Charles Mills, Chaplain, Morristown Police Department, led in the invocation and Councilmember Alvis led in the "Pledge of Allegiance".

Councilmember Pedigo made a motion to approve the February 7, 2017, minutes as circulated. Councilmember Smith seconded the motion and upon roll call; all voted "aye".

A Public Hearing was held pertaining to Ordinance No. 3555.04. The following people spoke: Nigel Reid.

Councilmember Pedigo made a motion to approve Ordinance No. 3555.04 on second and final reading. Councilmember Alvis seconded the motion and upon roll call; all voted "aye".

Ordinance No. 3555.04

PROPOSAL

OF THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

TO THE CITY OF MORRISTOWN, TENNESSEE:

The DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION of the State of Tennessee, hereinafter

"DEPARTMENT", proposes to construct a project in the City of Morristown, Tennessee,

hereinafter "CITY", designated as Federal Project No. STP-34(39), State Project No. 32005-

2228-14, that is described as "SR-34 (U.S. 11E) from West of Old Stagecoach Rd. in

Russellville to Steadman Rd.", provided the CITY agrees to cooperate with the DEPARTMENT

as set forth in this proposal, so that the general highway program may be carried out in

accordance with the intent of the General Assembly of the State.

Accordingly, the parties agree as follows:

1. That in the event any civil actions in inverse condemnation or for damages are

instituted by reason of the DEPARTMENT, or its contractor, going upon the highway right-of-

way and easements, and constructing said project in accordance with the plans and as necessary

to make the completed project functional, it will notify in writing the Attorney General of the

State, whose address is 425 Fifth Avenue North, Nashville, Tennessee, 37243, of the institution

of each civil action, the complaint and all subsequent pleadings, within ten (10) days after the

service of each of the same, under penalty of defending such actions and paying any judgments

which result therefrom at its own expense.

2. The CITY will close or otherwise modify any of its roads, or other public ways if

indicated on the project plans, as provided by law.

3. The CITY will transfer or cause to be transferred to the DEPARTMENT, without cost

to the DEPARTMENT, all land owned by the CITY or by any of its instrumentalities as required

for right-of-way or easement purposes, provided such land is being used or dedicated for road or other public way purposes.

4. Where privately, publicly or cooperatively owned utility lines, facilities and systems for producing, transmitting or distributing communications, power, electricity, light, heat, gas, oil, crude products, water, steam, waste, storm water not connected with highway drainage, and other similar commodities, including publicly owned facilities such as fire and police signal systems and street lighting systems are located within the right-of-way of any road or other public way owned by the CITY or any of its instrumentalities, the CITY agrees that it will take any action necessary to require the removal or adjustment of any of the above-described facilities as would conflict with the construction of the project. But the foregoing may not be a duty of the CITY since it shall become operative only after the DEPARTMENT has been unsuccessful in its efforts to provide for said removals or adjustments for the benefit of the CITY.

The foregoing does not apply to those utility facilities which are owned by the CITY or one of its instrumentalities, it being understood that the CITY has the duty to relocate or adjust such facilities, if required, provided the CITY is notified to do so by the DEPARTMENT with detailed advice as to this duty of the CITY.

- 5. The CITY will maintain any frontage road to be constructed as part of the project;
- 6. After the project is completed and open to traffic, the CITY will accept jurisdiction and maintenance such parts of any existing DEPARTMENT highway to be replaced by the project, as shown on the attached map.
- 7. The CITY will make no changes or alter any segment of a road on its road system that lies within the limits of the right-of-way acquired for any interchange to be constructed as part of the project and will not permit the installation or relocation of any utility facilities within the right-of-way of any such a segment of one of its roads without first obtaining the approval of the

DEPARTMENT.

8. No provision hereof shall be construed as changing the maintenance responsibility of

the CITY for such part of the project as may presently be on its highway, street, road or bridge

system.

9. It is understood and agreed between the DEPARTMENT and the CITY that all traffic

control signs for the control of traffic on a street under the jurisdiction of the CITY and located

within the DEPARTMENT's right-of-way shall be maintained and replaced by the CITY.

10. When traffic control devices for the direction or warning of traffic, lighting of

roadways or signing, or any of them, which are operated or function by the use of electric current

are constructed or installed as part of the project, they will be furnished with electricity and

maintained by the CITY.

