City Recycling Program

Earier this month, all Hamblen County residents received an informational brochure with information about the City's and County's recycling programs. The brochure details what can and cannot be recycled, how to use the curbside recycling program, and gives contact information to valuable resources to learn more about the program. Through this brochure and other promotions, the City hopes to encourage more



people in our community to recycle as well as educate the public on what items can be placed in the blue recycle bins.

A few changes to recycling in recent years include that glass can no longer be recycled. Changes to the recycling industry have resulted in there being no enduser for collected glass. Also, plastic bags should not be placed in the blue recycle bins. This includes plastic shopping bags as well as garbage bags. Any recyclables should be placed loose in the bins, rather than bagged.

The City's recycling is collected on a bi-weekly schedule. You can find your collection day by visiting the City's website. If you do not have a blue recycling can, please contact Public Works at (423)585-4658.

The Morristown Police Department's (MPD) six newest members were sworn in on December 30, 2019 by Judge Matt Sexton surrounded by family and MPD personnel.

Joining the department are Jason Alexander, Blake Bain, Jordan Phillips, Robert Reed, Michael Cameron and Hunter Donahoo. They are on their second week of orientation and will begin Field Training next week. None of the recruits have prior law enforcement experience; however, Bain and Donahoo have prior experience working in jails in the surrounding area. Donahoo, Alexander, Phillips and Reed all are prior military. Donahoo is still active in the U.S. Navy Reserves. Cameron worked with a local company for 13 years before beginning his career with the MPD. All six new officers will begin Walters State Community College's Basic Law Enforcement Academy on January 27, 2020.
