City Requests Participation in the Annual Survey

The City is once again gearing up for its annual Citizen Survey. The survey includes questions about quality of life in the community, local policies, demographics, ratings of local government services and resident use of services. Later this month, postcards will be mailed to 6,000 randomly selected households in Morristown. If you receive one of these postcards, it means that your household is being asked to participate in the survey and a paper copy of the survey will be mailed to you in early November. There will also be a link for you to take the survey online if you prefer. Responses to this survey help drive the decisions and actions of City administration to better serve its citizens. The more responses the City receives, the better equipped the City will be to make decisions that provide the most beneficial impact.

Citizens who have not been randomly selected for the survey will have the opportunity to participate in an opt-in survey that will be posted online at a later date.

WELCOME BACK TALLEY-WARD

It was just two years ago that Council was on the verge of selling off the Talley-Ward building due to the lack of usage and steady repair costs. The 68 year old one-time Morristown community and events center had long ago seen its best days. This day, after-school pickup basketball and occasional volleyball matches were it.

"Not so fast," said a few diehards - among them the new Parks & Recreation Director Travis Barbee. With the opening of the new Morristown Landing Recreation & Events Center on the west end of the city, Barbee saw a "Fixed up" Talley-Ward filling an important need. New sewer connections and plumbing attention, window leakage repairs, and a few other upgrades put the facility back into the mainstream of recreation offerings.

Pickleball led the way. Small group exercise and yoga classes found a place in the upstairs classrooms. Summer sports camps were a hit with kids. This year's city budget has included the installation of modern adjustable basketball goals, allowing younger age group leages to play on a court previously adult-only.

Congratulations to the leadership and staff at Parks & Recreation for its vision, efforts, and accomplished goals. Talley-Ward is back!
