Major Changes on Morristown's East Side

Earlier this month, the long awaited Thompson Creek Road project opened to thru traffic. This roadway connects Thompson Creek Road to E. Morris Blvd. and to the Crockett Trace shopping area. Residents along this roadway now have easier access to amenities and emergency personnel can respond more quickly. This section of Thompson Creek



Road also includes sidewalks for pedestrians and bicycles to enjoy recreation and access Frank Lorino Park. This has been a major project that has been in the works for a while and we hope is well received by our citizens.

Soon to be located on this roadway, and currently under construction, is a new Fire Station 3. This location is well suited for a fire station, with easy access to 25E and E. Morris Blvd. A groundbreaking ceremony was held recently at this new location. Site preparation has been taking place for several months and construction is now underway. A fire training tower will also be placed at this station, providing valuable training opportunities for our Morristown Fire Department as well as other surrounding agencies.

Another road project to come to the east side of town is a major resurfacing of E. Morris Blvd. This project will resurface the section from Hwy 25E to Jones Franklin Rd. and will add a new signal at the intersection of Jaybird Rd. and Dover Rd. Simultaneously, TDOT will be working on widening E. Andrew Johnson Highway to 4 lanes.



With growing development in our area and an increase in traffic, many of our main thoroughfares in Morristown are seeing facelifts, added turn lanes, and expansions. Road construction will become a regular sight in town for some time as these massive improvements take place. The end result will be easier and safer travel in our community.

Budget Plans Presented to the Public

On May 17th, City Administrator Andrew Ellard presented the annual budget plan for the upcoming fiscal year. This year's budget includes an ambitious slate of capital projects and the completion of several ongoing projects. The proposed budget of \$56.9 million maintains the current tax rate. Several large purchases to take place this upcoming year includes a new side-loader sanitation truck, a new fire engine, a tactical drone for the Police Department, and the replacement of the gym floor at Talley Ward Recreation Center. Construction is expected to be completed on the new fire station 3 and citizens will see the construction of a roundabout at Walters Drive and Cherokee Drive. Additional funding to the Storm Water Fund will facilitate the rehabilitation of the MAID pond and the construction of work along Havley Springs Branch.

City Council will discuss the proposed budget at the June 4th and June 18th regularly scheduled meetings with the public hearing and final approval taking place on the 18th. The proposed budget document can be found on the City's website.

DOWNTOWN TOMORROW

With the post-fire cleanup of the Parks-Belk corner on W. Main well underway, a clearer view of the future for Downtown is evolving. Building owners have committed to investing in construction and renovations which will result in the upstairs/overhead sidewalks part of many of the historic structures becoming upscale residential apartments and condos. The plan also includes the first floors to become retail outlets for walk-in traffic from Main St. proper.
