

The City's annual paving project is underway on City street around town. Each year, City staff members from the Public Works Department assess the condition of all City streets. Based on their state of wear, how much they are traveled on, and other factors, the City determines which streets are most in need of repairs. Approximately \$1 Million is allocated each year as part of the City's annual budget to make these repairs. This year, the City will oversee the paving of 5.5 miles of City roads.

In addition to paving, the City will also be "rejuvenating" 13 miles of City roads. This process will apply a coating to roads to



share with the association for valuable resources and tools to create a safer Morristown.

The City of Morristown is proud to announce a new position appointment for City Staff member Michelle Woods.


