The Concrete About Concrete

Did you know that the Town of Milliken requires planning review for installation of concrete, asphalt or other impervious surfacing? This includes pouring of patios, driveway extensions and other "flatwork" projects involving impervious surfaces.

Also note that Milliken Code restricts driveway widths to a maximum of 32' at the curb, and only one driveway is allowed per lot (including corner lots). Concrete on the sides of homes must maintain a 5' setback from the property line to avoid stormwater runoff onto adjacent properties. Some larger lot zoning districts (Agricultural, Agricultural Estates and R-1E) may allow two driveways subject to compliance with limitations on the width of the second driveway and separation distances between driveways. Second driveways in these zoning districts requires Town approval.

Prior to adding concrete, the Town will request a plot plan showing the location of property lines, building (house) footprint, location of proposed concrete, dimensions (length and width) of the proposed concrete and distances from the proposed concrete to property lines. Once staff reviews the plot plan for compliance with the Municipal Code, the property owner will be contacted. Please also be aware of any HOA approval requirements or restrictions. The Town does not enforce or check covenants.

Need a Business license

According to the Milliken Municipal Code Chapter 6 Article 1, All businesses are required to obtain a Milliken business license.

Doing *business* means an act of one (1) of the following:

- Selling at retail any goods or service;
- Soliciting or offering goods or services for retail sale or hire; or
- Acquiring or using any vehicle or any premises in the Town for business purposes.