11. If, as a result of acquisition and use of right-of-way for the project, any building

and/or structure improvements become in violation of a CITY setback line or building and/or

structure requirement, including, but not limited to, on-premise signs, the CITY agrees to waive

enforcement of the CITY setback line or building and/or structure requirement and take other

proper governmental action as necessary to accomplish such waiver.

12. If, as a result of acquisition and use of right-of-way for the project, any real property

retained by any property owner shall become in violation of a CITY zoning regulation or

requirement, the CITY agrees to waive enforcement of the CITY zoning regulation or

requirement and take other proper governmental action as necessary to accomplish such waiver.

13. The CITY will not authorize encroachments of any kind upon the right-of-way, nor

will the CITY authorize use of the easements for the project in any manner which affects the

DEPARTMENT's use thereof.

14. The CITY will obtain the approval of the DEPARTMENT before authorizing parking

on the right-of-way and easements for the project.

15. The CITY will not install or maintain any device for the purpose of regulating the

movement of traffic on the roadway except as warranted and in conformity with the Manual on

Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

16. If the project is classified as full access control (i.e. a project which has no

intersecting streets at grade), then the DEPARTMENT will maintain the completed project. If

the project is not classified as full access control, then the DEPARTMENT will maintain the

pavement from curb to curb where curbs exist, or will maintain the full width of the roadway

where no curbs exist. The CITY agrees to maintain all other parts of non-access control projects;

provided, however, that any retaining walls, box culverts, or other like structures constructed as

part of the project that support the structural integrity or stability of the roadway surface shall be

maintained by the DEPARTMENT.

17. If a sidewalk is constructed as a component of this project, the CITY shall be

responsible for maintenance of the sidewalk and shall assume all liability for third-party claims

for damages arising from its use of the sidewalk or premises beyond the DEPARTMENT'S

maintenance responsibilities as set forth in section 16 of this Proposal.

18. When said project is completed, the CITY thereafter will not permit any additional

median crossovers, the cutting of the pavement, curbs, gutters and sidewalks, by any person,

firm, corporation, or governmental agency, without first obtaining the approval of the

DEPARTMENT.

19. The DEPARTMENT will acquire the right-of-way and easements, construct the

project and defend any inverse condemnation for damage or civil actions of which the Attorney

General has received the notice and pleadings provided for herein; provided, however, that if the

project is being constructed pursuant to a contract administered by the DEPARTMENT's Local

Programs Development Office, the terms of that contract shall control in the event of a conflict with this Proposal..

- 20. The project plans hereinbefore identified by number and description are incorporated herein by reference and shall be considered a part of this proposal, including any revisions or amendments thereto, provided a copy of each is furnished the CITY.
- 21. The acceptance of this proposal shall be evidenced by the passage of a resolution or by other proper governmental action, which shall incorporate this proposal verbatim or make reference thereto.

AGREEMENT

This Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into this ____ day of ____ 2017 by and between THE CITY OF MORRISTOWN, TENNESSEE ("City") and JOHN BELL ("Bell").

WITNESSETH

Whereas, Kenneth Seal ("Seal") and Bell are owners of certain land in the 5th Civil District of Hamblen County, Tennessee lying southwest of Merchants Green Blvd and northwest of Veterans Parkway.

Whereas, Seal and Bell have combined their lands and subdivided the same into three (3) tracts as is depicted on a survey by Richard Kent, dated January 17, 2017, and bearing the name "Bell – Seal Subdivision" (the "Plat"); a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A, and

Whereas, City has contracted to purchase from Seal Tract 1 as depicted on the Plat, and

Whereas, Bell is the owner of Tracts 2 and 3 as depicted on the Plat, and

Whereas, City desires to construct the infrastructure to service its Tract 1, which will consist of a paved roadway, curbing, median, and utilities all within the 75' easement as depicted on the Plat that extends from Merchants Green Blvd in a southwesterly direction beyond the boundaries of Tracts 2 and 3, and

Whereas, Bell has agreed to pay \$197,075.00 to be applied to the construction of said infrastructure subject the terms of the Escrow Agreement attached hereto Exhibit B, and

Whereas, said amount is based upon the Opinion of Probable Costs provided by T. Clint Harrison, P.E. attached hereto as Exhibit C.

