Toiyabe Mountain Range.

RESOLUTION NO. 2012-19

BEFORE-THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS FOR LANDER COUNTY. IN THE MATTER OF THE FFY 2012 ELECTIONS FOR NATIONAL FOREST RELATED SAFETY-NET PAYMENTS

WHEREAS, Congress enacted in 1908 and subsequently amended a law that requires that twenty-five percent (25%) of the revenues derived from National Forest lands be paid to states for use by the counties in which the lands are situated for the benefit of public schools and roads; and

WHEREAS, the principal source of revenues from National Forest lands is from the sale and removal of timber, which has been curtailed in recent years with a corresponding decline in revenues shared with counties; and

WHEREAS, the United States Congress recognized a need to stabilize education and road maintenance funding through predictable payments to the affected counties, and to achieve that goal enacted the Secure Rural Schools and Community Self-Determination Act of 2000, which has been amended and re-authorized for FFY 2012, (Public Law 112-141); and

WHEREAS, Title I of Public Law 112-141 gives each eligible county the right to elect to receive either its traditional share of revenues from the National Forest lands pursuant to the Act of May 23, 1908 and Section 13 of the Act of March 1, 1911 (the "25-percent payments"), or instead to receive a guaranteed minimum share of the State payment pursuant to Sections 102(a)(1)(B) and 103 (the "full county payment amount"); and

WHEREAS, any county electing to receive a full county payment amount that is \$100,000 or more must further elect to expend an amount not less than fifteen percent (15%) nor more than twenty percent (20%) of its full county payment amount as project funds; and

WHEREAS, Title I, Section 102(d) of SRS2008 requires that counties electing to receive a full county payment amount of \$100,000 or more must allocate its project funds between projects in accordance with Title II and Title III, and return the balance of project funds unspent under Titles II and III to the Treasury of the United States, and communicate such allocation to the Secretary of the United States Department of Agriculture; and

WHEREAS, Title II provides for special projects on federal lands or that benefit resources on federal lands, which projects are recommended by local resource advisory committees ("RACs"); and

WHEREAS, RACs recommend projects for consideration by the Secretary of Agriculture, with project funding supplied in whole or in part out of monies allocated for such purposes by participating counties; and

WHEREAS, counties that allocate funding to projects under Title II, and are participants in more than one RAC, may further direct that their Title II project funds be divided between different RACs according to an allocation decided by each participating county, with such funds held in the Treasury of the United States under the name of the county with a designation of the amount allocated to each RAC; and

- 3. Of the percent allocated to Title II and Title III projects above in paragraph 2, Lander County further allocates between such Titles for FFY 2012 on the following basis: fifteen percent (15%) of full county payment amount for expenditure on Title II projects and five percent (5%) of the full county payment amount for expenditure on Title III projects.
- 4. RESOLUTION NO. 2012-19

BEFORE THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS FOR LANDER COUNTY IN THE MATTER OF THE FFY 2012 ELECTIONS FOR NATIONAL FOREST RELATED SAFETY-NET PAYMENTS

WHEREAS, Congress enacted in 1908 and subsequently amended a law that requires that twenty-five percent (25%) of the revenues derived from National Forest lands be paid to states for use by the counties in which the lands are situated for the benefit of public schools and roads; and

WHEREAS, the principal source of revenues from National Forest lands is from the sale and removal of timber, which has been curtailed in recent years with a corresponding decline in revenues shared with counties; and

WHEREAS, the United States Congress recognized a need to stabilize education and road maintenance funding through predictable payments to the affected counties, and to achieve that goal enacted the Secure Rural Schools and Community Self-Determination Act of 2000, which has been amended and re-authorized for FFY 2012, (Public Law 112-141); and

WHEREAS, Title I of Public Law 112-141 gives each eligible county the right to elect to receive either its traditional share of revenues from the National Forest lands pursuant to the Act of May 23, 1908 and Section 13 of the Act of March 1, 1911 (the "25-percent payments"), or instead to receive a guaranteed minimum share of the State payment pursuant to Sections 102(a)(1)(B) and 103 (the "full county payment amount"); and

WHEREAS, any county electing to receive a full county payment amount that is \$100,000 or more must further elect to expend an amount not less than fifteen percent (15%) nor more than twenty percent (20%) of its full county payment amount as project funds; and

WHEREAS, Title I, Section 102(d) of SRS2008 requires that counties electing to receive a full county payment amount of \$100,000 or more must allocate its project funds between projects in accordance with Title II and Title III, and return the balance of project funds unspent under Titles II and III to the Treasury of the United States, and communicate such allocation to the Secretary of the United States Department of Agriculture; and

