

**MIDVALE CITY, UTAH  
RESOLUTION NO. 2021-R-13**

**A RESOLUTION TERMINATING RESOLUTION 2020-R-12 AND ALL PRIOR COVID-RELATED EMERGENCY PROCLAMATIONS AND EXECUTIVE ORDERS AND DIRECTING THE WEARING OF FACE COVERINGS DUE TO THE INFECTIOUS DISEASE COVID-19 NOVEL CORONAVIRUS IN ALL MIDVALE CITY BUILDINGS.**

**WHEREAS**, on March 6, 2020, Governor Gary R. Herbert issued an Executive Order declaring a state of emergency due to the novel coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19); and

**WHEREAS**, since the March 6<sup>th</sup> Executive Order, the Governor has amended and issued additional orders over the last year; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 13, 2020, Mayor Robert Hale issued Emergency Proclamation No. 1 of 2020 declaring, among other things, a local state of emergency; and

**WHEREAS**, subsequent to the March 13<sup>th</sup> Emergency Proclamation by Mayor Hale, a series of Executive Orders, and Resolutions were issued and passed by the Mayor and City Council to implement restrictions to help slow the transmission of the disease; and

**WHEREAS**, with the number of state and local emergency and executive orders that have been issued, the effectiveness of the existing Midvale City orders is unclear.

**WHEREAS**, with the statewide availability of the COVID-19 vaccinations, Governor Spencer J. Cox terminated the state-wide mask mandate, effective April 10, 2021; and

**WHEREAS**, with the lowering of the COVID-19 transmission rate, and the fact that many of the City's orders are no longer in effect, it is the desire of the City Council to terminate all previously implemented Emergency Proclamations, Executive Orders, Resolutions regarding COVID-19; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the desire of the City Council to re-implement certain restrictions within city-owned buildings to continue to slow the spread of COVID-19 and ensure the safety of Midvale City residents and staff, the City Council; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF MIDVALE, UTAH:**


**Section 1. Termination of Resolution 2020-R-12 and All Previously Issued COVID-19 Emergency Proclamations and Executive Orders.** Resolution 2020-R-12 and all Emergency Proclamations and Executive Orders that have been issued on and since March 13, 2020 involving the COVID-19 NOVEL CORONAVIRUS, are terminated, effective April 20, 2021.

**Section 2. Face Covering Mandatory.** Any individual within a public building owned by Midvale City who is age two and over and able to medically or psychologically tolerate a face covering shall be required to wear a face covering that completely covers the nose and mouth, when non-household members are present and social distancing of at least six feet is not possible. This mask mandate is effective April 20, 2021 and will expire June 30, 2021.

**Section 3. City Manager Discretion.** The City Manager, at his discretion, is authorized to implement COVID-19 policies for Midvale City staff.