Whereas, Bell has re-subdivided his Tract 2 as depicted on the Plat, and he has contracted to sell a lot in the southeastern corner of said re-subdivision, and

Whereas, Bell desires for the purchaser of lot to be able to begin construction immediately upon closing on his purchase, and

Whereas, City agrees to construct the portion of infrastructure as is shown on Exhibit 3 without causing unreasonable delay; said portion being so much of said infrastructure as is needed for sufficient access to said lot and for the construction of improvements thereupon, and

Whereas, Bell desires to place signage within the boundary of Tract 3 corner to Merchants Green Blvd and Tract 1, and

Whereas, City desires to place signage within the boundary of Tract 1 corner to Merchants Green Blvd and Tract 2, and

NOW THEREFORE IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

1. The forgoing recitals are deemed material and are incorporated here as if again set out.


- 2. Upon execution of this Agreement Bell shall execute any and all documentation required for the recordation of the Plat and City's purchase of Tract 1 as depicted on the same.
- 3. Upon execution of this Agreement and the Escrow Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit B Bell shall deposit \$100,000.00 with W. Evan Anderson, Attorney with the office of Bacon, Jessee, Perkins, Carroll & Anderson, LLP, to be held in escrow and the remaining \$97, 075.00 to be deposited into escrow immediately upon closing of the first sale of any lot or portion of Tracts 2 or 3. Said funds shall be applied to the construction of the infrastructure as described herein subject to said Escrow Agreement.
- 4. The following signage restrictions shall be depicted on the final Plat before it is recorded.
 - "1. With exception of traffic control signage all permanent freestanding signage along or adjacent to the easements depicted hereon and Merchants Green Boulevard shall be limited to monument signs or development complex signs as each are defined in Chapter 29 of the Morristown City Zoning Ordinance. The signs shall match the architectural style and construction materials of the principal structure.
 - 2. Signage within the 75' easement shown as part of Tract 1 is reserved for the City of Morristown subject to the restrictions set out in No. 1 above, and is limited to an area no closer than 25 feet of Merchants Green Blvd."

- 5. This Agreement shall remain in effect until completion of the infrastructure as described herein.
- 6. This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto, their respective heirs, personal representatives, successors and assigns.

WHEREAS, the City has not yet completed the infrastructure as described in the Agreement, and in order to make certain the availability of funds to satisfy the Bell's portion of the cost of this infrastructure, the parties desire for Bell to place a sum of \$197,075.00 with the Escrow Agent under the terms of this escrow agreement. This infrastructure shall be completed by December 31, 2017 unless this deadline is extended by Bell and the City in writing.

WHEREAS, for and in consideration of Bell performing under the Agreement and placing the aforementioned sum of money with the Escrow Agent, City has agreed to make certain the satisfactory completion of the infrastructure within the time required and pursuant to the terms of the Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Buyers and Sellers hereby appoint W. Evan Anderson, Attorney with the office of Bacon, Jessee, Perkins, Carroll & Anderson, LLP, 1135 West Third North Street, Morristown, Tennessee as Escrow Agent hereunder.
- 2. Bell hereby deposits with Escrow Agent a sum of \$100,000.00 and agrees to deposit the remaining balance of \$97,075.00 immediately upon closing of the first sale of any lot or portion of Tracts 2 or 3 as depicted on the Plat. These funds shall represent the agreed upon portion of Bell's responsibility for the cost of the infrastructure above set out (hereinafter referred to as the "Escrow Fund") to be held by Escrow Agent. Escrow Agent shall hold the Escrow Fund until a writing is presented to Escrow Agent signed by the Bell and the City acknowledging the completion of the infrastructure above referenced and directing the release of the escrow fund to the City. Upon receipt by Escrow Agent of the writing, the Escrow Agent will release all the escrow fund to the City. Should Seller fail to complete the infrastructure within the time limit provided or any extension thereof, then the escrow funds shall be released unto Bell.
- 3. The Escrow Agent accepts and agrees to hold and disburse the Escrow Fund in accordance with this Agreement and agrees to serve in the capacity of Escrow Agent hereunder and subject to the following conditions:
- (a) In performing any of its duties hereunder, the Escrow Agent shall not incur any liability to any party for damages, losses, or expenses, except for gross negligence, willful default or breach of trust. Accordingly, the Escrow Agent shall not incur any liability with respect to (I) any action taken or omitted in good faith upon the advise of its independent counsel with respect to any questions relating to its duties and responsibilities under this Agreement, or (ii) any action taken or omitted in reliance upon any instrument, including any written instructions provided for in this Agreement, not only as to its due execution and the validity and effectiveness of its provisions, but also to the truth and accuracy of any information contained therein which the Escrow Agent shall, in good faith, believe to be genuine, to have been signed or presented by a proper person or persons, and to conform with the provisions of the Agreement.
- (b) In the event of any dispute between the parties hereto made known to the Escrow Agent, at the discretion of Escrow Agent, it shall be entitled to tender into the registry or custody of the Chancery Court for Hamblen County, Tennessee, the Escrow Fund and all other funds or property or documents in its hands under this Agreement, together with such pleadings as it deems appropriate, and thereupon to be discharged from all further duties and liabilities under this Agreement. For this purpose, each of the parties hereto consents and submits to the jurisdiction and venue of such Court



