If you are eligible for the vaccine and prefer not to wait for an appointment through NJVSS, there are additional ways to get vaccinated:

Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine becoming available

- The State is currently in the process of receiving and distributing its first shipments of Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine. The vaccine only requires one dose, and will be available at select locations across the state. [Click here to learn more about the vaccines available in New Jersey](#).

Vaccination eligibility is expanding

- Pre-K-12 educators and childcare workers in licensed and registered settings are now eligible for the vaccine. Beginning March 15th, additional categories of people will be eligible to book appointments for the vaccine, including transportation workers, migrant farm workers, members of tribal communities, individuals experiencing homelessness or living in shelters, and more.
