WHEREAS, the Department desires to install a traffic signal within the jurisdictional limits of the Agency and

WHEREAS, the Agency, in recognition of the benefits to be received from the installation of said traffic signal desires to cooperate with the Department such that the traffic signal may be installed, operated and maintained.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises, the Department and the Agency hereby enter into agreement to provide performance of the project.

SECTION I: The Project to be performed is described as follows:

"Signal on SR-34 Intersection at Commerce Boulevard in Morristown"

SECTION II: The Agency shall be solely responsible for and pay all costs associated with maintenance and operation of all electrically operated devices together with the related equipment, wiring and other necessary appurtenances, and the Agency shall furnish electrical current to all such devices which may be installed as part of the project. Additionally, the Agency shall be solely responsible for and pay all costs associated with the maintenance and operation of solar-powered devices, including, but not limited to, replacement of solar panels, batteries, lights and lenses.

SECTION III: The Agency agrees to comply with all applicable federal and state laws and regulations in the performance of its duties under this contract. The parties hereby agree that failure of the Agency to comply with this provision shall constitute a material breach of this agreement and subject the Agency to the repayment of all state funds expended, or expenses incurred, under this agreement.

LICENSE AGREEMENT

THIS AG	REEMENT is made this	day of	, 2017

and TUFF TORC	CORPORATION ("Tuff	Torq") a Tenno	essee corporation authorized to

WHEREAS Tuff Torq has requested permission from the City to enter onto and use City owned property located off of Hunter Road and identified as Parcel 054.038.00 in Morristown, Tennessee, for the purposes of making a test track for lawn mowers.

WITNESSETH

- 1. The City does hereby agree to grant Tuff Torq a license to enter onto and use the City's property located off of Hunter Road and identified as Parcel 054.038.00 in Morristown, Tennessee, for the purpose of making a test track for lawn mowers. Tuff Torq intends to use either asphalt or brushed concrete for laying the track.
- 2. Tuff Torq agrees to hire and compensate a contractor to complete the work and will not assess any costs associated with the work to the City. Tuff Torq further agrees that the terms of this license agreement shall apply to any and all contractors hired to complete the work.
- 3. Tuff Torq agrees to utilize no more than a half acre of the City's property for the track.
- 4. The City agrees to permit Tuff Torq to have access to and use this property for for a period of three (3) years, beginning July 1, 2017. However, in the event that at the expiration of the original three (3) year term this Agreement has not been otherwise terminated, it shall automatically renew on an annual basis for consecutive periods of one (1) year each, barring notice of termination by either party at least sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of the original term or any automatic renewal term. If Tuff Torq relocates from this area and/or no longer needs the use of the track, Tuff Torq agrees to remove the track and return the property to its original condition, or close thereto, at no cost to the City.
- 5. Tuff Torq agrees to defend, indemnify and hold the City harmless from any and all claims, losses, costs, expenses, or damages arising from the work associated with the making of the track, the activities that occur on the track, and Tuff Torq's license to enter and be on the City's property. Furthermore, Tuff Torq agrees to maintain commercial general liability insurance insuring against liability for bodily injury, death or damage to

personal property with combined single limits of one million dollars (\$1,000,000). In addition, Tuff Torq agrees to maintain worker's compensation in statutory amounts, employer's liability insurance with combined single limits of one million dollars (\$1,000,000), automobile liability insurance insuring against claims for bodily injury or property damage with combined single limits of one million dollars (\$1,000,000), and all risk property insurance covering all personal property for full replacement value. The required insurance shall be in place for the duration of this license agreement.

6. Tuff Torq understands that the City's property is used for storm water for the Morristown Airport Industrial District and that maintenance on said property is necessary. Necessary maintenance may require removal of the track. The City of Morristown is not obligated or responsible for the replacement of said track should its removal be necessary for storm water maintenance.

RE: Entry Level Firefighters

I'm requesting the Mayor and Council to appoint four (4) candidates to the position of Entry Level Firefighter at the Council Meeting scheduled for January 2, 2018. Those appointments will come from the current Civil Service Entry Level Roster; a copy of which is part of your Council Meeting packet.

By Civil Service rule, when appointing four (4) positions; the Council may consider the top nine (9) names. (Three (3) names can be considered for one (1) vacancy and two (2) additional names for each additional vacancy.)

As you may recall, these vacancies exist due to retirements and resignations occurring within our organization over the last several months, and we purposely decided to not backfill as there wasn't access to an entry level class before now.

We'll encourage the appointees to work out a two week notice at their current place of employment before reporting to the fire department on January 15th. As always, any job offer is dependent upon a successful physical evaluation by our City Physician. Afterward, they'll be assigned to a 40 hour work week as they go through orientation, etc. while preparing for the 14 week recruit class which begins mid-February. This schedule prepares them for graduation from recruit school in mid-May. Until then, the department remains four positions short of approved staffing levels on a day to day basis.

Funding for the four (4) positions, including training expenses, is included in the fire department's current budget.