Agenda Item: Approval of RFQ - Tree Trimming

Subject: Tree Trimming RFQ

Background/History: From time to time the City or Morristown must remove or trim trees on its properties or in the right-of-ways of its streets. To be able to maintain the safety of our citizens and to better maintain our City properties, it has become necessary to enter into a contract for tree trimming. The contract will run for a (3) three-year term. During this time the selected vendor will be on call to trim and remove any trees deemed as hazardous by the City of Morristown. A Request for Qualifications was done to find the vendor thought most qualified based on their ability to complete the jobs as safely and quickly as possible.

Findings/Current Activity: The RFQ was advertised in the *Citizen Tribune* on February 14 and February 20, 2017. Additionally, the RFQ was posted to the City of Morristown's website and through Vendor Registry, an on-line bid facilitation website. The submission deadline was 10:00 AM on Monday, February 27, 2017. We received four (4) responses.

Financial Impact: The City of Morristown appropriates funds on an annual basis to remove/trim trees as the need arises. The funds expended for these expenditures varies from year to year depending on several factors. There is not a logical method to determine a per unit cost. Thus, each job will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis. The key is to have a vendor in place that can respond to the City of Morristown needs in a timely manner for the safety of the citizenry. The City of Morristown had four vendors submit their qualifications.

Action options/Recommendations: It is staffs' recommendation based on selection criteria to approve Arbor Excel, LLC as the City's Tree Trimming vendor. Additionally, Council's approval is sought to allow Tony Cox, City Administrator to negotiate and enter into contract with Arbor Excel, LLC based on the terms presented in the Request for Qualifications.



Findings / Current Activity: Because of planned events being near the end of the project and other considerations, staff recommends the following changes to the contract. 

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this <u>27th</u> day of <u>February</u> , 20 17, by and
between Hamblen Co. Dept. of Education hereinafter called the "Landowner", and (Insert Full Name of Owner)
the City of Morristown, TN hereinafter called "City".
WITNESSETH, that
WHEREAS, the Landowner is the owner of certain property described as3161 Lorino Park Road
034-D, "C", Parcels: 18.00, 18.01, 18.02, 18.03, 18.04 (Insert Hambler County Tax & Parcel Number) (Insert Hambler County Tax & Parcel Number)
(Insert Hamblen County Tax & Parcel Number)
Hamblen County, TN, Deed Book $\underline{^{1499}}$ Page $\underline{^{580}}$, hereafter called the "Property".
WHEREAS, the Landowner is proceeding to build on and develop the property; and
WHEREAS, the Site Plan/Subdivision known as Collins Estate (Lots 1-5)- Hamblen Co. Bus Garage (Name of Plan/Development)
hereafter called the "Plan", which is expressly made a part hereof, as approved or to be approved by the
City, provides for management of stormwater within the confines of the property; and
WHEREAS, the City and the Landowner, its successors and assigns, agree that the health, safety and
welfare of the residents of the City of Morristown, Tennessee, require that on-site stormwater
management/BMP facilities be constructed and maintained on the Property; and
WHEREAS, the City requires that on-site stormwater management/BMP facilities, as shown on the
Plan, be constructed and adequately maintained by the Landowner, its successors and assigns.
NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing premises, the mutual covenants contained
herein, and the following terms and conditions, the parties hereto agree as follows:
1. The on-site stormwater management/BMP facilities shall be constructed by the Landowner, its successors, and assigns, in accordance with the plans and specifications identified in the Plan and shall, upon construction completion, be certified as such by the Plan's Engineer of Record.
2. The Landowner, its successors, and assigns, shall adequately maintain the stormwater management/BMP facilities as outlined in the Plan and contained within the Landowner's property. This includes all pipes and channels built to convey stormwater to and from the facility, as well as all structures, improvements, and vegetation provided to control the quantity and quality of the

