
Pasco County, Florida PDCC Meeting Minutes




- Laura Algeo began the meeting by introducing the project and the project team. Introductions were made by all attendees.
- Ron Ferris explained the Southwest Florida Water Management District's (SWFWMD) involvement in the Pasco County Flood Insurance Study update.
- Michael Taylor presented the meeting agenda, meeting purpose, and the six steps of post preliminary processing.
- Michael Taylor presented a preliminary map overview, which included the engineering and floodplain mapping aspects of the study.
- Michael Taylor presented the Duck Slough redelineation area and explained that seven panels (0354, 0360, 0362, 0366, 0367, 0380, 0386) would be issued "Revised Preliminary" to reflect those changes.
- Michael Taylor presented Changes Since Last FIRM, including specific examples
 of floodplain boundary changes as a result of redelineation and new studies
 using LiDAR.
- Cindy Jolly presented the public open house schedule.
- Michael Taylor presented the appeal and comment period. Michael explained under new FEMA guidance all Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHAs) are subject to appeal. The *Tampa Tribune* (http://tampatrib.com/), and the *St. Petersburg Times* (http://www.sptimes.com/index1.shtml) were identified as the two local newspapers for appeal notification.
- Daniel Fitzpatrick explained the compliance period for map adoption and the importance of identifying and notifying property owners that have had structures added to the special flood hazard area.




- Issue Revised Preliminary Panels (0354, 0360, 0362, 0366, 0367, 0380, 0386) to Pasco County (Michael Taylor)


Preliminary Maps Issued

- Pasco County's Preliminary Maps were issued on March 29, 2013. A Preliminary Map Package was sent to each community and included:
 - Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) (155 countywide)
 - Pasco County Index Panel
 - Flood Insurance Study (FIS) Report
 - Summary of Map Actions (SOMA)
 - Preliminary Issuance Letter

Preliminary Maps To Be Reissued

- Pasco County's requested that the Duck Slough Area be redelineated. Draft preliminary panels have been created and reviewed by both Pasco County and SWFWMD. They will be reissued soon.
 - **0354**, 0360, 0362, 0366, 0367, 0380, 0386





The Changes Since Last FIRM shapefile shows where the floodway, 1% annual chance floodplain, and 0.2% annual chance floodplain have changed between the old effective and preliminary maps across Pasco County and incorporated communities.










Floodplain changes in Duck Slough Area (including structure removal)










Zephyr Creek near the City of Zephyrhills (including structure removal)










New Anclote Watershed (including structure removal)










Cypress Creek Watershed

Appeal and Comment Period

- Pasco County and incorporated communities will have a 90day appeal period for all changes to Special Flood Hazard Areas. Pasco County and incorporated communities will follow FEMA's new Expanded Appeals Process.
 - SFHA changes will be published in the Federal Register
 - SFHA changes will be published in your local newspaper, twice within a 10-day period
 - The day of the second newspaper publication will begin the 90day appeal period

Appeals are for all SFHA changes







Appeal and Comment Period

- Pasco County and incorporated communities will also have a comment period for approximately 30 days, which begins at the conclusion of the PDCC Meeting.
 Comments include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - Stream changes
 - Road changes
 - Corporate limit changes

All other changes are considered Comments

Letter of Final Determination

- After the 90-day appeal period has ended and all appeals and comments have been resolved, FEMA will issue a Letter of Final Determination (LFD) for Pasco County.
- Pasco County and incorporated communities will enter a 6-month Compliance Period and receive new effective maps after.
- During the Compliance Period, Pasco County and incorporated communities will adopt the new maps into their floodplain ordinance.

Risk and Flood Insurance

Determine your flood risk

- Nearly everyone is at risk of flooding
- High Risk Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA),
 Identified as Zone A or Zone AE on flood maps
- Moderate Risk Identified as shaded Zone X on flood maps
- Low Risk Identified as unshaded Zone X areas on maps







Risk and Flood Insurance

Requirements in a High-Risk Zone

 Citizens in a SFHA are required to purchase flood insurance for Federally-backed mortgages









Effective Maps

- After the end of the Compliance Period, Pasco County and incorporated communities will receive paper copies of the effective Flood Insurance Rate Maps and Flood Insurance Study Report
- All corresponding digital data will also be provided
- A Final Summary of Map Actions (SOMA) will be provided, informing residents if a Letter of Map
 Change has been either revalidated or superseded