WHEREAS, Title II provides for special projects on federal lands or that benefit resources on federal lands, which projects are recommended by local resource advisory committees ("RACs"); and

WHEREAS, RACs recommend projects for consideration by the Secretary of Agriculture, with project funding supplied in whole or in part out of monies allocated for such purposes by participating counties; and

WHEREAS, counties that allocate funding to projects under Title II, and are participants in more than one RAC, may further direct that their Title II project funds be divided between different RACs according to an allocation decided by each participating county, with such funds held in the Treasury of the United States under the name of the county with a designation of the amount allocated to each RAC; and

WHEREAS, Title III provides for county projects, some of which are associated with federal lands, with Title III authorizing expenditures for search, rescue and emergency services, fire prevention and planning under the Firewise Communities program, and development of community wildfire protection plans; and

WHEREAS, a county with a full county payment amount of \$350,000 or more may not allocate more than seven percent (7%) of its full county payment amount for Title III projects.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved as follows:

- 1. Lander County hereby elects to receive the guaranteed minimum full county payment amount pursuant to the re-authorization of the Secure Rural Schools and Community Self-Determination Act of 2000; Public law 112-141.
- Lander County has elected to receive a full county payment amount that is \$100,000 or more, and hereby allocates twenty percent (20%) of its full county payment amount for expenditure on projects under Title II and Title III. Lander County will return none (zero percent) of its full county payment amount to the Treasury of the United States.
- 3. Of the percent allocated to Title II and Title III projects above in paragraph 2, Lander County further allocates between such Titles for FFY 2012 on the following basis: zero percent (15%) of full county payment amount for expenditure on Title II projects and twenty percent (5%) of the full county payment amount for expenditure on Title III projects.
- 4. 



The Bureau of Land Management (BLM), Winnemucca District Office, Humboldt River Field Office (HRFO) has issued a Decision Record (DR) and Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) for the Environmental Assessment (EA) prepared for the Adelaide Mine Exploration Project proposed by Golden Predator Mines US, Inc. The project is located approximately ten miles south of Golconda, Nevada, in Township 34 North, Range 39 East, sections 13 and 24; and Township 34 North, Range 40 East, sections 18 and 19, Mount Diablo Base and Meridian.

The Decision Record selects the Proposed Action, subject to all mitigation developed through the analysis, for implementation. The Proposed Action is to conduct exploration activities with up to 27.58 acres of surface disturbance. Exploration activities proposed under this project include the following: excavation of an underground exploration tunnel and ventilation shaft to facilitate underground drilling, construction of minor ancillary support facilities, construction of an ore stockpile pad and waste rock disposal area, construction of a storm water evaporation cell, reestablishment and/or maintenance of existing access and haul roads, and additional surface exploration drilling and trenching. Reclamation includes backfilling the underground workings, recontouring the surface disturbances and re-establishing vegetation.



The Nevada Division of Environmental Protection (NDEP) has reviewed the August 17, 2012 Spill Report prepared by Tracy Johnston of McGinley & Associates on behalf of GE Transport. This letter provides a no further action determination for the above referenced release and applies to other places contaminants related to this release have come to be located (NAC 445A.3452). The August 14, 2012 report contains a request for a no further action determination from the NDEP.

The NDEP has reviewed information contained in the Corrective Action file that has been provided by GE Transport and Tracy Johnston, CEM. Based on this review, Total Petroleum Hydrocarbons remain above action levels or remediation standards in soil. However, based on current land and groundwater uses, NDEP has determined that no further assessment or remediation is required to be protective of human health and the environment (NAC 445A227).

NDEP may re-evaluate this decision if conditions at the site change or if new or previously unidentified information becomes available that: 1) alters the results of the site evaluation; and 2) demonstrates a potential detrimental impact on human health or the environment.



12 Month Status Review of Four Great Basin Butterflies Finds Listing Not Warranted

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service), today, announced that listing the Baking Powder Flat blue butterfly (Euphilotes bernardino minuta), bleached sandhill skipper (Polites sabuleti sinemaculata), Steptoe Valley crescentspot (Phyciodes cocyta arenacolor), and White River Valley skipper (Hesperia uncas grandiose) as either threatened or endangered under the Endangered Species Act (ESA) is not warranted after completing a thorough review of all available scientific and commercial information.

This status review was prepared in response to a petition received January 29, 2010, from WildEarth Guardians requesting that 10 subspecies of Great Basin butterflies in Nevada and California be listed as threatened or endangered with critical habitat under the ESA. On October 4, 2011, the Service published a 90-day finding indicating the petition did not present substantial scientific or commercial information that listing six of the 10 subspecies (Carson Valley silverspot, Carson Valley wood nymph, Mattoni's blue butterfly, Mono Basin skipper, and the two Railroad Valley skipper subspecies) was warranted and that substantial information was presented for the remaining four butterflies included in this 12-month status review.

