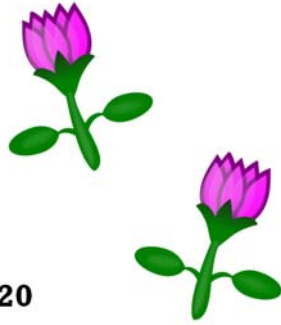

DID YOU KNOW?



All swimming pools over 24" deep, whether or not they are permanent, are required to have a building permit? Some other projects which require building permits include *but are not limited to* the following examples:

- Decks over 12" or more off the ground whether or not they are covered.
- Decks which are attached to your home regardless of height.
- Decks that are covered with a roof structure including a trellis.
- Storage buildings/sheds or other structures over 120 square feet (note that all sheds regardless of size are required to meet setbacks required in the zoning district.)
- Basement finishes.
- Residential remodels (such as kitchens and bathrooms) with the exception of cosmetic changes. Relocation or construction of walls, electrical or plumbing modifications require a permit.
- Enclosed patios.
- Residential solar projects.
- Over the Counter Permits such as Water Heaters, Furnaces, AC Units, Re-Roofs, Window Replacements, Siding, Demolition, Gas Fireplaces, Lawn Sprinklers with New Backflow Devices, Fences, and more.
- Any changes to a commercial building or change of use of a commercial building.

Many property owners may not realize that insurance and title companies as well as real estate agents request copies of building permits to verify improvements and inspections of those improvements.
