Morristown has participated with TML over the years to advance the City's efficiency and operations. At this conference, Morristown was presented the "Excellence in Governance" award, a prestigious award recognizing Morristown's efforts to improve city services, quality of life, and government in general. On receiving the award, Mayor Chesney says, "This award is recognition by other cities in Tennessee of the successes Morristown is experiencing with infrastructure development, job growth, and quality of life improvements. It's a moment of pride to say congratulations to our administrative leaders, department heads, and city employees for Morristown earning this award. Well done."


The City of Morristown has made concentrated effort between elected officials and city administration to accomplish some lofty goals. The City's fund balance has been brought from less than \$50,000 nearly a decade ago to more than \$12 million today. A new "shepherding program" within the planning department has helped city projects and development move forward at a quicker pace. The City began a new building program to add a fire station, public works facility, and community center. The City purchased the old Morristown College site, which is being turned into a 50 acre park. The downtown area has been revitalized through additions and renovations, including the farmers market pavilion and ceilings on the overhead sidewalks. Morristown also worked with the Industrial Development Board to secure the expansions of current manufacturing industries as well as the addition of a new industry to the community.

In recent years, Morristown has seen a huge boost in the economy and is poised for unprecedented growth. The City of Morristown is matching that growth by improving its services and infrastructure to better support the people of Morristown. TML has recognized those efforts and the City of Morristown is

proud to continue in these efforts for many years to come.

Click It or Ticket

Every year the Morristown Police Department works with the Tennessee Highway Safety Office (THSO) to report certain traffic related citations and arrests. The THSO has three reporting periods each year.

Our recent reporting period encompassed two weeks during the Memorial Day Holiday. This reporting period was named "Click It or Ticket"

Officers of the Morristown Police Department (MPD) issued 39 seatbelt citations during this reporting period. However, 12 DUI offenders and 17 felony offenders were arrested. MPD officers did take 32 fugitives into custody.

Also in this two week period, there were 32 drug arrests and 18 individuals charged for driving on a suspended or revoked license. There were 105 speeding citations issued to motorists as well.

The MPD works toward the mission of the THSO to reduce traffic crash fatalities by "changing driver behavior through increased education, enforcement, and community partnerships."

By working on traffic enforcement, the MPD strives daily to reduce traffic crashes, injuries, and fatalities on Morristown's roadways.