In keeping our public informed of on-going planning efforts, The Bureau of Land Management's (BLM) Battle Mountain District Office (BMDO) wishes to notify interested parties of a planning effort to reduce hazardous fuel loadings and create a defensible buffer from catastrophic wildfire in and around Battle Mountain, NV. Comments on this project may be sent to the BMDO, ATTN: Battle Mountain Fire Defense System Project Lead, and will be accepted until 09-28-2012.

A fire risk and hazard assessment has been completed for the Battle Mountain area. The BMDO has identified approximately 22,000 acres of Wildland-urban Interface Public Lands that are at an overall moderate risk of experiencing catastrophic wildfire.


As a result of implementing the proposed action, buffers would be created in strategic areas which would serve to moderate fire behavior within the treated areas, therefore reducing the likelihood of a wildfire entering (or leaving) the community of Battle Mountain. It would create a safer environment for firefighters to engage in suppression operations than what is present now. Further benefits include local watershed protection, improvement of stand structure and increased opportunities for ecological diversity within the Wildland-Urban Interface. In addition, areas within the wildland-urban interface would be more resistant to fire. Upon completion of this project, monitoring, and further maintenance (mechanical, chemical, biological, and/or possible prescribed fire) treatments will be utilized to maintain the project area.

A combination of mechanical, chemical and biological treatments are a cost-effective and ecofriendly way to address the hazardous fuel conditions occurring within the Battle Mountain Fire Defense Systems Assessment Area.

A local scoping meeting will be scheduled in Battle Mountain, Nevada, to meet with interested publics to further develop the project. Reasonable and feasible options will be discussed including brush-beating (shrub mastication), green-stripping and the use of prescribed grazing. The goal is to create a fire defense system within the assessment area to make an established or emerging wildfire easier and safer to manage. Staff from the Battle Mountain District Fire Program will facilitate the meeting in order to gain feedback on the most favorable options for

<u>Topic:</u> Geothermal Leasing Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) on the Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest (HTNF).

<u>Status:</u> The HTNF is currently finalizing the Geothermal Leasing FEIS and has selected a preferred alternative, Alternative 4. The FEIS and Record of Decision (ROD) will be released in mid-September of 2012. Four alternatives were considered in the FEIS: the proposed action, two additional action alternatives with additional protection measures for sage grouse and Native American sites, and the no-action alternative.

Background: The FEIS analyzed approximately 615,000 acres on the HTNF to determine which lands would be made available for geothermal leasing. It also identified reasonable and necessary stipulations to protect surface resources. Most of the lands analyzed are located on the Nevada side of the Bridgeport Ranger District (approximately 600,000 acres), along with a few smaller satellite parcels located on the Austin, Tonopah, and Ely Districts.

Alternative 4, with associated stipulations as outlined in Chapter 2 of the FEIS, includes updated habitat classification and protection measures for sage grouse and would consent to lease approximately 609,780 acres of National Forest System lands. Lands categorized as 1 and 2 (preliminary priority habitat), and 3 (preliminary general habitat), based on Nevada Department of Wildlife (NDOW) and Bureau of Land Management (BLM) broad-scale sage-grouse habitat category maps, would be leased with a No Surface Occupancy (NSO) stipulation to protect sage-grouse and their habitat. This preferred alternative best fulfills the agency's statutory mission and responsibilities, considering economic, environmental, technical, and other factors.

Issues: Alternative 4 was developed to incorporate the latest sage grouse protection measures and multi-agency direction. Future ground-disturbing activities would be limited within priority and general sage-grouse habitat by the NSO stipulation. Some may argue that even more stringent stipulations or no leasing should be applied in sage-grouse habitat. Others, however, may argue that the NSO restrictions would severely limit the lease and the ability to develop future geothermal resources.

<u>Future Actions:</u> As this is a programmatic decision, these concerns would be addressed in the future. Consent to leasing by the Forest Service to the BLM is only the first step towards future leasing. Once consent is provided, the BLM, who oversees leasing and operations, has the authority to determine which National Forest System lands to offer in future lease sales and whether or not to issue a future lease. Lease issuance by the BLM does not authorize any ground-disturbing activities. Future site-specific approvals to explore for or develop geothermal resources on a lease would include additional environmental reviews and permitting. Site-specific inventories would occur prior to ground disturbance to identify habitat and any other resource concerns, as well as ground-truth the accuracy of the GIS-generated habitat maps. Following publication of the ROD, the BLM could begin the leasing process by December 2012