stormwater. Adequate maintenance is herein defined as good working condition, so that these facilities

are performing their design functions. Those maintenance procedures outlined in the Plan and the City's approved BMP guidelines shall be practiced at a minimum. Common maintenance shall include the removal of debris (leaves, lawn clippings, sticks, etc.) and trash after rainfall events, checking outlet structures for clogging and cleaning, as necessary, repairing erosive areas promptly upon observation, and removing accumulated sediment.

- 3. The Landowner, its successors, and assigns, shall inspect the stormwater management/BMP facility and report to the City Engineer if any major repairs (i.e. structural) are necessary. The purpose of the inspection and reporting is to assure safe and proper functioning of the facilities. The inspection shall cover the entire facilities, berms, outlet structure, pond areas, access roads, etc and shall be performed at such times and such manner as to accomplish these objectives.
- 4. The Landowner, its successors, and assigns, will perform the work necessary to keep these facilities in good working order as appropriate. In the event a maintenance schedule for the stormwater management/BMP facilities (including sediment removal) is outlined on the approved plans or in the City's BMP guidelines, the Landowner, its successors, and assigns, shall adhere to the schedule.
- 5. The Landowner, its successors, and assigns, hereby grant an easement to the City, its authorized agents, and employees, to enter upon the Property and to inspect the stormwater management/BMP facilities whenever the City deems necessary. The purpose of inspection may be to check the facility for proper functioning, to follow-up on reported deficiencies or repairs, to respond to citizen complaints, and/or to check for any other reasons the City deems necessary. If problems are observed, the City shall provide the Landowner, its successors, and assigns, copies of the inspection findings and a directive to commence with the repairs within a specified timeframe.
- 6. In the event the Landowner, its successors, and assigns, fails to maintain the stormwater management/BMP facilities in good working condition acceptable to the City, the City may enter upon the Property and take the steps necessary to correct deficiencies identified in the inspection report. This provision shall not be construed to allow the City to erect any structure of permanent nature on the land of the Landowner, outside of the easement, for the stormwater management/BMP facilities. It is expressly understood and agreed that the City is under no obligation to routinely maintain or repair said facilities, and in no event shall this Agreement be construed to impose any such obligation on the City.
- 7. In the event the City, pursuant to this Agreement, performs work of any nature or expends any funds in performance of said work for labor, use of equipment, supplies, materials, and the like, the Landowner, its successors, and assigns, shall reimburse the City upon demand, within sixty (60) days of receipt thereof, for two hundred percent (200%) of all actual costs incurred by the City hereunder.
- 8. If the Landowner fails to pay the City for two hundred percent (200%) of their incurred expenses within sixty (60) days of receipt of written notice, the Landowner authorizes the City to place a lien against the property in an amount equal to two hundred percent (200%) of said expenses.
- 9. If the Landowner fails to reimburse the City, as described above, the Landowner further authorizes the City to collect said expenses from the Landowner through other appropriate legal action, with the Landowner to be liable for the reasonable costs of collection, court costs, and attorney fees.

- 10. This Agreement imposes no liability of any kind whatsoever on the City, and the Landowner agrees to hold the City harmless from any liability in the event the stormwater management/BMP facilities fail to operate properly.
- 11. This Agreement shall be recorded among the land records of Hamblen County, Tennessee, and shall constitute a covenant running with the land, and shall be binding on the Landowner, its administrators, executors, assigns, heirs and any other successors in interest.
