


Court Operations

- Usage department vs. traditional department
- Overall 0.73% increase from \$7,462,796 to \$7,518,340
- \$5,682,000 or 75.6% of that is Indigent
 Defense related
- Remaining 24.4% is jury costs, interpreters, visiting court reporters, visiting judges and other costs


Budget History

Special Revenue Funds

- The District and County Courts access three special funds: District/County Court Technology, Court Reporter Service and Law Library.
- Through competition between providers, OCA has been able to decrease online research costs by 11%
- Through planning efforts, OCA has worked with the Court Reporters to reduce budget of the Court Reporter Service Fund by 10%

Special Revenue Funds

- Additionally, we are proposing built in budgets of \$1,000 per court in the District/County Court Technology Fund.
- This budget will help the Courts access the fund more easily for hardware and software purchases, new AV tech, and AV fixes not covered by IT's agreement with their vendor.

Court Administration/Indigent Defense

- Indigent Defense screening occurs both in the jail and in court;
- With 7 full time criminal courts, Indigent Defense staff is stretched thin, leading to damaging delays in court time;
- If one of the three interviewers is out, court business processes are substantially disrupted.

- Parity between the existing two Jail Liaison/Compliance Monitor positions




- CCL2 is requesting to reclassify an Assistant Court Coordinator position into Court Coordinator
- CCL2 is also requesting to change 1 Probate Coordinator position to a Probate Auditor. This is expected to take place after retirement of an individual and not October 1st.

Courts Budgets

 CCL3 is seeking to address a disparity in Court Reporter compensation, by bringing up Kimberly Holzwarth to parity in salary with every other County Court at Law Court Reporter.

Civil cases have been increasing;



With the 284th changing hands, expect more discussions about ways in which to expedite civil matters.

- Montgomery County uses individual interpreters at a general rate of \$300/day, \$150/half-day.
- Last time this rate was raised was in 2010.
- Interpreters have requested in increase from the Judges, though ultimate approval (at least on the District Court side) is Commissioners Court (152.903 Tex. Local Govt. Code)
