The City Council for the City of Morristown, Hamblen County, Tennessee, met in regular session at the regular meeting place of the Council in the Morristown City Center at 4:00 p.m., Tuesday, October 5, 2010 with Honorable Mayor Barbara C. "Sami" Barile, presiding and the following named Councilmembers present: Gene Brooks, Bob Garrett, Claude Jinks, Frank McGuffin, William Rooney and Kay Senter.

Councilmember Jinks made a motion to approve the September 21, 2010 minutes as circulated; Councilmember Rooney seconded the motion and all voted "aye".

A public hearing was held on the following captioned Ordinance No. 3393-07. Councilmember Jinks made a motion to adopt said Ordinance on second and final reading. Councilmember Rooney seconded the motion and upon roll call, all voted "aye".

**Ordinance No. 3393.07  
An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 3393 – FY 2011  
Budget by appropriating the sum of \$10,000 for the  
Boys & Girls Club Swim Team.**

A public hearing was held on the following captioned Ordinance No. 3393-08. Councilmember McGuffin made a motion to adopt said Ordinance on second and final reading. Councilmember Rooney seconded the motion and upon roll call, all voted "aye".

**Ordinance No. 3393.08  
An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 3393 – FY 2011  
Budget by appropriating the sum of \$687,003 for a Fast  
Track Grant for Double H Plastics.**

Councilmember Jinks made a motion to award the Construction Contract for the Patrol Briefing Area Renovation to All Star Construction & Demolition in the amount of \$2,498. Councilmember Senter seconded the motion and upon roll call, all voted "aye".

Councilmember Senter made a motion to adopt the following Resolution No. 27-10; Councilmember Rooney seconded the motion and upon roll call, all voted "aye".

**RESOLUTION NO. 27-10  
A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY ENGINEER TO  
ISSUE PERMITS FOR OVERSIZED LOADS TO UTILIZE CITY  
OF MORRISTOWN STREETS AND INFRASTRUCTURE.**

Whereas, the City of Morristown has the responsibility to properly care for the City streets and related infrastructure; and

Whereas, the City of Morristown is experiencing increased traffic related to overdimensional and overweight transporters; and

Whereas, the City of Morristown has observed overdimensional and overweight transporters pose a significant increased risk to the City's infrastructure and to public safety if certain locally mandated regulatory controls are not established by a permit process controlled by the City of Morristown; and

Whereas, the City Engineer has developed a policy for permitting and collecting fees for overdimensional and overweight movements on city streets to protect the City of Morristown's interest; and

Whereas, the permit fees are needed to offset the City's direct costs and indirect costs of managing the permit process, manpower to oversee permitted transport events, utilization of city's infrastructure, stabilization of existing equipment that may be damaged by proposed infrastructure use, and costs associated with infrastructure assessment; and

Whereas, the permit process requires the permittee to submit and receive approval of the City Engineer for the following: specific scheduling of each transport event, engineering documentation, route control documents, traffic control plans, fees as calculated by the City Engineer, other transport event documentation as required by the permit process, transport event bonding, and coordination with City of Morristown engineering department; and

Whereas, the permit process allows for the City Engineer to deny a permit application if the city's permit process is not completed to the satisfaction of the City Engineer.

THEREFORE, be it resolved that:

The City of Morristown City Council authorizes the City Engineer to require a permit process be followed by any oversized or overdimensional transporter; and

The City of Morristown City Council authorizes the City Engineer to collect associated fees that will regulate overdimensional and overweight transporters to protect the interests of the City of Morristown; and

The City of Morristown City Council authorizes the City Engineer to deny the use of city streets and associated infrastructure to oversized or overdimensional transporters if the permit process is not followed by the permittee or the permittee is not able to complete the permit process satisfactorily and receive the necessary approvals from the City Engineer.

Neighborhood \$10,291 and Governor's Hwy. Safety \$21,185.}**

Councilmember Jinks made a motion to open the agenda and add a program management contract with Lamar Dunn & Associates for sewer operations. Councilmember Senter seconded the motion and upon roll call, all voted "aye".

Councilmember Senter made a motion to approve a contract with Lamar Dunn & Associates for Sewer Operations Program Management in the amount of \$9,000.00 per month. Councilmember McGuffin seconded the motion and upon roll call, all voted "aye".

Councilmember Jinks made a motion to declare a Sharples Pennwalt Centrifuge (SN 81-PM35000-257) as surplus property and authorize the disposal thereof. Councilmember Rooney seconded the motion and upon roll call, all voted "aye".

Councilmember McGuffin made a motion to approve a change order to the AMEC Solid Waste Billing and Data Support Contract in the amount of

\$8,000.00. Councilmember Rooney seconded the motion and upon roll call, all voted "aye".

Mayor Barile adjourned the October 5, 2010 City Council meeting.
