

**MIDVALE CITY, UTAH
RESOLUTION NO. 2020-R-12**

**A RESOLUTION CONTINUING THE MAYOR'S EMERGENCY PROCLAMATION NO. 1
OF 2020 DECLARING A LOCAL EMERGENCY DUE TO THE INFECTIOUS DISEASE
COVID-19 NOVEL CORONAVIRUS.**

WHEREAS, on March 6, 2020, Governor Gary R. Herbert issued an Executive Order declaring a state of emergency due to the novel coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization characterized the COVID-19 outbreak as a pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, President Donald J. Trump declared a national state of emergency based on the continuing spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, Mayor Robert M. Hale, as authorized by Utah Code §§ 53-2a-208 and 53-2a-209, declared a local state of emergency due to the global outbreak of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, under Utah Code § 53-2a-208(1), a local state of emergency may not continue or be renewed for a period in excess of 30 days except with the consent of the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that threat of the COVID-19 outbreak to Midvale's residents and visitors may continue for more than 30 days; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that the COVID-19 outbreak is dynamic and constantly evolving; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to authorize the Mayor and City Manager to be able to take appropriate steps to preserve the health, provide safety, and maintain peace and order during this local emergency.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF MIDVALE,
UTAH:**


Section 1. The City Council recognizes the necessity of the Mayor's Emergency Proclamation No. 1 of 2020 Declaring a Local Emergency due to the outbreak of COVID-19 and its threat to the health of Midvale's residents and visitors.

Section 2. The City Council authorizes the Mayor, as authorized by law and in coordination with recognized government and health officials, to take any additional steps that are necessary and proper to preserve health, provide safety, and maintain peace and order for the benefit of Midvale and its resident and visitors.


Section 3. The City Council authorizes the City Manager, as authorized by law and in coordination with the Mayor and other recognized government and health officials, to take any additional steps that are necessary and proper to preserve health, provide safety, and maintain order for the benefit of Midvale and its employees.

Section 4. The City Council authorizes Emergency Proclamation No. 1 of 2020 to remain in effect beyond 30 days. The local emergency shall remain in effect until it is terminated by either the Mayor or by resolution of the City Council.
